

Child Protection Sub-Working Group Ukraine Response

Moldova
March 16th 2021

Context

- 321,305 people from Ukraine entered the Republic of Moldova. During the same period, 218,823 left the territory of Moldova. **102,482 are currently in Moldova.** 4,600 asylum applications has been filed.
- Estimated 47% children or approx. 48,000
- Risks include psychological distress, risk of abuse and violence, risk of trafficking, family separation
- Government, civil society group and national NGOs mobilised



for every child

RRP and Mapping

- **Child-friendly reception, identification, and Best Interests Procedures for children at risk**
- **Prevent separation and ensure provision of services for UASC**
- **Psychosocial support, community outreach and enhanced communication with communities**
- **Strengthening national child protection systems and services**

Approximately 6.5 million for CP

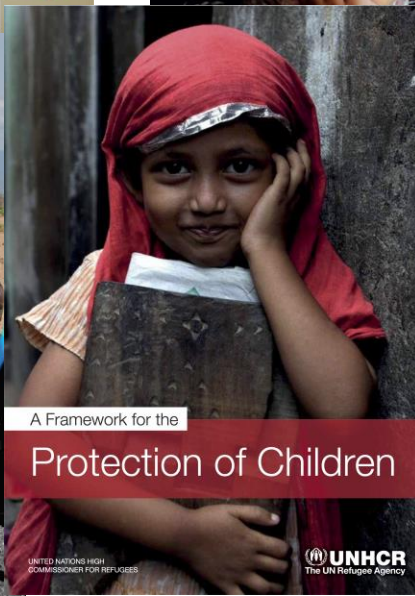
