DISCUSSION

Agenda item 1: Update on partners interventions for the new displacement and in IDP sites

The meeting started with a brief regarding HC visit to Marib and the RCT lunching meeting conducted by OCHA last Thursday on 18th of March. Continued with a discussion of CCCM partner's intervention in the sites of each as planned and scheduled by its activity including SNFI, WASH, Protection and Education, the interventions were included the following:

- SHS completed the verification process for 256 HHs in Alrawdha IDP site and distributed 355 SNFI for 355 HHs since 7th Feb 2021. SHS also distributed 67 SNFI kit to 67 HHs in Alsowayda IDP site in Sirwah district.
- Sana'a Collaboration supported in providing education materials for families in Almil IDP site by supporting schools and teachers' incentives.

- Human Access to support 200 new HHs by providing SNFI intervention in Sirwah district.
- ACTED presented with new response in Marib hub starting with food intervention by cash to new HHs in Marib.

A discussion regarding partners intervention methodology in Marib Hub had put into the table by establishing a basic list (service mapping) contain active partners with each sector of intervention and coverage area. CCCM cluster and Ex U highly recommend the method to be followed and shared from each partner in the field in order to harmonize Marib hub situation and overview in general.

Agenda item 2: Update on partners interventions in IOM managed sites and upcoming interventions

International Organization for Migration (IOM):

IOM is managing 23 IDP camp in Marib city and Marib Alwadi, providing CCCM activities to all HHs in the targeted sites including (training, community share activities, fire mitigation, distributions...etc) and deterring the gaps and challenges in each as follow:

- Distribution of 100 fire extinguisher to IOM managed sites (42 in Marib Alwadi and 58 in Marib city) along with fire fighting training for each focal point.
- IOM team explained IDPs movement tracking in its managed sites which it is updating regularly.
- 270 referred cases to other partners in the field including SNFI, Protection, WASH and health.
- IOM also shared about community participation in IDP sites by conducting a weekly awareness session conducted by community committees titled by (COVID-19 risk and how to proper protect yourself, best cooking practices and how to mitigate the risk of fire by using best cooking modality in IDP shelters)
- Youth intervention in IDP sites by conducting youth day in form of sport practices among young people in the displaced sites.
- OXFAM is conducting a WASH intervention in three IOM managed sites, Kuliyaat Almughtama, Maktab Alzirah and Almuthafa by sewer suction, and conducting a new assessment in Masna Adban site inside Marib city.

Gaps and challenges:

Marib city IDP sites face an (open defecation cesspits) as there aren't WASH partners in Marib city which also IDP lack of drinking water tanker and beneficiaries has to purchase their own drinking water daily.

Agenda item 3: Site ID activity: tools, coverage and partners.

The Site Reporting Exercise is implemented through a Key Informant (KI)-based tool that covers questions on site structure, population demographics, access to services and priority needs. It does not aim to comprehensively understand needs but is intended to inform a database of all IDP sites in Yemen, humanitarian planning, and future resource allocation.

The Site Reporting Tool is deployed nationwide, targeting all IDP hosting sites across 22 governorates. The exercise covers both rural and urban settings and aims to identify both informal and formal IDP hosting sites in Yemen.

Site Report Process

- CCCM Partner FPs determine assessment locations based on their programming & capacity, in collaboration with CCCM Cluster.
 - Compare IDP hosting site list provided by CCCM Cluster & local authorities!
- CCCM Partner FPs ensure authorization for data collection & coordination with authorities.
- Trained enumerators collect data in site or remotely* (2 for field visits, 1 for phone-based interviews) through paper tool & safe draft on KOBO.
- CCCM Partner FPs review all submitted data to ensure quality & submit survey responses.
- REACH conducts data quality checks, cleaning & analysis, in collaboration with FPs
- REACH produces outputs & re-distributes outputs to CCCM, CCCM partners & updates the CCCM Dashboard.

*COVID-19: Depending on circumstances, data collection could occur remotely via phone-based KI interviews.

The SiteID exercise will cover 139 IDP site across Marib Hub in 6 sub-districts divided between 8 participating partners namely: IOM, Human Access, BFD, SHS, Estijabah, CRB, BCHR and SCRD.

Site's coverage will be divided into sectors of response as each partner will cover a certain sector based on their strength capacity in IDP sites in the field.

Agenda item 4: Site care and maintenance overview.

The location of a camp or camp-like setting can greatly affect the protection and assistance of displaced persons living there. Camps may often be self-settled, yet the Camp Management Agency has a strong role to play in improving the location.

Maintenance can include gap distributions to promote hygiene and infrastructure repairs, upgrade of shelters and facilities, new construction (roads, facilities ... etc), risk reduction (fire and flood mitigation), referral of accidents, waste management, and related capacity building. Safety audits can point out areas that need to be upgraded. The need to adapt work plans

and maintain facilities will occur as the context and needs of the displaced and host populations change over time. Expect both capacities and resources to adjust the longer the site exists.

Plans are best when remaining flexible and taking future scenarios and camp closure into account.

The **social, cultural and protection needs** of the displaced population must be taken into account from the beginning of the camp life cycle. Identify how to improve technical standards and GBV risk reduction in camp, collective centre and transit/reception centre.
