"We were living in our homes, we were safe, drinking tea, making plans for the future, but one day at 5 am we heard an explosion, a terrible sound that changed our lives forever", said Anastasia Ciorninkaya, a Ukrainian refugee in Moldova. Addressing an event commemorating World Refugee Day, she added, "Thousands of us left our homes and crossed the border into Moldova. You met us at border, fed us, sheltered us. I promise from this stage that I will pass on to the next generations how you helped us. Moldova's openness will be included in history textbooks on humanity." referring to the Moldovan people.
