GAPS AND CHALLENGES FOR IM



1

Refugees and LPAs lack information on refugee response and **services available** (example, medical services for women, legal status of refugees, etc.)

2

Regions and rural areas receive less information. Language capacities create **barriers**

3

Discontent and anxiety in **hosting communities**

4

Scope and the way the working groups work **is not entirely clear to local actors**

5

Refugees are perceived as **victims** and not agents of change

How can we **better channel information** from WG to CSOs, LPAs and refugees?

Make additional effort to **translate** as much as possible to **Romanian**
