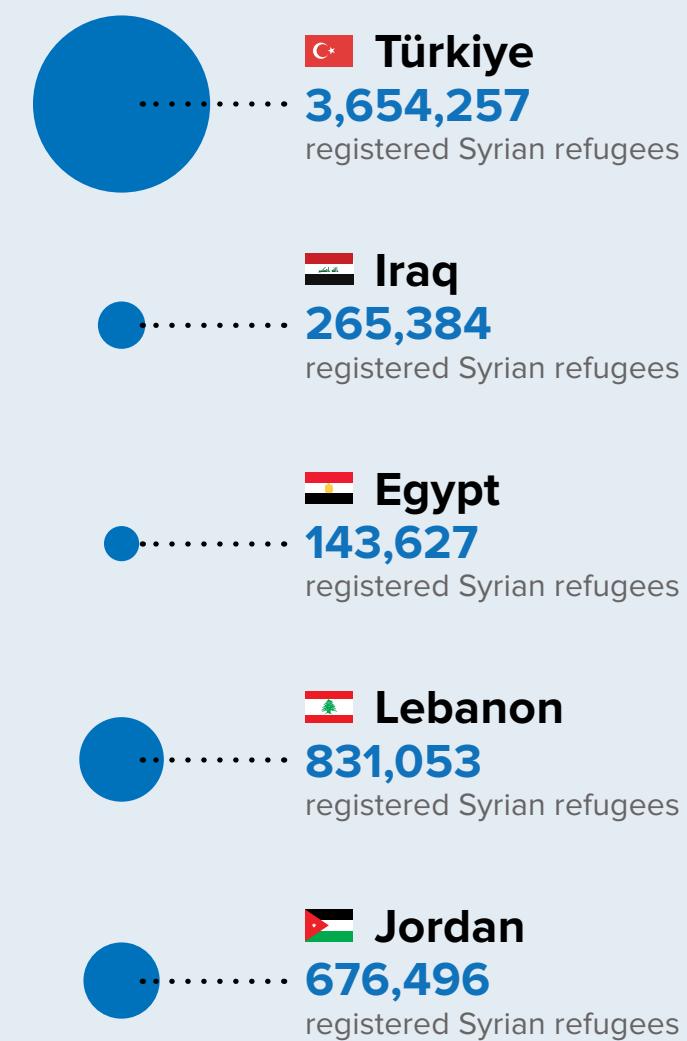
Durable solutions for refugees from Syria are based on a comprehensive protection and solutions strategy which seeks to: 1) support host country and community resilience; 2) enable refugee self-reliance, including access to services, legal work opportunities and livelihoods; 3) expand access to resettlement in third countries and other complementary pathways, and; 4) plan for the return of refugees to Syria, on a voluntary basis, when conditions for a safe, dignified and sustainable return are in place.

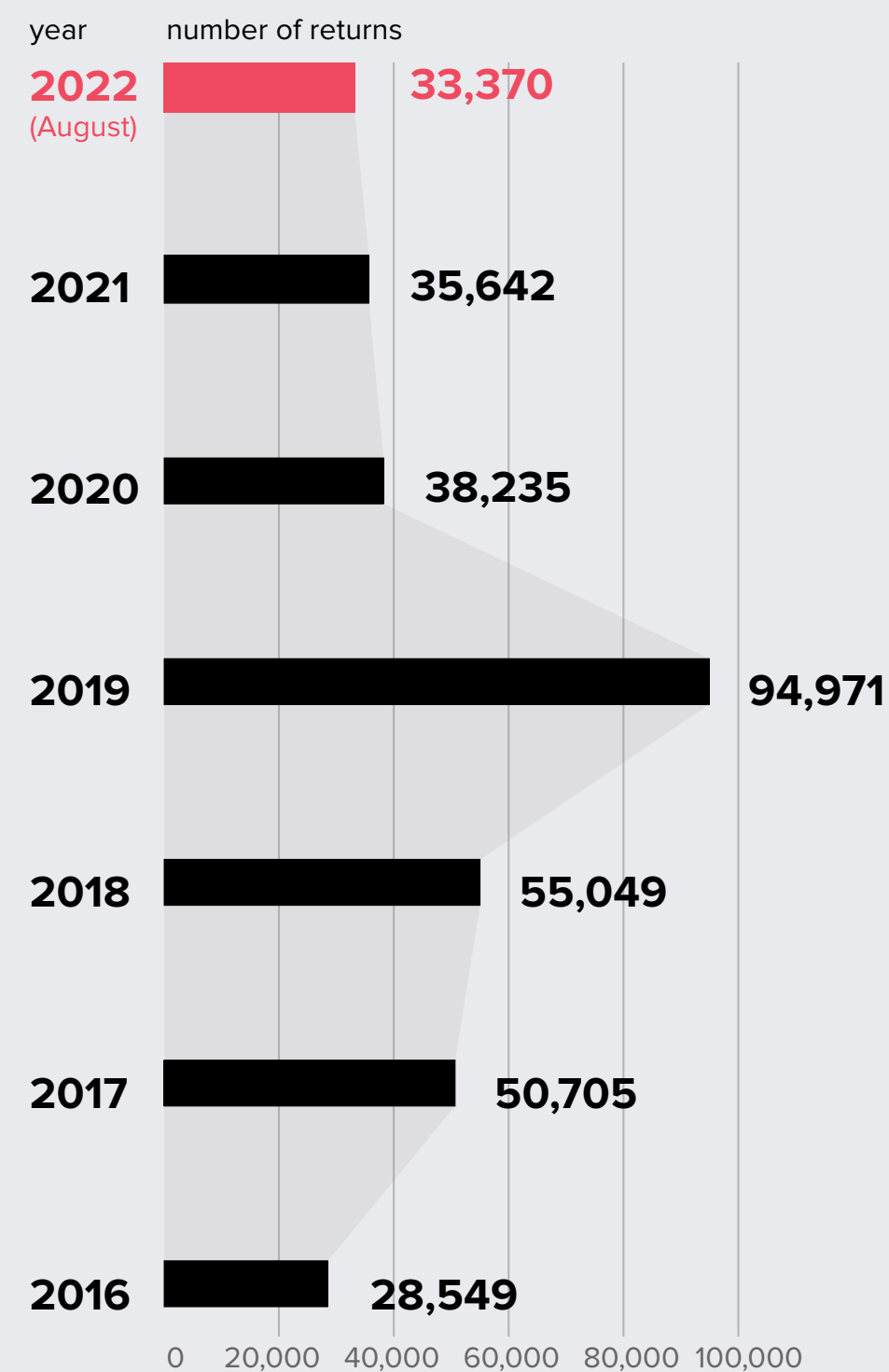

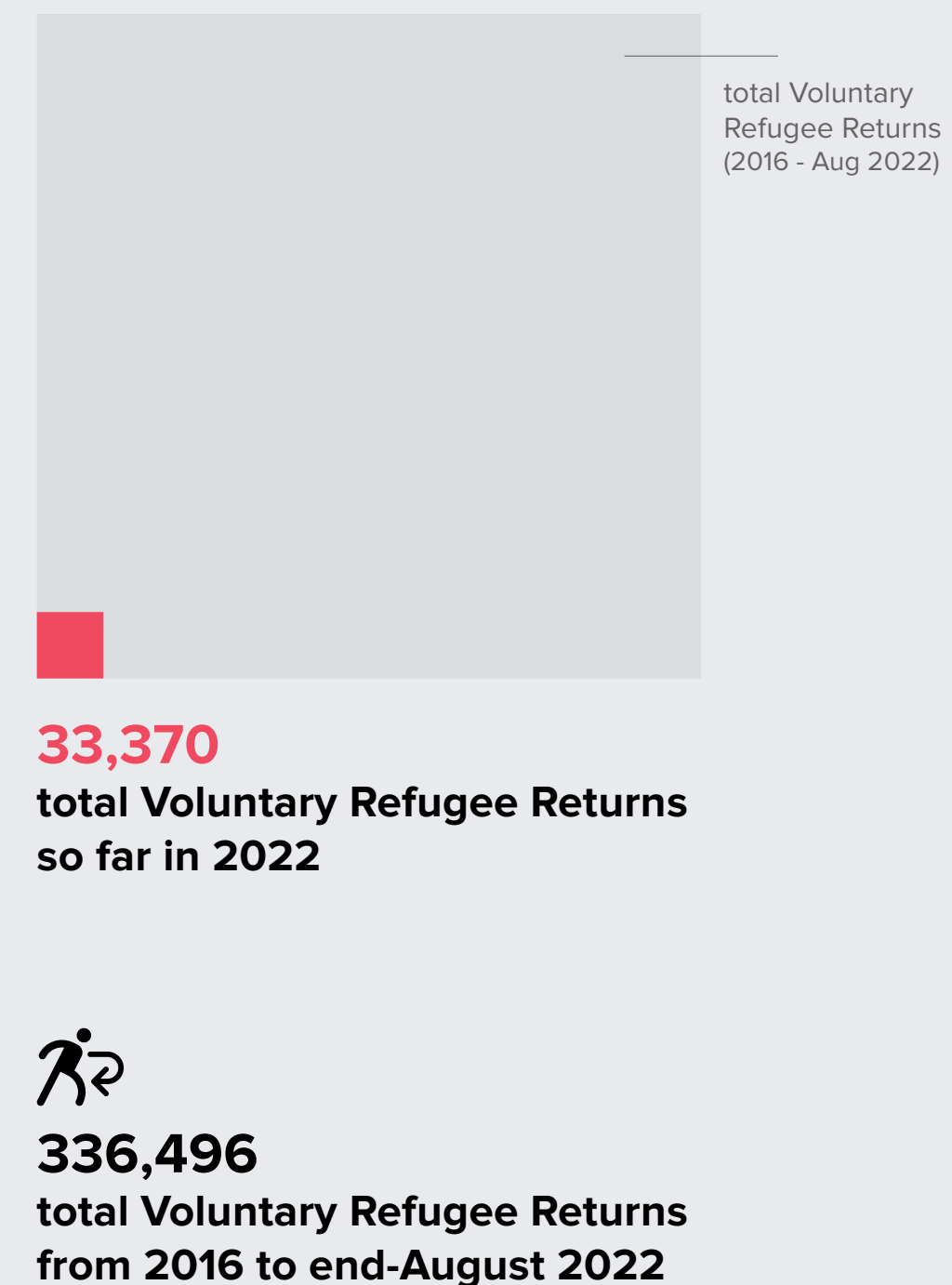

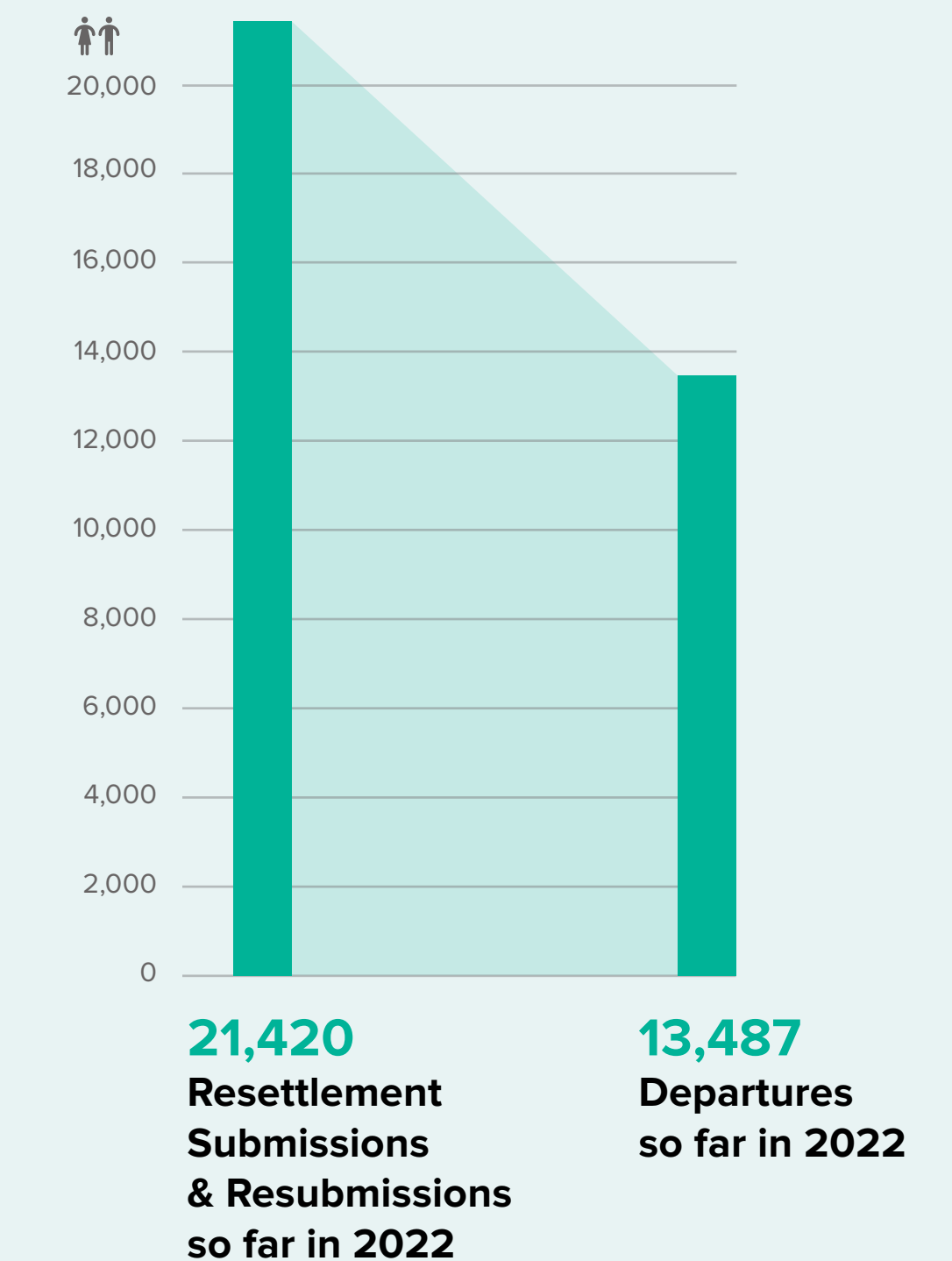

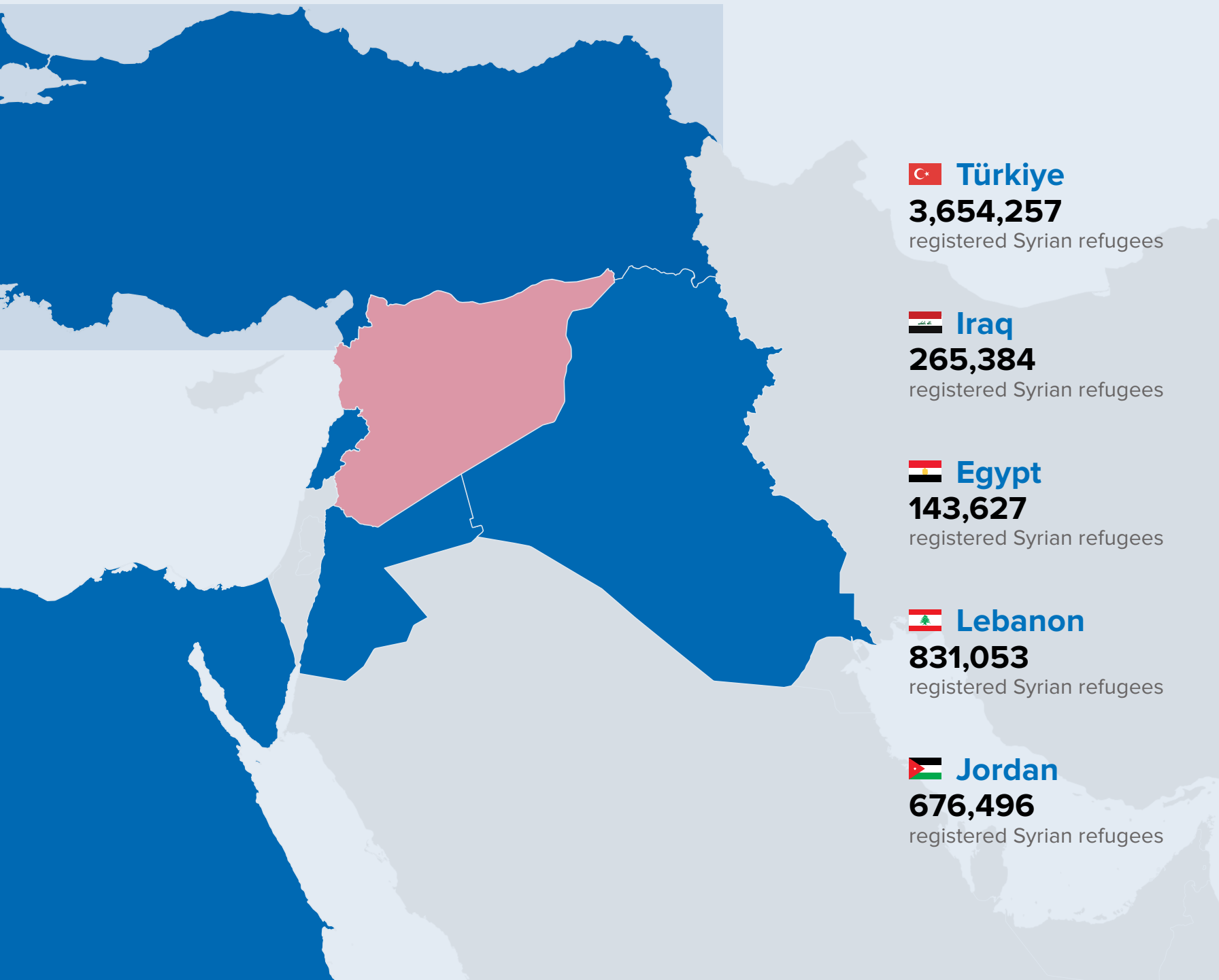

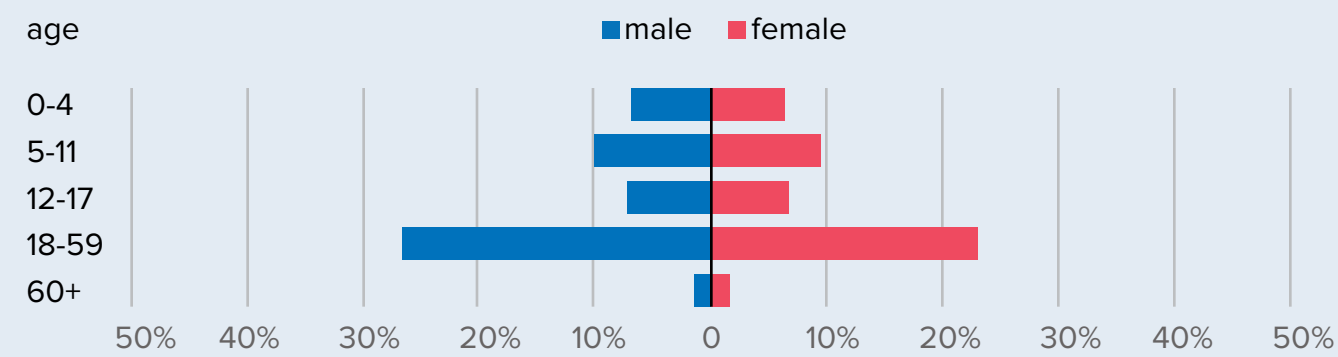

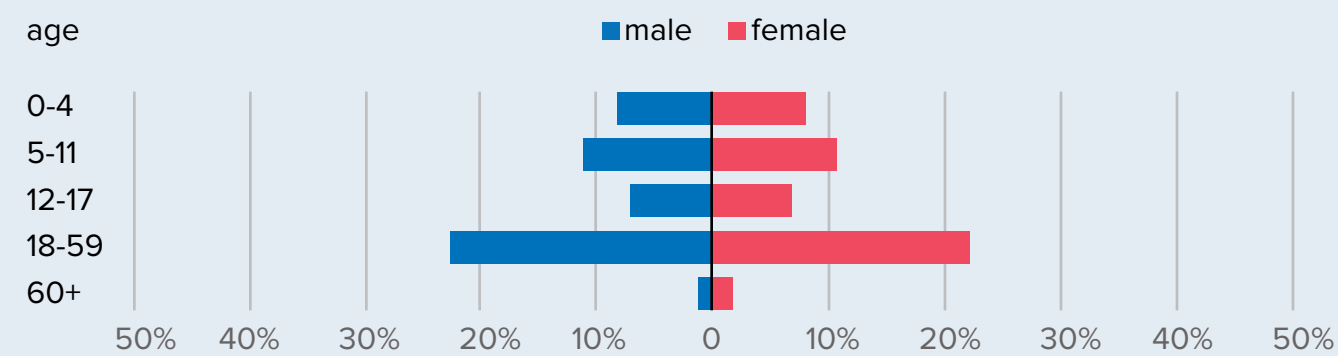

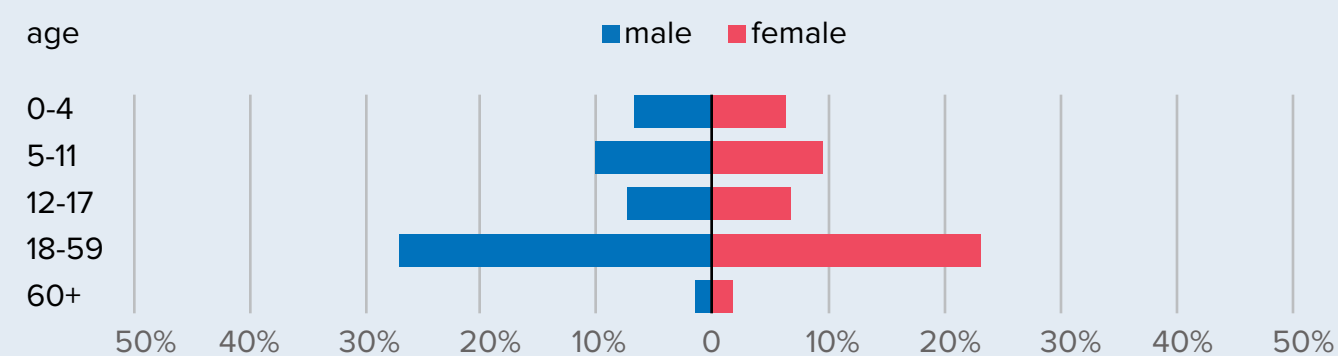
Registered Syrian Refugees (in-camp)

Key Facts



47% of the registered Syrian refugees are children under the age of 18.



95% of Syrian refugees across the region reside within the host community, mainly in urban areas; **5%** reside in camps.



Syrian refugee youth aged between 15 and 24 years old constitute around **20%** of the total registered Syrian population in the five countries.



9% of individuals were found to have a disability in Lebanon, **30%** with physical or intellectual needs in Jordan, and **8%** of Syrian refugees are considered to have disability in Egypt.

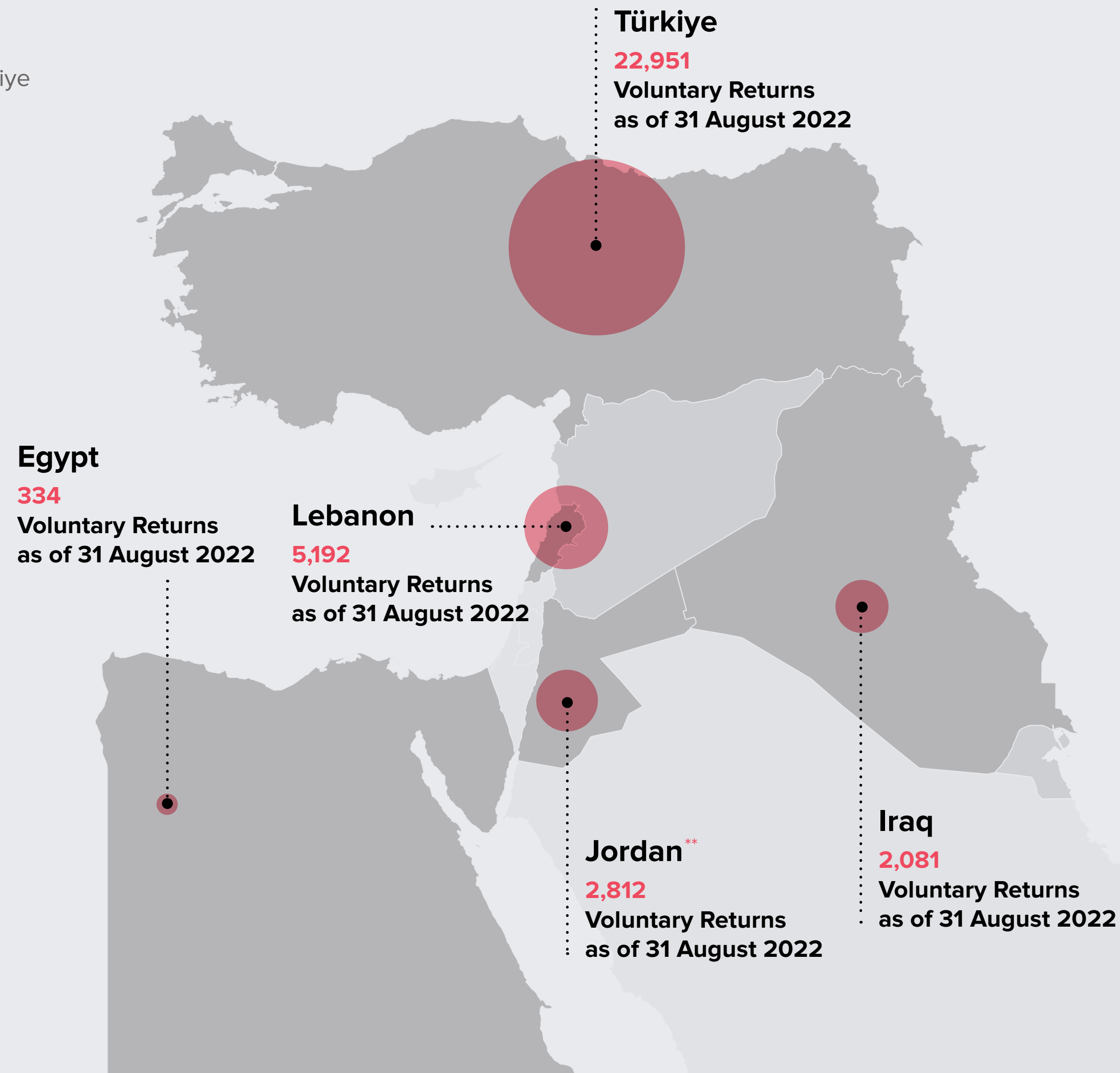

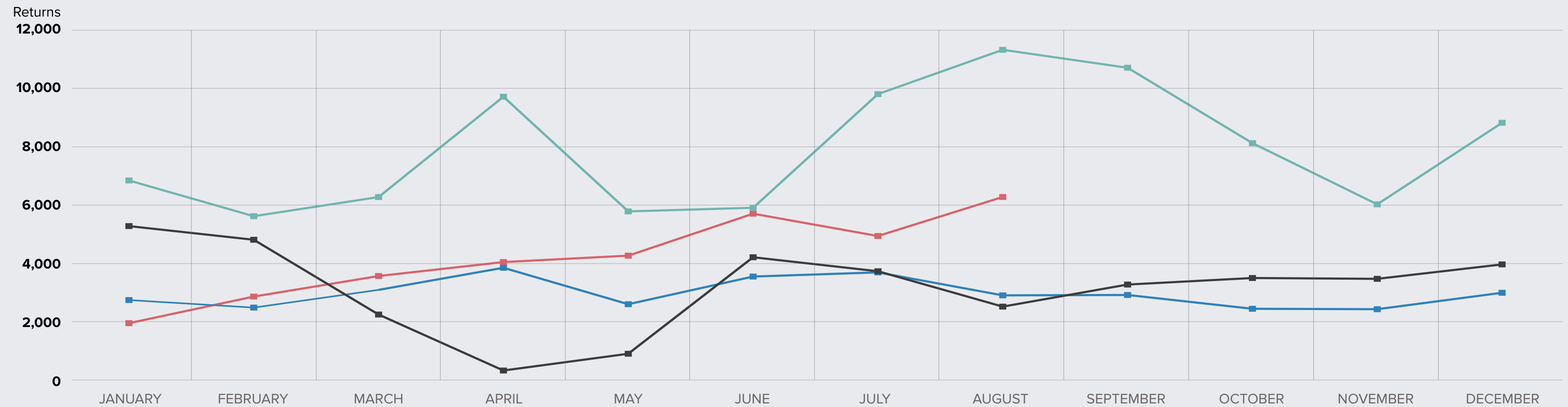

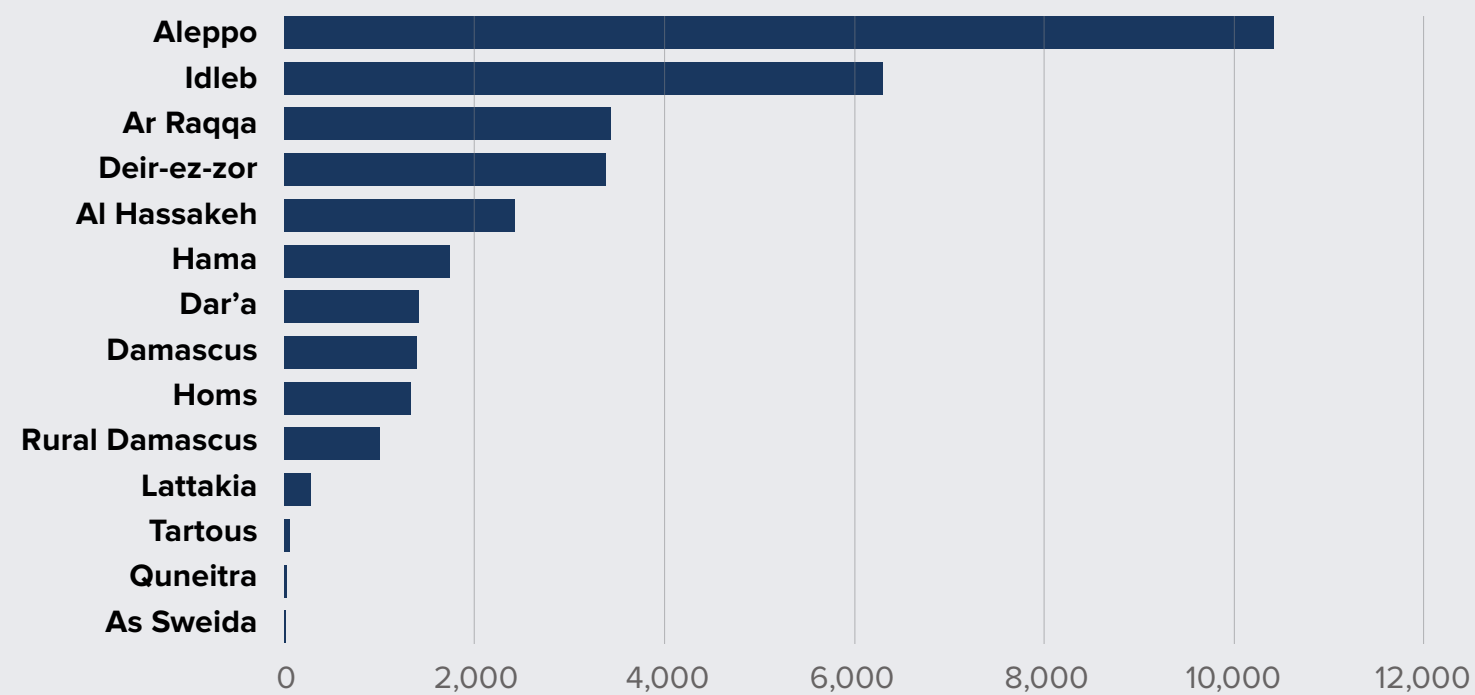

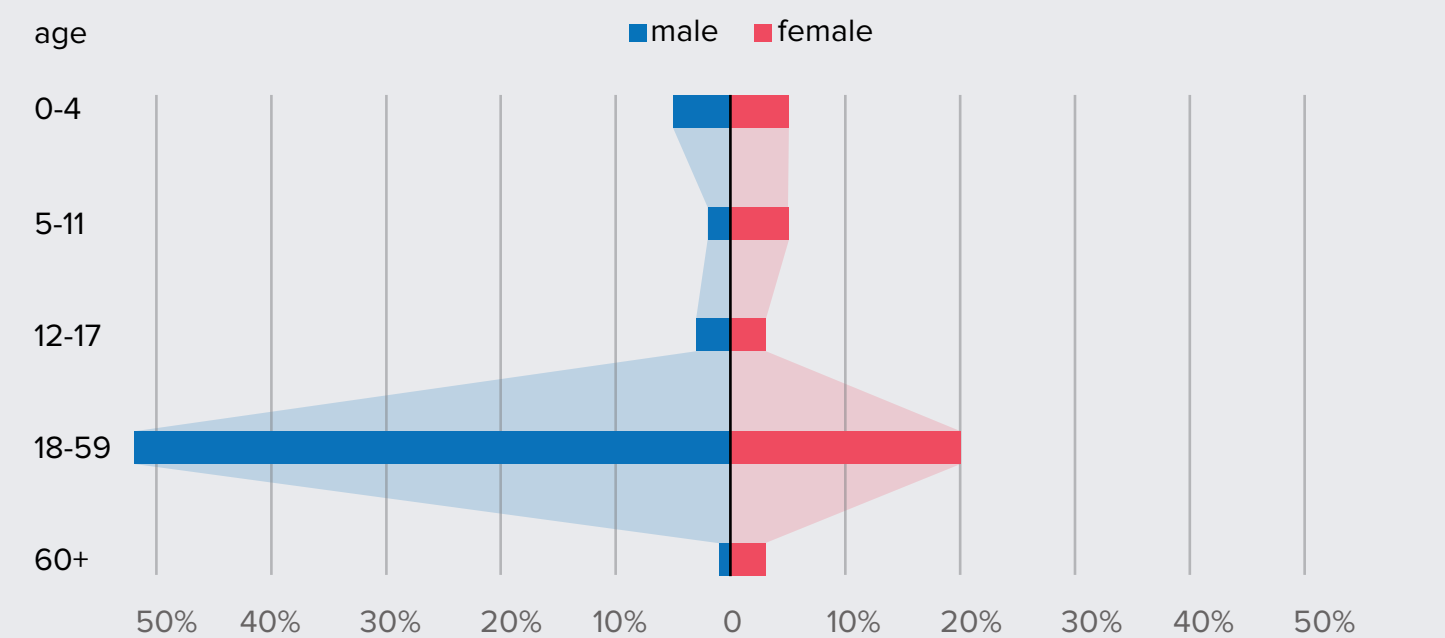

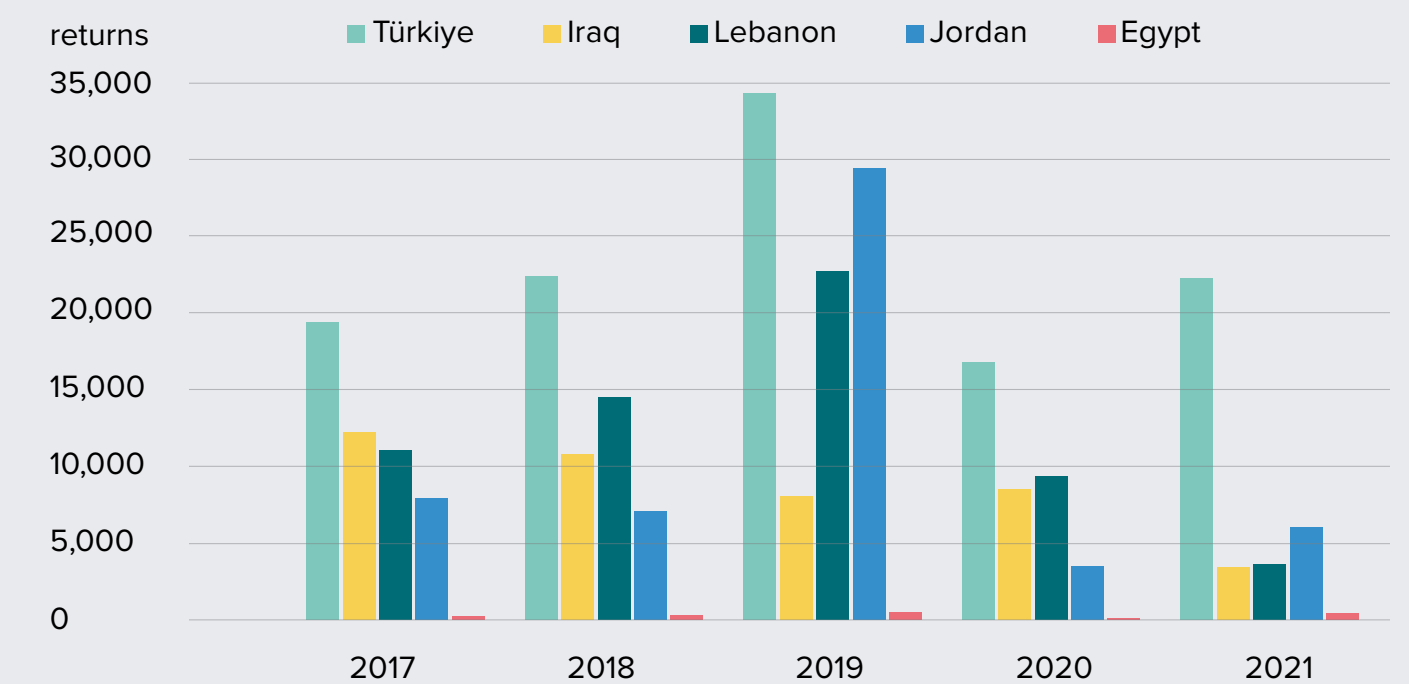
Return by Governorate of Origin (so far in 2022)

Return in Previous Years



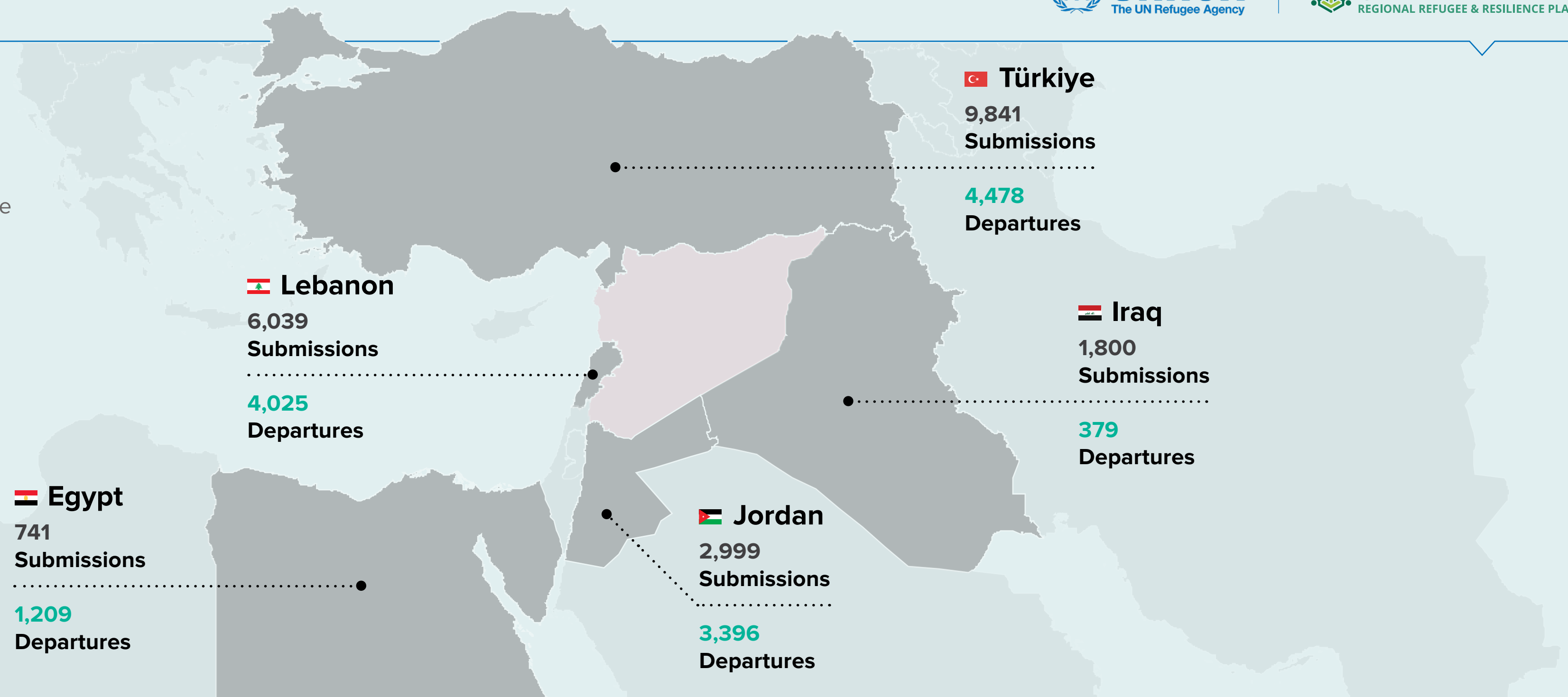

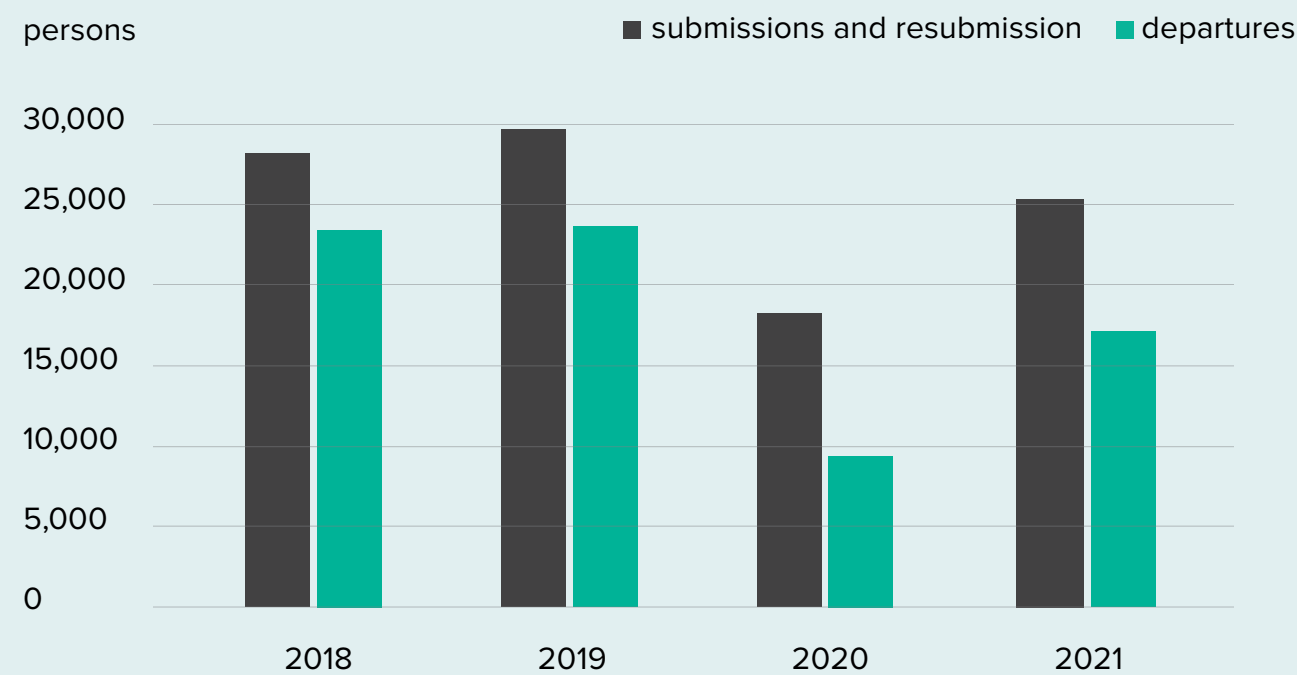

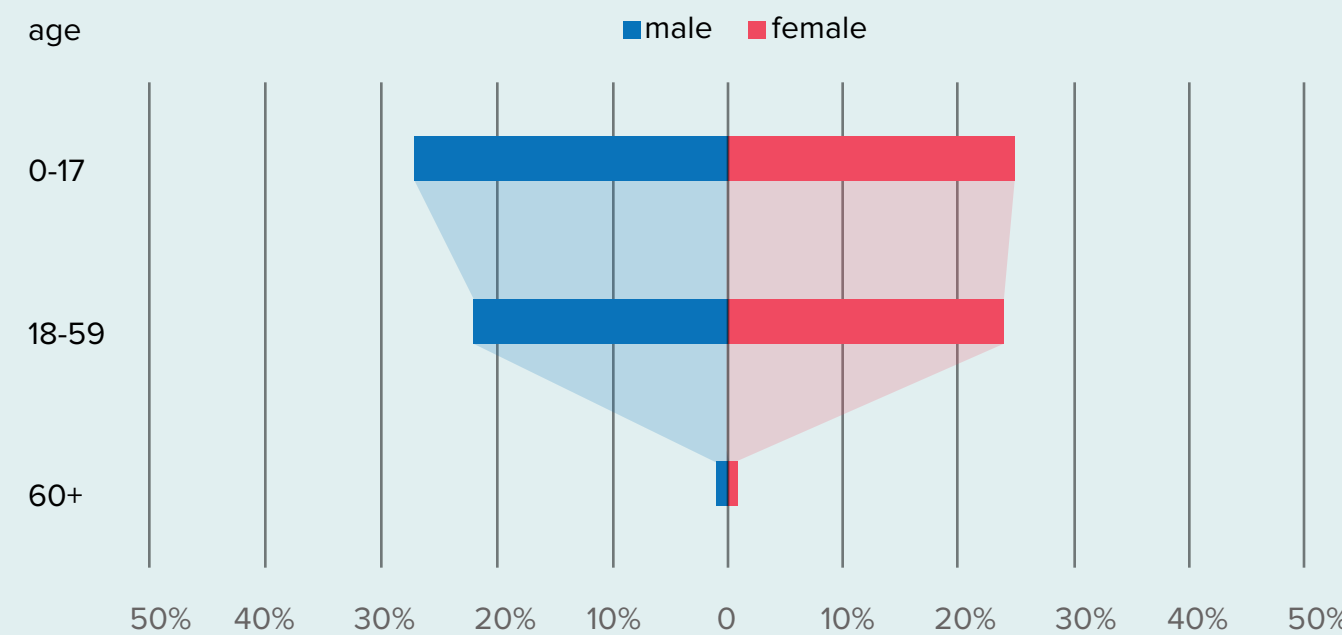


Resettlement in Previous Years
