


## Ecuador Operation

UNHCR Ecuador is grateful for the generous support provided by donors. Your contributions allowed us to stay and deliver, protecting the rights of people forced to flee.



We worked with 23 specialized partners, providing support with registration, helping with documentation, identifying people who might be at risk or may require specialized support, including vulnerable children and survivors of gender based violence. We delivered humanitarian assistance prioritizing cash transfers, to let people make their own choices, and we advocate and offer technical support to help improve and change policy and legal frameworks. We also enhanced livelihoods opportunities while working with host communities improving cohesion and pacific coexistence.





## Without Your Continuous Support

The regularization exercise shall be accompanied by important efforts to improve the local integration opportunities, which entails investing in livelihoods, socio-economic inclusion projects and community-based interventions with host communities. With current budget, UNHCR ability to provide specialized response will be impacted by insufficient funding.

Moreover, shortage of funds will prevent UNHCR from assisting forcibly displaced people with emergency multi-purpose cash. Individuals may live in substandard and undignified conditions without adequate access to food, medicines, shelter and housing, resulting in negative coping mechanisms and increased protection and public health risks.
