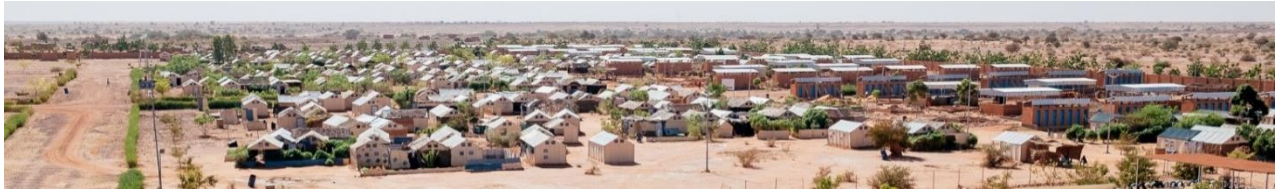


Hamdallaye Transit Centre



- As of 31 December 2022, a total of **4,063 persons have been evacuated to Niger** through the Emergency Transit Mechanism (ETM). A total of 636 are still in Niamey and Hamdallaye while 3,526 have already left Niger, and 38 departures are pending while 270 are awaiting interviews/decisions by third countries.
- Upon arrival to Niger, all evacuees receive assistance and services to meet their basic needs starting with a **medical screening, provision of hot meals, shelter, and non-food items**. The most vulnerable families or individuals, such as those with medical conditions stay in 5 dedicated **guest houses in Niamey**.



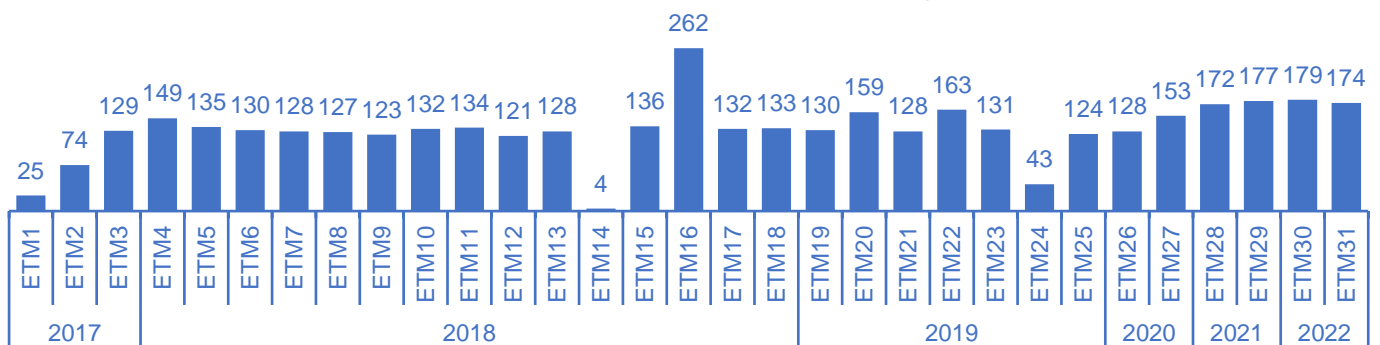
On 1 November, UNHCR Niger received 174 asylum seekers, who have been evacuated from Libya to Niger

- Access to **primary health care is** provided to all evacuees and host community members in Hamdallaye and in all the five guest houses in Niamey, where medical care is provided around the clock.
- As most of the persons are survivors of violence and torture, **psychological support and recreational activities** are paramount and are provided by specialists in Hamdallaye as well as at the guest houses.

- In addition, **language classes, livelihood activities and vocational training sessions** are offered. Assistance is provided thanks to cash-transfers.
- The construction of **80 permanent housing units** has been finalised in March 2022. Each house is composed of 2 rooms and 2 kitchen spaces that can accommodate up to 4 persons.
- As a means to promote **climate change action**, a solar mini grid, equipped with an energy storage system, fuels 115 streetlights for the public lighting and powers the water supply system.
- Lastly, all services are also open to the local host community ensuring **peaceful co-existence**.
