Agenda point 2	Silvia Gatscher, WHO: findings from meetings with Oxfam & UNHCR in Rzeszow:
	 Lengthy line of people going back to UA (several days)
	Border crossing of refugees into PL: the number remains stable
	Only two official voivodship reception centers remain open
	Most partners providing health services seem to have left
	Worth monitoring:
	 No sanitation facilities for people going back to UA, no provision of food or water, which is a concern taking the weather into account
	 No health services available neither for people, traveling to UA, nor for people, traveling to PL (heat, blood pressure, 60+ are at risk, no wheelchairs available for assistance
