Providing this PSEA trainings to high level officials is important because that is how SEA can be stopped.</p> <p>The PSEA values and principles were shared, and reporting SEA cases was encouraged.</p> <p>Participants in the training were mostly mayors, deputy mayors, social assistance workers, teachers, and other significant stakeholders who directly interact with the refugees. Some mayors showed interest in elaborating PSEA policy, as well as regulating it locally.</p> <p>A clear follow up and continuity on PSEA capacity building is required for consistency and better results. PSEA policies and standards should be developed by the local authorities. Local authorities should be informed that the work on PSEA is a common responsibility with humanitarian workers and not something put on the local authorities solely.</p> <p>There is a particular need to address the engagement within PSEA humanitarian context of the staff who is working on GBV. Hence, additional tools specifically for humanitarian workers already involved in GBV should be created or adapted. There is also a specific need of SEA assistance package, that is similar to GBV referral package.</p>	<p>Activity: To provide more PSEA trainings for local authorities and NGOs. If implementing partners are still assessed, then it should be marked in the table as ongoing. If documents on the results of the assessment are still waited, then it should be marked in the table as pending. Any partner should have the minimum standards of PSEA.</p> <p>The partners’ contacts should be made available in case of any possible follow up necessity.
