#### **Overview**

The continuing unrest in Myanmar may result in more individuals escaping persecution and generalized violence, many of whom may cross the border into Thailand to request international protection and assistance from UNHCR and other humanitarian agencies. The Education Sector comprised of 8 partners and led by Save the Children International continues with fundraising efforts for prepositioning and preparedness for a possible 4,000 Myanmar refugee influx, including home-based learning kits and temporary learning spaces, capacity building on Education in Emergencies, and Parental Education/ Positive Parenting.

### Response

1,200 Home Based learning kits pre-positioned

47 Participants attending EiE and CSG in Emergency training

Save the Children International and humanitarian agencies (UNICEF, ADRA, Right to Play, HwF, JRS, Teacher Focus, SVA and Play Onside) at the national level continue to hold bi-weekly education sector meetings to coordinate preparedness activities, exchange information, discuss and update on education needs, existing and pipeline funding, capacity's and technical resources' gaps and needs, as well as strategies for interventions.

Fundraising continues to be done and the sector continues to receive regular emergency updates from the field education sectors in order to prepare and plan better for the possible response

- COVID-19 crisis which has further complicated the Myanmar influx situation
