There is no available data on refugee children enrolled in the national education system as of 17<sup>th</sup> June 2022, because children are on summer vacation and don't attend school.</li> <li>MER requested from the Ministry of Internal Affairs the age-disaggregated data on refugee children in order to prepare for the upcoming academic year.</li> <li>MER highlighted that 636 refugee children are enrolled in kindergartens and 316 refugee children are attending extracurricular educational institutions (54). Also, MER mentioned that 37 refugee children are attending 7 summer camps. 157 free tickets were offered to refugee children for summer camps.</li> <li>MER is in the process of organizing the graduation exams, and the admission exams for bachelor's and master's degrees for refugee students from Ukraine who are on the territory of the Republic of Moldova. The number of those who signed up for the multidisciplinary exam in Moldova is 231 students. The exam is expected to take place in July 2022.</li> <li>UNICEF informed that a presentation on the activities implemented by IREWG members was made during a meeting with the Unique Crisis Management Center.
