Agenda Point 1 Updates from sector leads Teodora Zafiu, Livelihoods and Inclusion Sector Coordination, UNDP teodora.zafiu@undp.org	<ul> <li>The participants were informed about the most important aspects that organizations should take into account for their project submission to the RRP 2023, based on the guidance received from the inter-agency coordination team.</li> <li>The participants were also presented with the conclusions of the workshop held with the working group on 12 October. The aim of the workshop was to identify the strategic direction and focus of the Livelihoods and Inclusion Working Group / define and agree the sector objectives, priorities, indicators, activities, and identify barriers to the socio-economic inclusion of refugees.</li> <li>The participants were also reminded/informed about the publication of the Moldova winterization plan, which includes a separate section on livelihoods and inclusion. The view of the sector is that in order to ensure that both refugees and host communities in Moldova are coping with the upcoming shocks and uncertainties, humanitarian actions need to be coupled with interventions geared towards resilience-building and particularly interventions focused on provision of livelihoods opportunities, transitioning towards socio-economic inclusion of refugees into national systems and maintaining social cohesion in host communities. This approach would respond to the Government's vision and plans to address the multiple crises affecting Moldova, where the refugee response needs have been anchored within a comprehensive strategy for resilience-building.</li> </ul>	N/A

• Twelve organizations completed the online form for the mapping and brief assessment of the organizations members of the Livelihoods and Inclusion Working Group. Eleven of these reported planning sector activities in 2023. Most of the planned activities relate to vocational training and skill development, support to entrepreneurship and business development, information campaigns about employment opportunities, and activities promoting social cohesion in host communities. This set of activities are followed by interventions related to promotion of labour formalization, working with the private sector to increase employment opportunities for refugees, and supporting LPAs to increase their capacities for addressing refugee needs and responding to crisis.
