<p>RRP and sector indicators</p>	<p>Reference made to regional RRP indicators and need to establish sector indicators.</p> <p>Meeting with sector WG leads on Wednesday to go through indicators in more detail.</p> <p>It was raised again that the need for IM support within each WG.</p> <p>UNICEF has brought M&E support (Tania)</p> <p>IM Inter-Agency Officer will be deployed to UNHCR next week.</p> <p>While being flexible, we also need to set minimal a minimal standard and develop definitions and guidance should be provided. I.e. regarding education indicators, we have three agencies working with the same partners. In that case clear guidelines should be provided.</p>	<p>Bilateral meetings RRP indicators will be conveyed by Inter-Sector Coord – Date: Wednesday 25 May.</p>
<p>Inter-agency update</p>	<p>Protection: No meeting last week. No developments.</p> <p>Child Protection: Last WG meeting held on 19 May 2022, discussions around priorities -presented few meetings ago and Draft Work/Action Plan. The meeting will be in two weeks, on 5 of June.</p> <p>5W developments (clean up) with the cooperation of the members of the team.</p> <p>A task team was formed to focus on capacity building: mapping capacity building needs and ensuring a harmonized approach.</p> <p>Education: Work on 5W is challenging because two reasons. (1) technical difficulties and (2) the identification of partners and the role they play. That is important as it links with the prioritization of interventions.</p>	<p>Bilateral meetings RRP indicators will be conveyed by Inter-Sector Coord – Date: Wednesday 25 May.</p>

Technical discussions and the creation of teams within the WG to work on specific subjects. For instance, Romanian language acquisition partners are doing summer camps and summer schools, formal and non-formal language trainings, and the tasking of the coordination for the working groups. One important subject is protections and registration which World Vision is leading.

The idea is this forum goes beyond the updates but more linking the different subject areas.

Health: Preparations for the Romexpo opening.

Regarding the Mental Health Group has extended invitations to organizations working on mental health but not part of the group.

Sorana joint the team last week and the Mental Health group is meeting bi-weekly.

The issue of cross-sectorial nature of the indicators is open to the interpretation since the context, the case and the targeted beneficiary.

Cash working group. No attendance.

Information Management: In terms of coordination we are in good shape and the operational data portal will be launched soon as approval is given.

SOPs for the 5Ws are under development and they have to be harmonized taking into account the

James will update.</p> <p>Coordination with partners on requests of information to government agencies.</p> <p>PSEA Network: No meeting this week, but mapping the reporting channels in conjunction with AAP mapping towards a baseline of information to an interagency complains mechanism.</p> <p>Basic Needs: Also happening bi-weekly. Virtual warehouse ongoing and assessments of shelter needs will be carried out. The BN WG will receive support of inter-agency associate, Rebeca Sabou, starting next week.</p> <p>Anti-Trafficking task force: Emma Smith will follow up on issues on next meeting</p>
