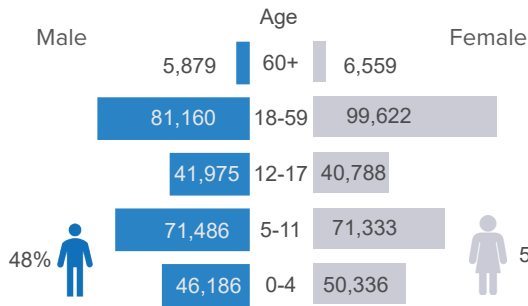

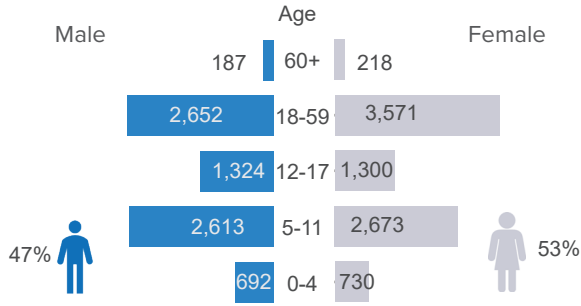

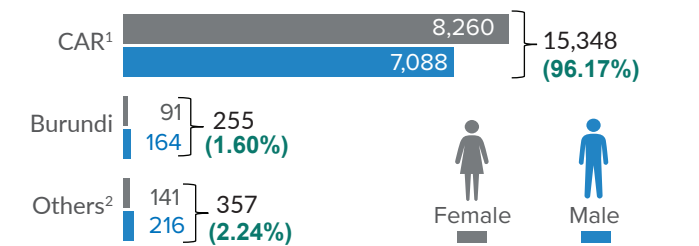
Age and Gender of Refugee Population



Age and Gender of Asylum Seekers Population



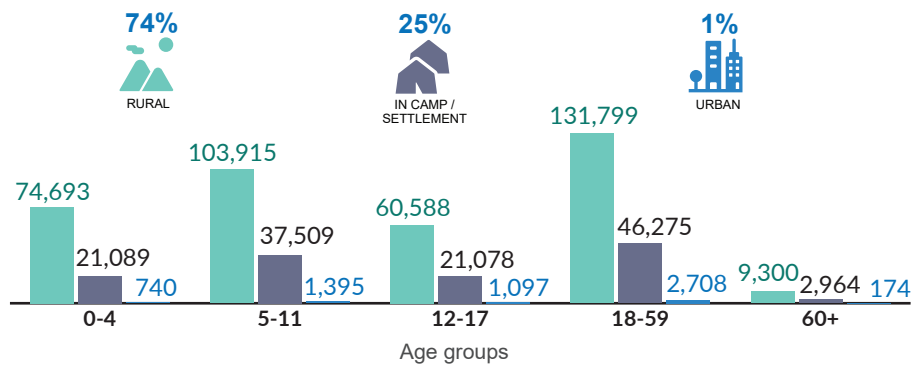
Asylum Seekers Population by Country of Origin

Refugee Population by Type of Location



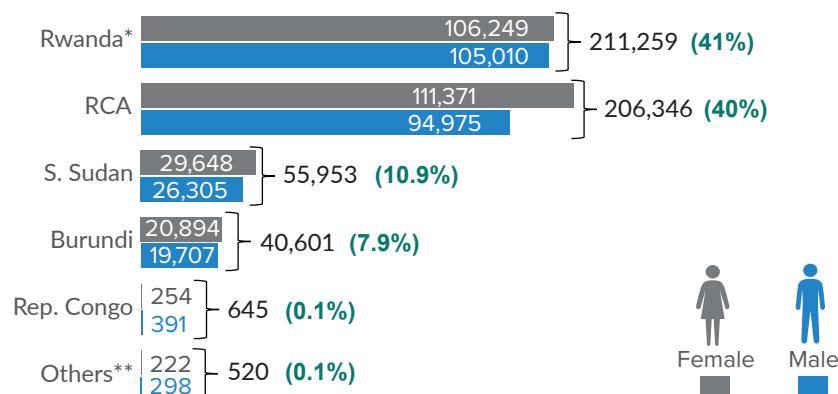
Situation Overview

During this period, the refugee population in the DRC decreased significantly, from 517,140 on August 31, 2021 to 515,324 on September 30, 2021, a decrease of 1,816 people representing 0.35%. The decrease in the number of refugees during the month of 1,816 is due to the repatriation of 1325 refugees (1174 Burundians and 151 Rwandans) their countries of origin and 491 cases of inactivations (21 Burundians and 470 Rwandans) absent from the operation. verification of urban shelters in the city of Goma and its surroundings.

As of September 30, the number of asylum seekers in the DRC remained at 15,960 including 15,287 people newly registered in the province of North Ubangi and 673 former cases of various nationalities awaiting their Refugee Status Determination (RSD) in the communities. urban (Goma (103), Bukavu (1), Lubumbashi (281), Kalemie (52) Kinshasa (191)) and others (45).

N.B.: The number of asylum seekers could change at the end of October after verification in the provinces of Haut Katanga, Lualaba and Sud Ubangi currently underway.

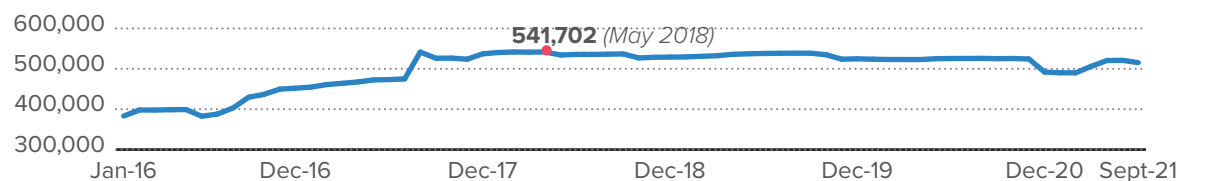
Refugee Population by Country of Origin

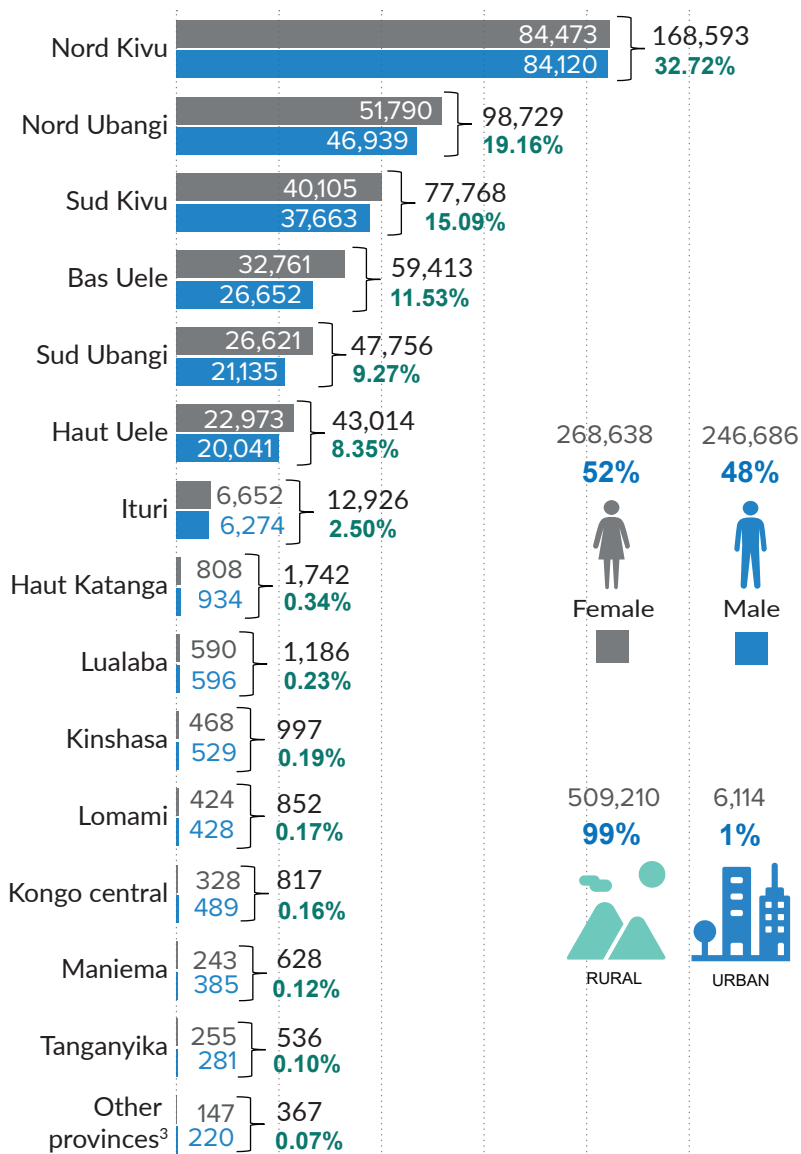
Refugee Population Trend (2016 - 2021)

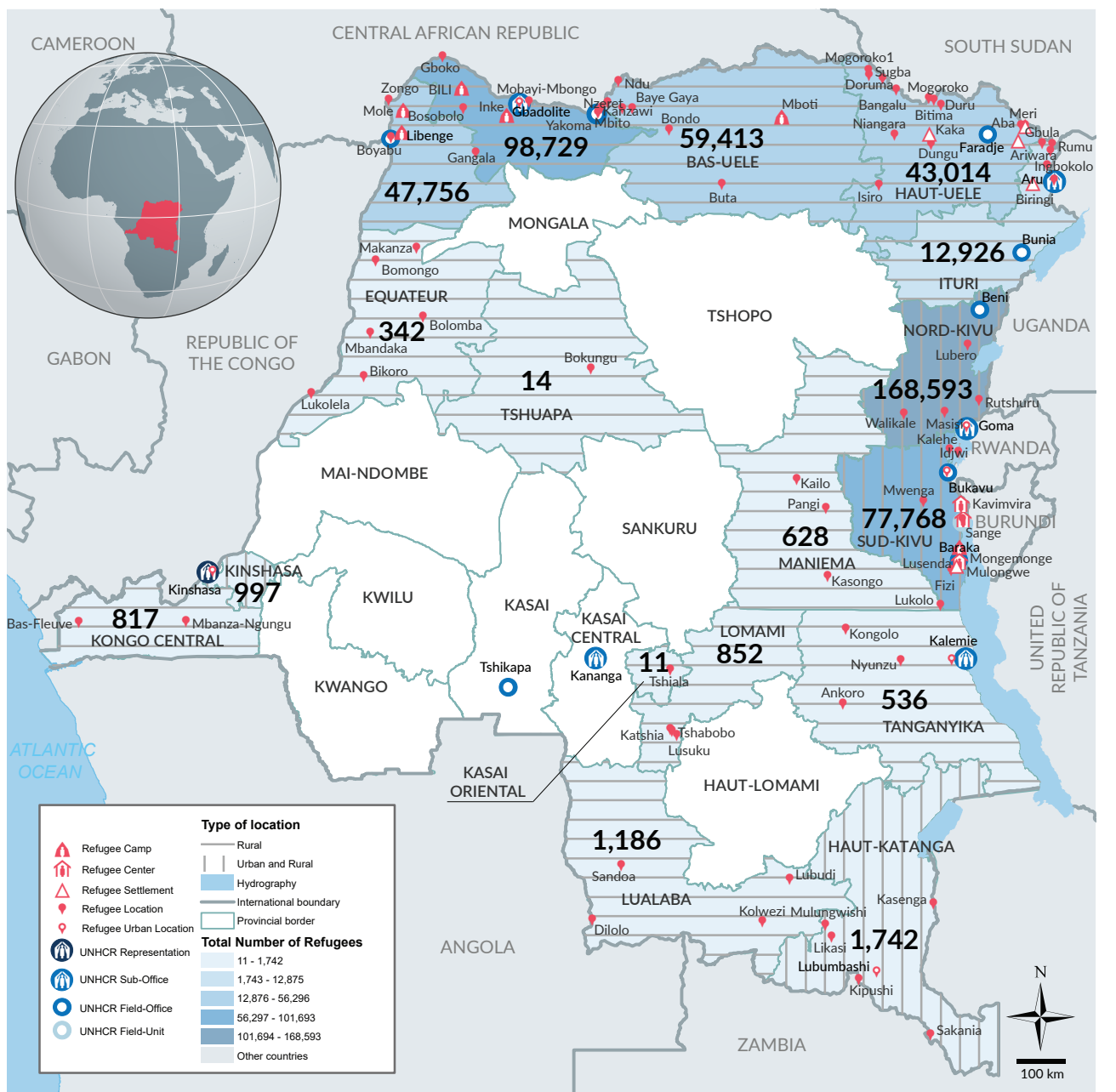

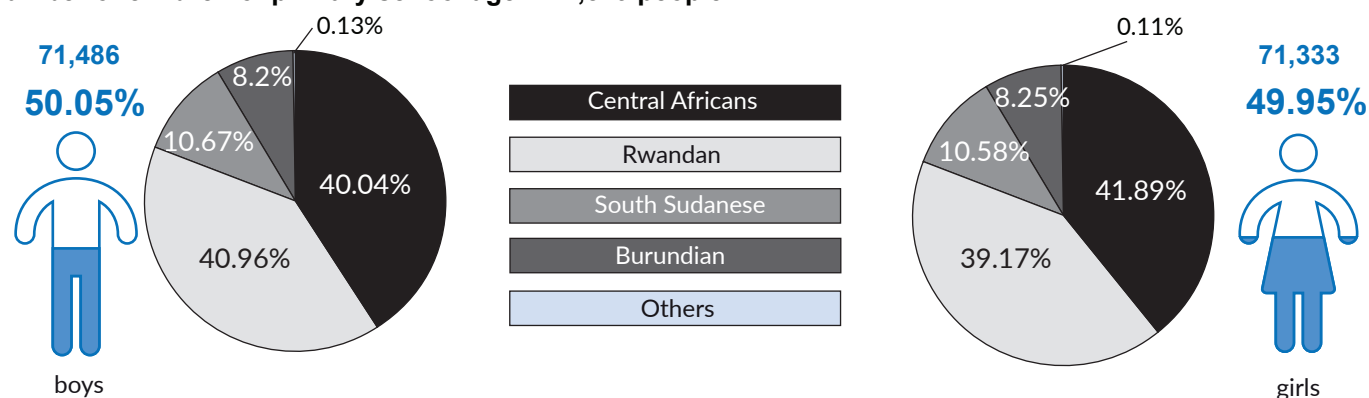

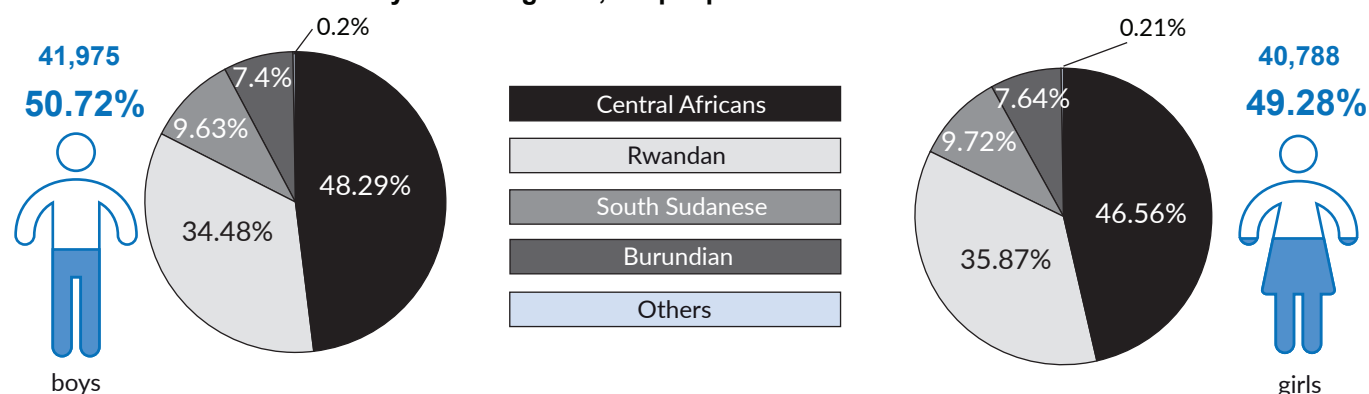

2. Number of children of primary school age: 142,819 people



Of all refugees in the Democratic Republic of Congo, children of primary school age constitute 44% of refugee children of school age. The majority of these children are made up of Central Africans (40.96%) and Rwandans (40.07%) and is distributed almost evenly between girls (49.95%) and boys (50.05%).

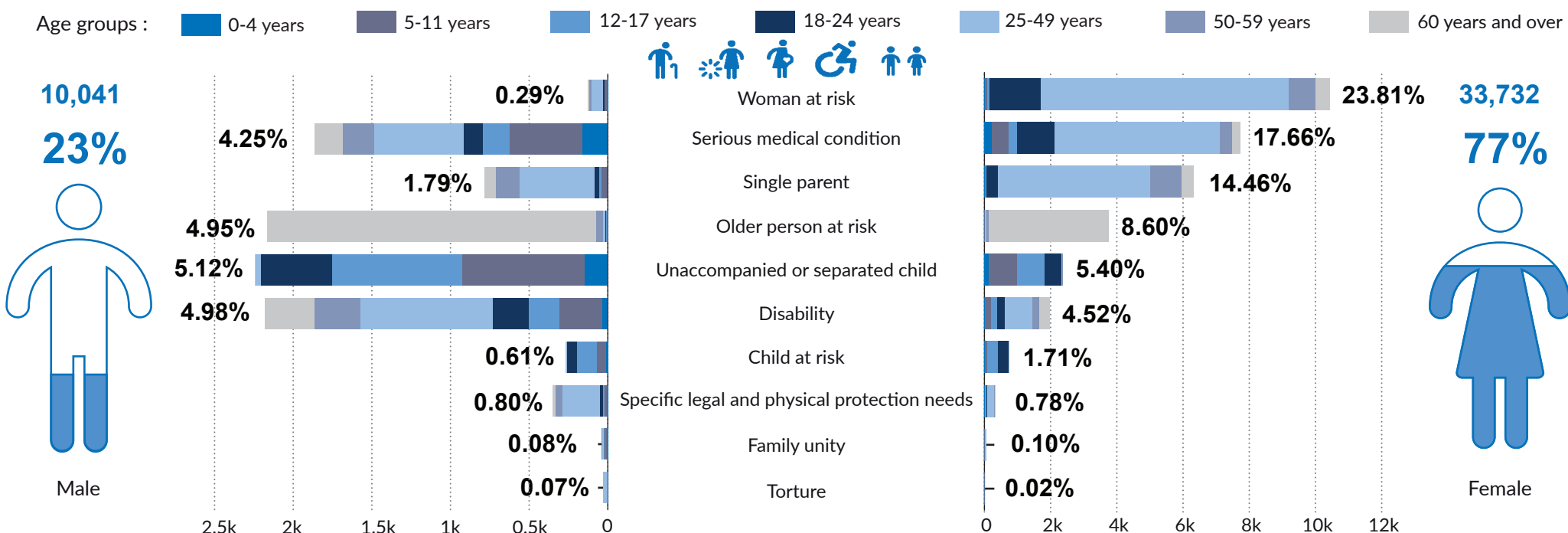
3. Number of children of secondary school age: 82,763 people



Of all refugees in the Democratic Republic of Congo, children of secondary school age constitute 26% of refugee children of school age. The majority of these children are made up of Central Africans (47.44%) and Rwandans (35.16%) and is distributed almost evenly between girls (49.28%) and boys (50.72%).

It should also be noted that 10,878 children (of which 3,645 are from the host population) in the Nord Ubangi and Sud Ubangi provinces are targeted by the ECW (Education Cannot Wait) program.

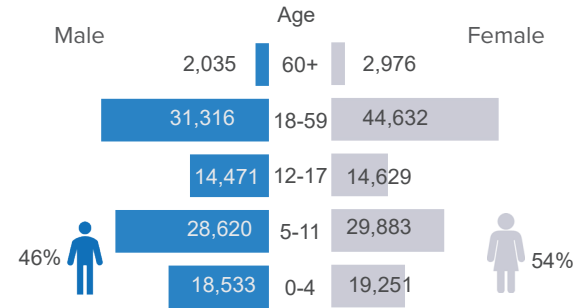

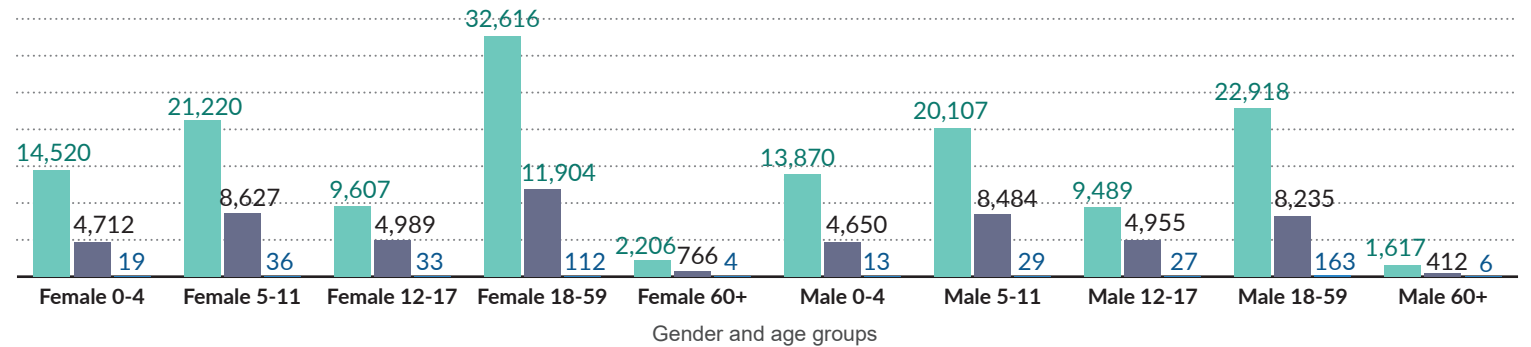
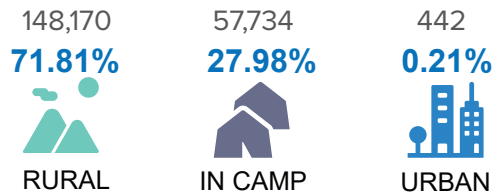
Age and Gender of Refugee Population



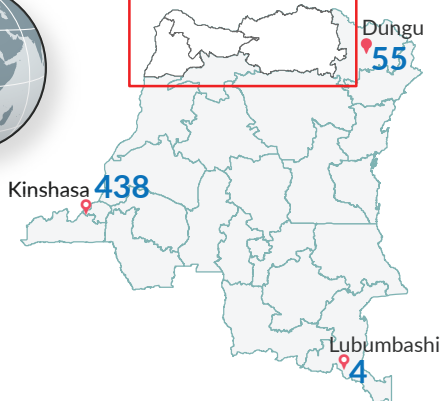
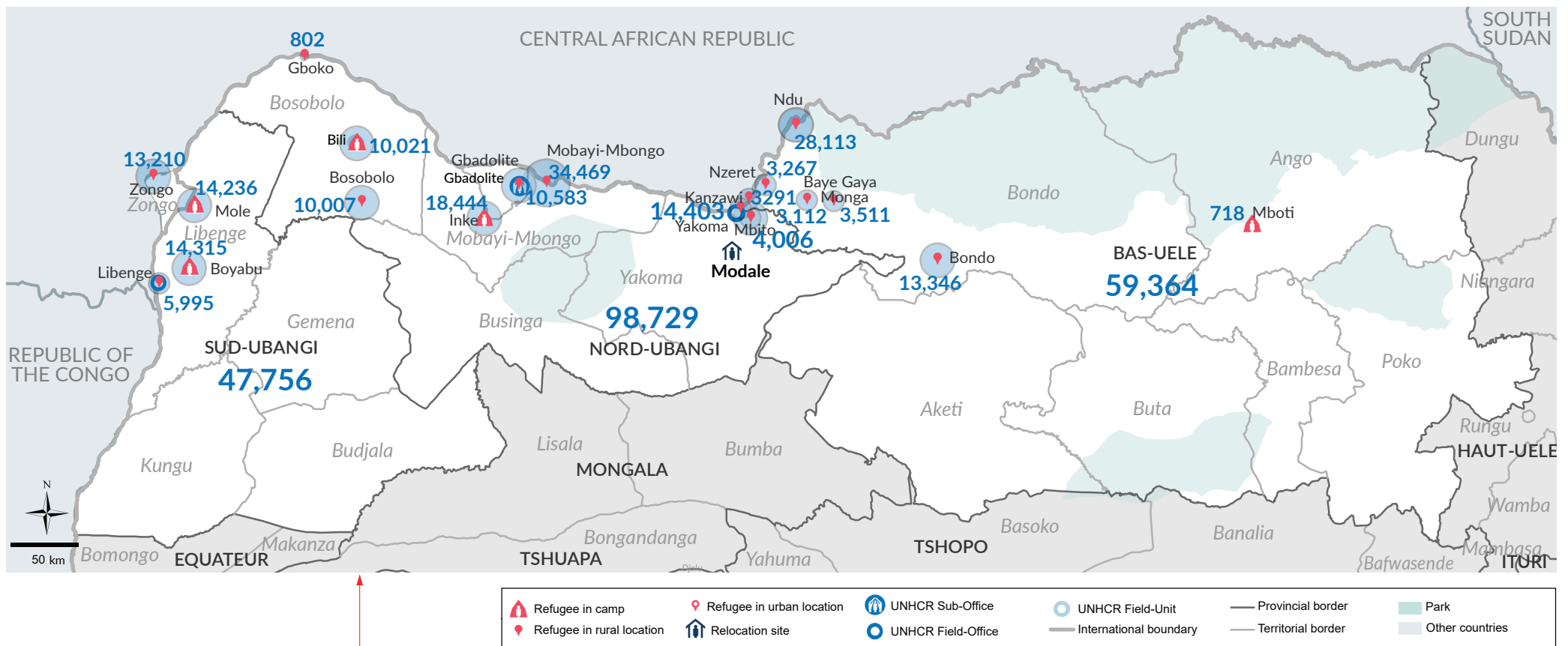
Age and Gender of Asylum Seekers Population



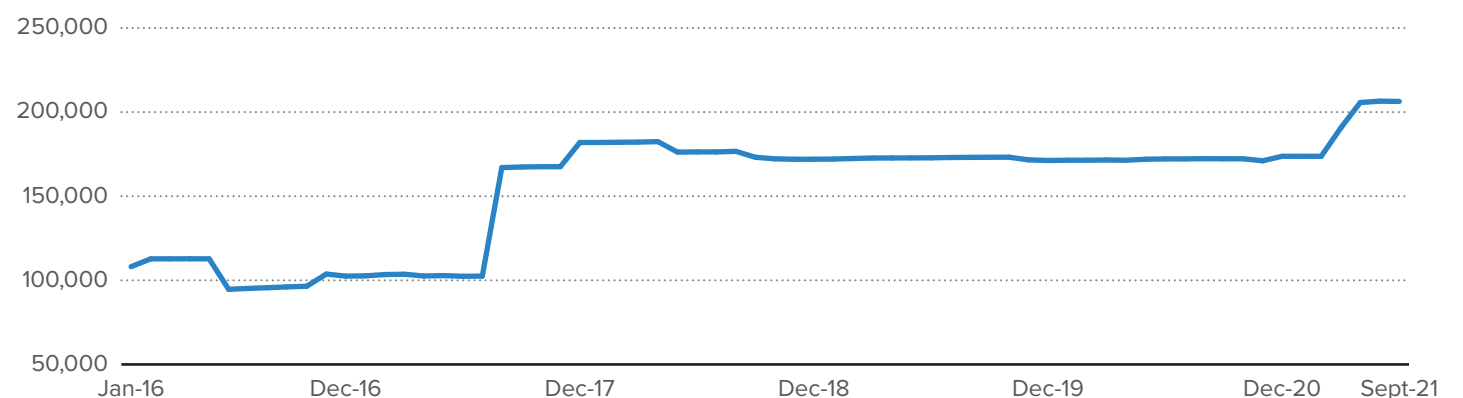
Central African Refugee Population by Type of Location

Comments about the figures of Central African refugees

The security situation in the Central African Republic (CAR) deteriorated during the period preceding or following the presidential and legislative elections of December 27, 2020. This situation resulted in an influx of refugees in neighboring countries and in particular in the DRC in the provinces of Nord Ubangi, Sud Ubangi and Bas Uele. As of September 30, 2021, the situation of Central African refugees remained unchanged. The operation to verify and collect the return intentions of Central African refugees living in the province of Sud Ubangi is underway. Data on Central African refugees will be updated after this exercise.

As a result, the number of Central African refugees in the DRC therefore remained equal to 221,694 people in total, including 206,346 refugees and 15,348 asylum seekers.

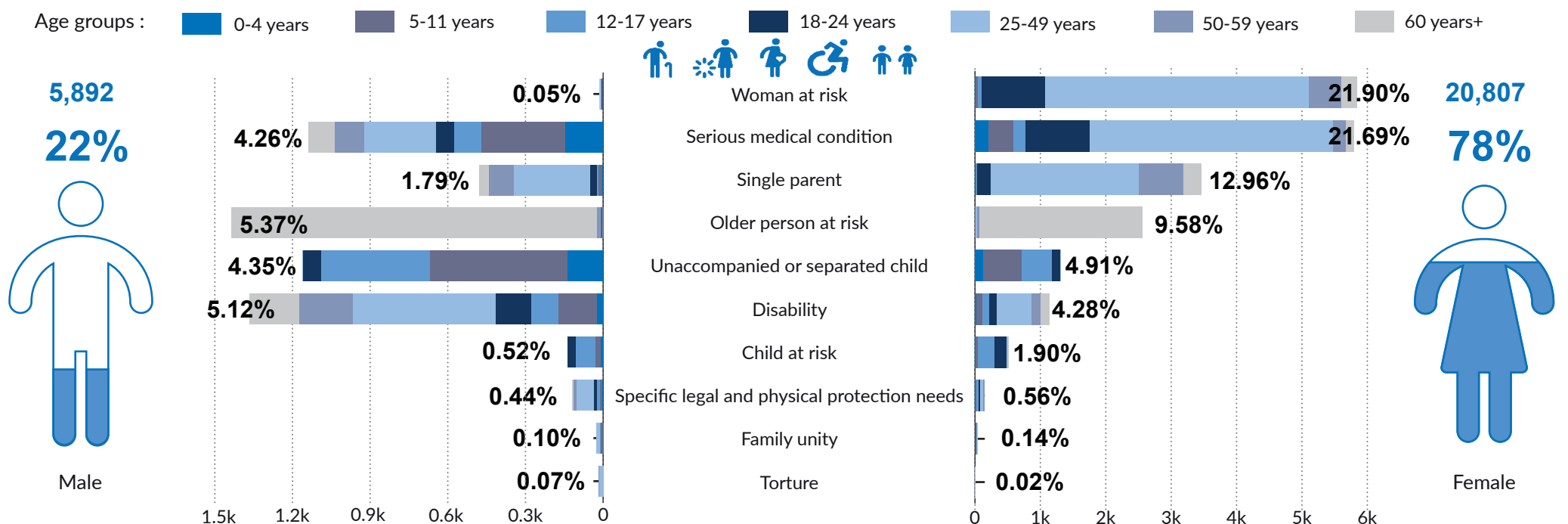

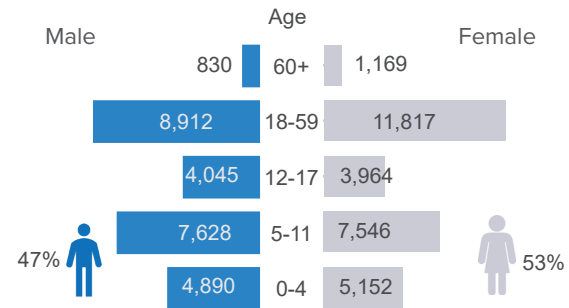

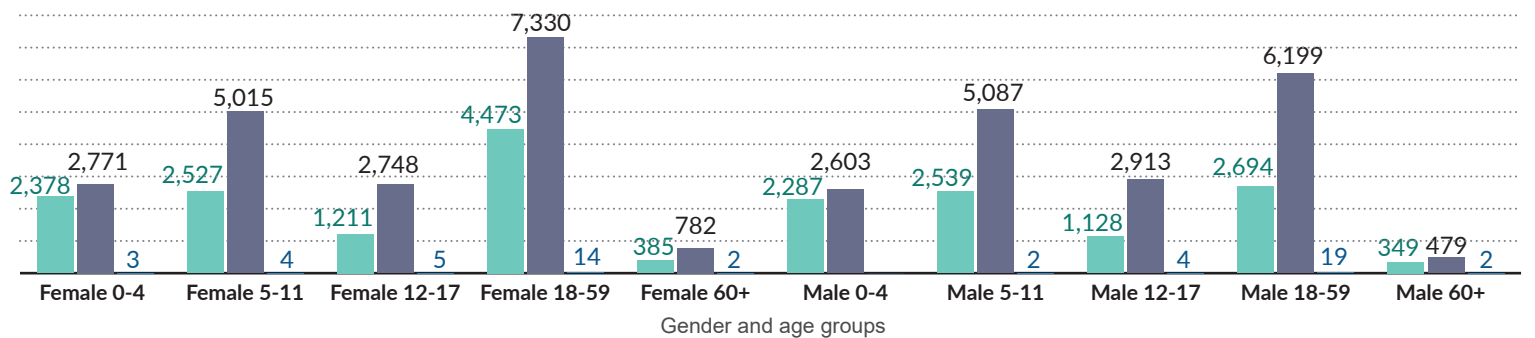
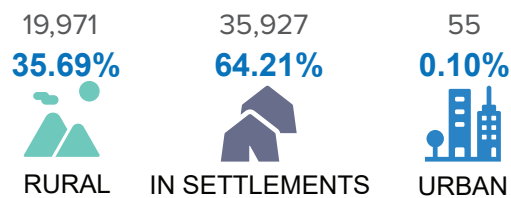

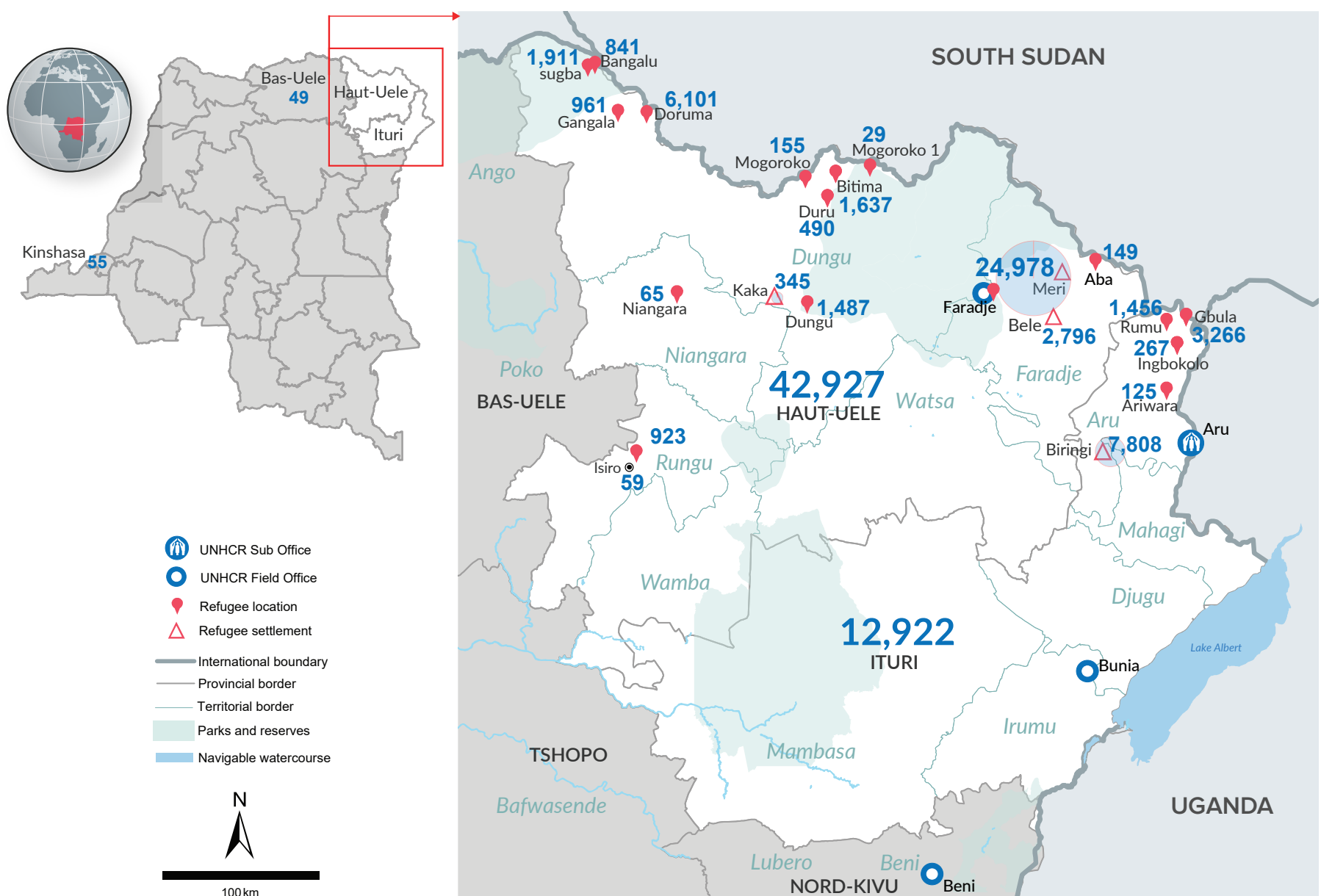
Age and Gender of Refugee Population



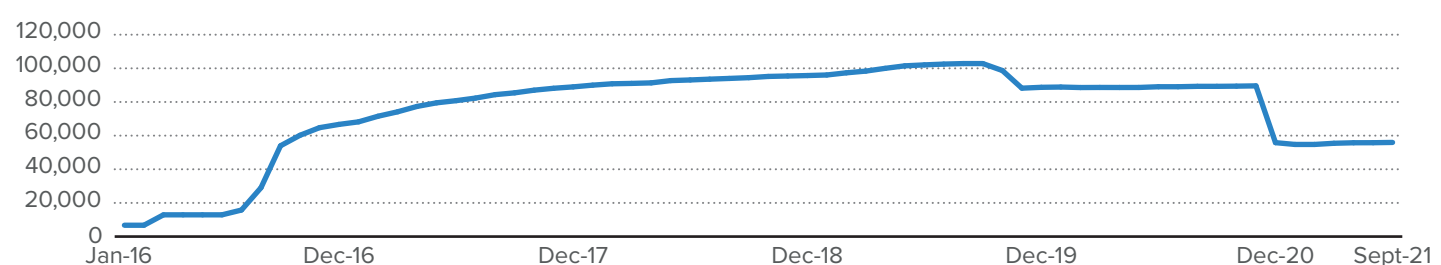
South Sudanese Refugee Population by Type of Location

Comments about the figures of South Sudanese refugees

The situation of the South Sudanese refugee population did not undergo any major change during the month of September 2021.

The overall figures of our South Sudanese beneficiaries who are located in our 4 sites are in total 35,927 or 64.21% of the overall population of SSD refugees (55,953).

All the refugees living in the 4 sites, ie 35,927, have identity documents issued by the CNR with technical support from the UNHCR.

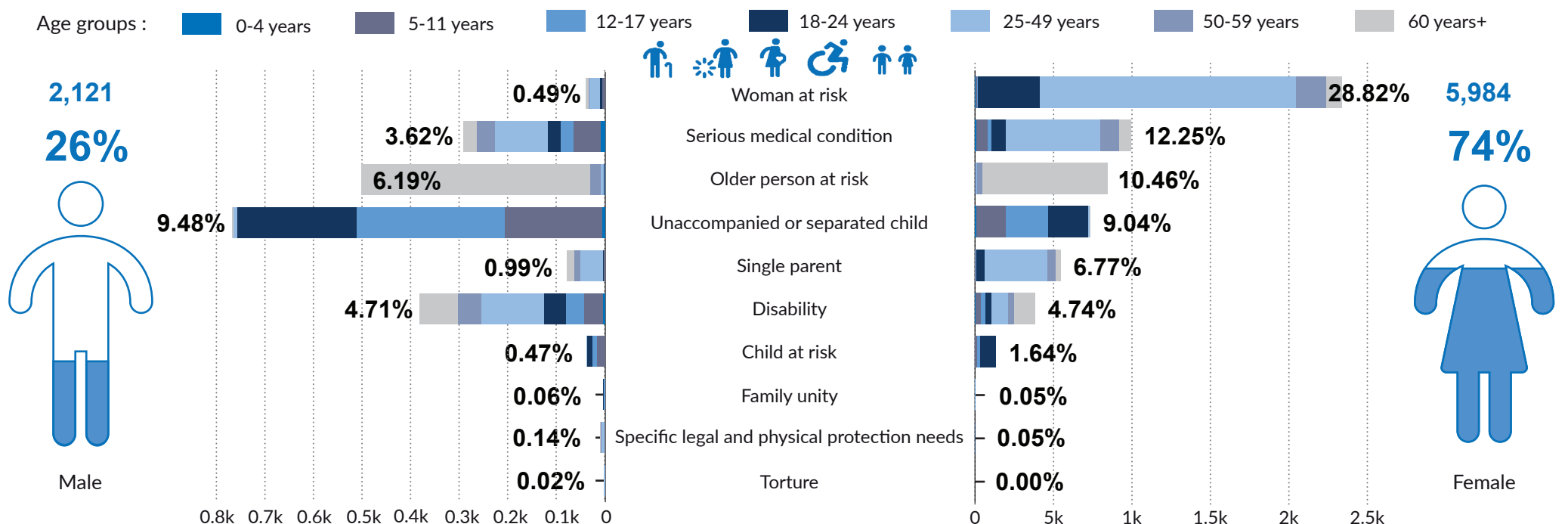

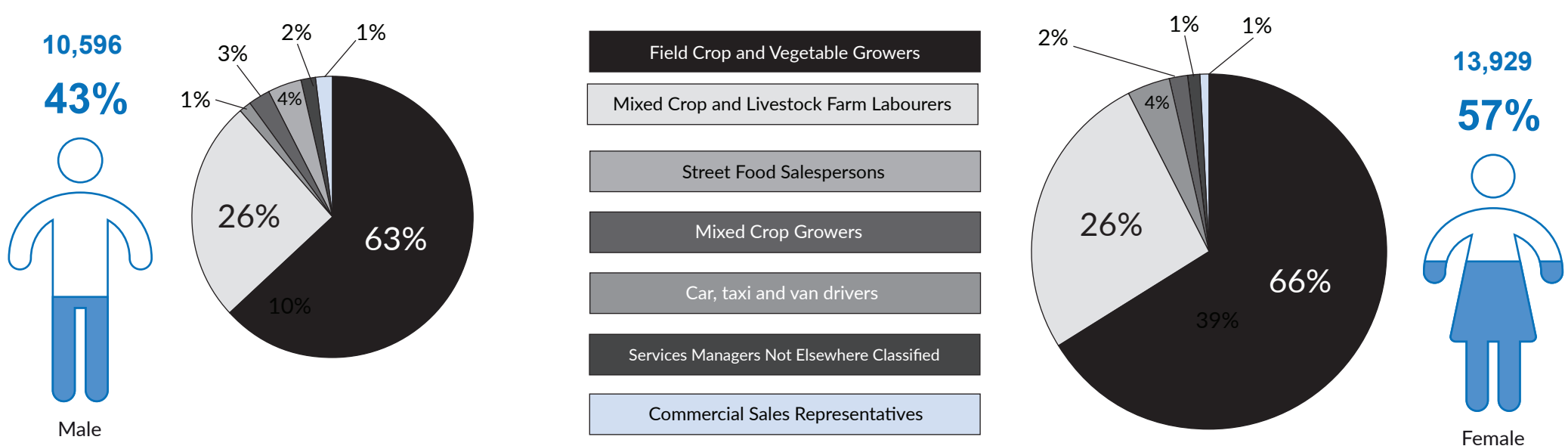

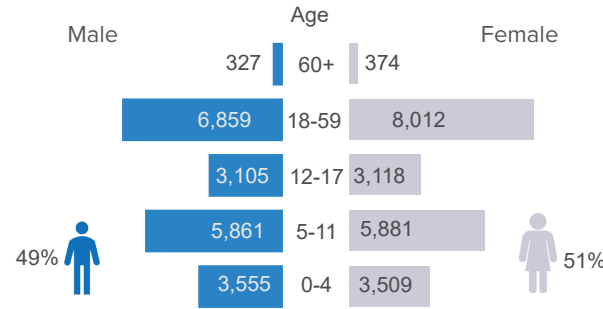

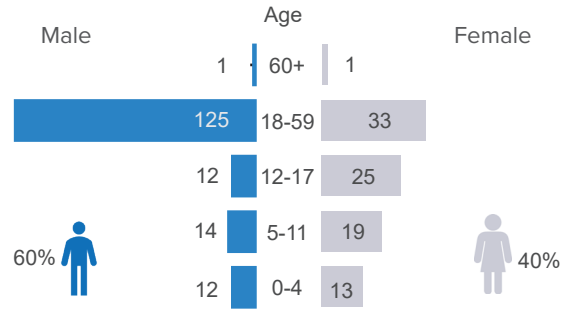

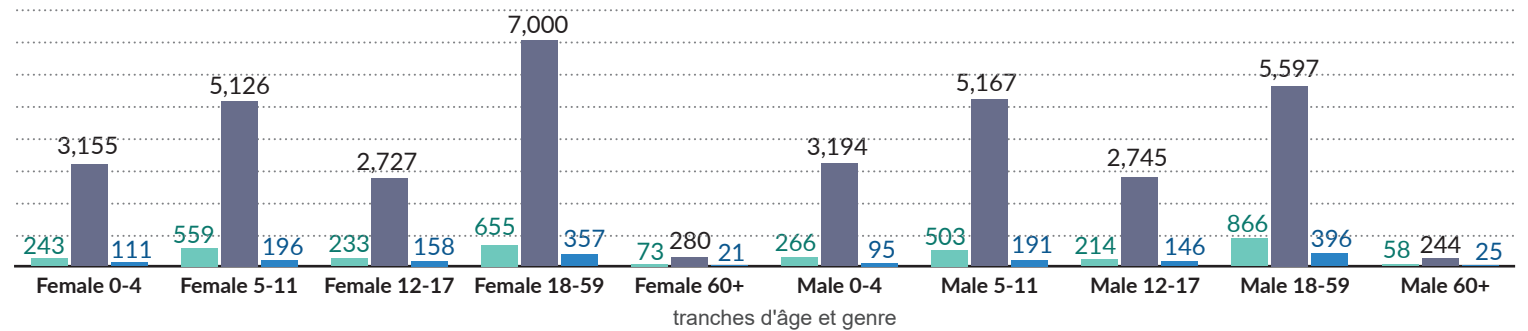
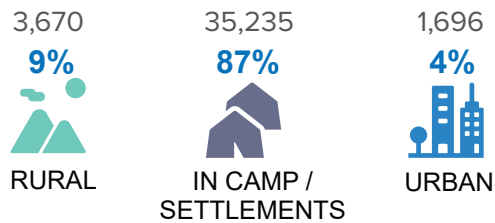
Age and Gender of Refugee Population



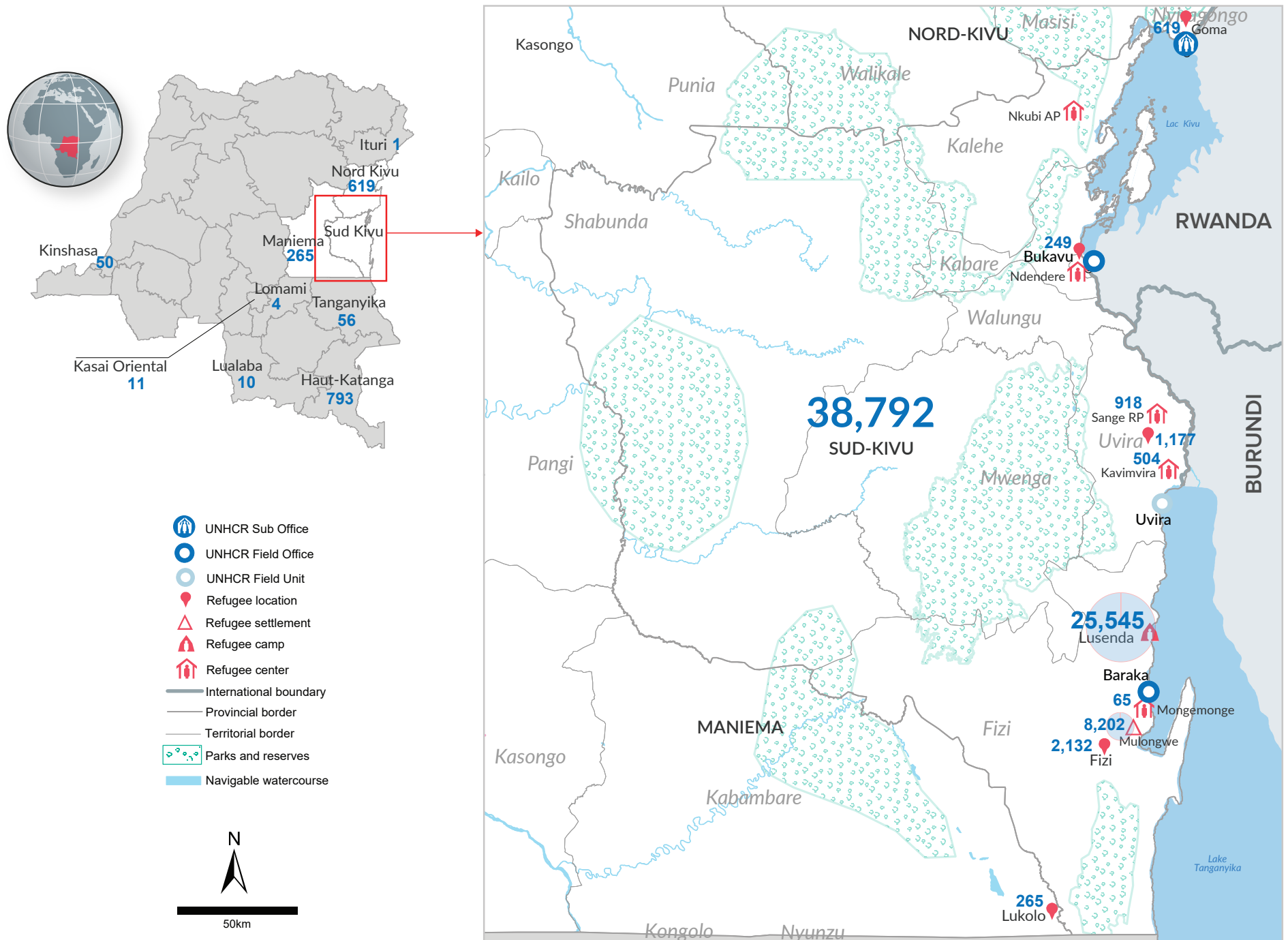
Age and Gender of Asylum Seekers Population



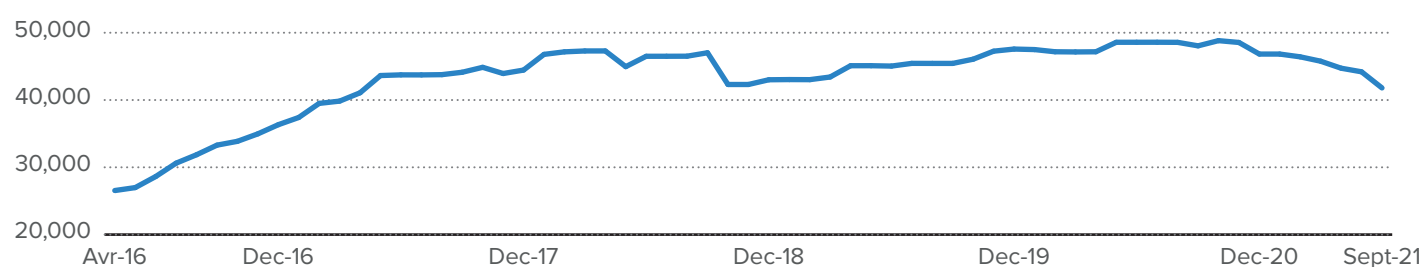
Burundian Refugee Population by Type of Location

Comments about the figures of Burundian refugees

1,174 Burundian refugees grouped into 333 households were repatriated to their country of origin in September 2021. From January 1 to September 30, 2021, 6,786 Burundian refugees grouped into 1,868 households were repatriated to their country of origin. The number of Burundian refugees still in the DRC is equal to 40,601. All Burundian refugees have identity documents issued by the CNR with technical support from the UNHCR.

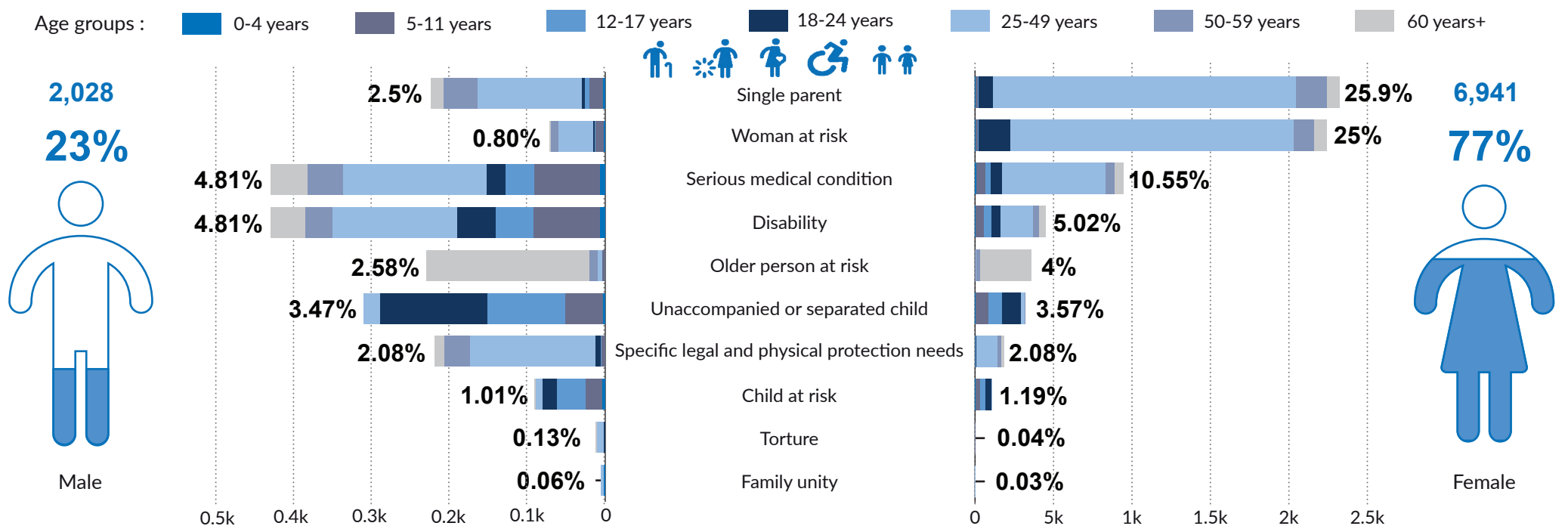

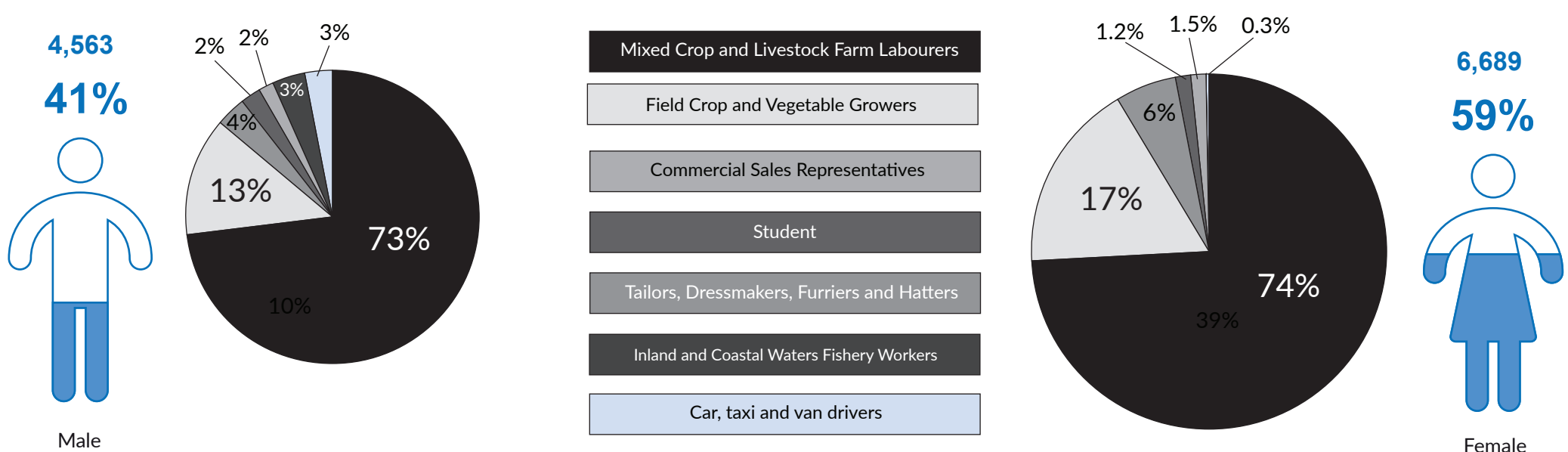
