The Livelihoods and Inclusion Working Group (L&I WG) has been established to enable a coordinated approach among partners working on livelihoods and inclusion topics, articulate and complement each other's work, and allow for a coherent response. WG members are working together towards the operationalization of the humanitarian-development-peace nexus, with focus on medium-term actions to increase the capacities of refugees and host communities to cope with crisis context.

Work Plan Objectives:

- 1. Strengthen coordination and collaboration among WG partners, and with other WGs, sub-WGs (SWGs) and Task Forces (TFs), at national, local, and regional levels for more effective and sustainable interventions, avoiding duplications of efforts and maximizing results.
- 2. Ensure evidence-based quality interventions by the WG members, which consider the differentiated needs of women, young people, people with disabilities, roma, and other vulnerable categories of beneficiaries.
- 3. Strengthen support of key stakeholders (i.e. donor partners, Gov. institutions, private sector partners, civil society, etc.) for the socio-economic inclusion of refugees in Moldova, achievement of sector objectives, and contribution to the human-development-peace (HDP) nexus.
