



### Overview

In 2022 (January - June) UNHCR and partners managed 2,543 new Gender based Violence (GBV) incidents from 13 refugee hosting districts in Uganda. The number of cases handled represent 51 per cent of the annual target of 5,000. Psychosocial/ emotional abuse was reported highest at 31 per cent, followed by physical assault at 24 per cent, and rape at 22 per cent. Incidents of forced/early marriages perpetrated by family, especially among the South Sudanese population, remain of concern. The GBV partners are monitoring practices at the border, to prevent and mitigate the practice.

GBV client satisfaction surveys were computed and there was a significant increase from 91 in quarter one to 264 in quarter two. This is because the sector provided a short training on the tool, reviewed it with GBV partners, provided technical support on administering and reporting via ActivityInfo resulting in the increased reporting. The satisfaction results revealed that 87 per cent of persons at risk of GBV and survivors who received multi-sectoral interventions, were satisfied with the services offered.

The indicator on GBV awareness campaigns reached 27 per cent of the expected target of 560,000. The reporting is still low and believed not to be reflective of what is on ground. RRP partners have been guided to look through the sector logframe with reporting outline/ description on what to report under the awareness indicator. In Q2, several trainings for partners and duty bearers were conducted reaching 68 per cent (2,753) of the expected targeted.

Challenges include inadequate resources for menstrual hygiene kits, few Mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) partners to address deep trauma, late reporting of cases arising from negative cultural beliefs, and limited livelihood assistance for teenage mothers.


