


### Context

In 2022, nearly 250,000 people of over 30 nationalities crossed through the perilous Darien jungle<sup>1</sup>, seeking protection and better life. After a drop in the trend in November (16,632), December registered a slight increase in the number of irregular entries (20,297)<sup>2</sup>, making 2022 a record year for crossings in Panamanian history<sup>3</sup>.

Of the 248,284 people recorded crossing irregularly in 2022, 61 per cent were Venezuelans (150,327), 12 per cent Ecuadorians (29,356), and 6 per cent Haitians (22,435). In December, Ecuadorians (7,821) and Haitians (5,502) crossing, surpassed Venezuelans (1,374). Indians and Afghans are also among the largest groups, registering nearly 800 and 600 people crossing in December, respectively<sup>4</sup>.

The latest UNHCR protection monitoring exercise<sup>5</sup> showed that four out of ten people interviewed left their country of origin or residence due to personal or family threats and violence, while 50 per cent fled due to fear of general insecurity and violence. Additionally, eight out of ten received information about the journey from friends and relatives, and an alarming 43 per cent reported being victims of robbery and fraud during the journey.

# **UNHCR's Response**

## PROTECTION

In December, UNHCR assisted over 850 vulnerable people in the Migratory Reception Centres (ERMs) and other reception points in Darien. Through a permanent presence and regular protection monitoring exercises, the Agency offers legal support to people with protection needs, referring individuals who require specialized assistance to relevant institutions.

Together with partner Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC), UNHCR continues to provide information on the asylum system in Panama at border areas, as well as legal assistance to asylum seekers with their refugee status application. Through partner HIAS, UNHCR provides Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS), and supports people in transit, in Darién and Chiriquí, on the risks of the route through informative sessions. Importantly, UNHCR is also providing 24-hour interpretation services to non-Spanish speakers, proven to be key to guaranteeing their access to basic services available at the ERMs.



#### **HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE**

In December, UNHCR and partner Panamanian Red Cross (CRP) provided primary health care to some 1,900 refugees and migrants (527 men, 441 women, and 931 children) at the ERMs of San Vicente and Lajas Blancas in Darién, as well as at Los Planes de Gualaca in Chiriquí. A total of 13 pregnant women received assistance.

To strengthen Communication with Communities (CwC), UNHCR conducted a data collection exercise to understand the information and communication needs of the people in transit. A total of 12 people from 8 different countries participated in the assessment, and 60 per cent of them indicated that information on the risks of the journey is their main topic of interest.

## **Key Achievements**

- In December, UNHCR and partner HIAS, reached out to over 1,800 people with information on the journey risks at the ERMs and reception points in Darién and Chiriquí.
  - UNHCR and partner Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC) provided information to 67 people on the asylum system in Panama, and 11 were assisted with their asylum application, including an elderly Venezuelan, a male Cuban and five other Venezuelan asylum seekers who are temporarily residing in Darien.
  - Since its launch in the last weeks of October, over 80 people have reached out to UNHCR through Chatbot asking for information on asylum applications, among other protection concerns.
  - UNHCR donated a total of 120 pairs of protective eyewear to CRP to support the WASH response in the ERMs. The Agency also handed over to this partner some 65 bags of clothing to be distributed to vulnerable people in Darién.
    - UNHCR conducted a training for 36 partner staff in Darien, on camp coordination (CCCM) and protection. Participants included the National Border Service (SENAFRONT), SNM, National Civil Protection System (SINAPROC), and six NGOs.

UNHCR and partner HIAS assisted over **550 people** with **mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS)** related to traumatic experiences crossing the jungle in the Migratory Reception Centres and other reception points in both Darién (116 people)
