

REGIONAL COVERAGE

UNHCR's Regional Bureau for the East and Horn of Africa and the Great Lakes Region (EHAGL) is located in Nairobi, Kenya and covers 11 operations: Burundi, Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Kenya,

Rwanda, Somalia, South Sudan, Sudan, Tanzania and Uganda. It currently manages 4 regional situations (Burundi, Ethiopia, Somalia and South Sudan).

The Bureau has accountability for strategic decision-making, regional prioritization, oversight of integrity issues, and quality assurance, and possesses the technical capacity to support country operations in a wide range of sectors such as education, child protection, economic inclusion and durable solutions.

666,735 refugees received at least one vaccine dose in the region.

12,808 confirmed COVID-19 cases among refugees in the EHAGL region since early 2020, and **165** deaths

All countries in the EHAGL region have ongoing vaccination campaigns although vaccine shortages continue to pose a challenge across the region.

TO DROUGHT RESPONSE

1.52 million priority populations targeted for assistance in Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia, including 943,000 IDPs and 576,000 refugees

\$ 42.6 million overall regional financial requirements, including \$22 million in Ethiopia, \$11.1 million in Kenya and \$9.5 million in Somalia
