















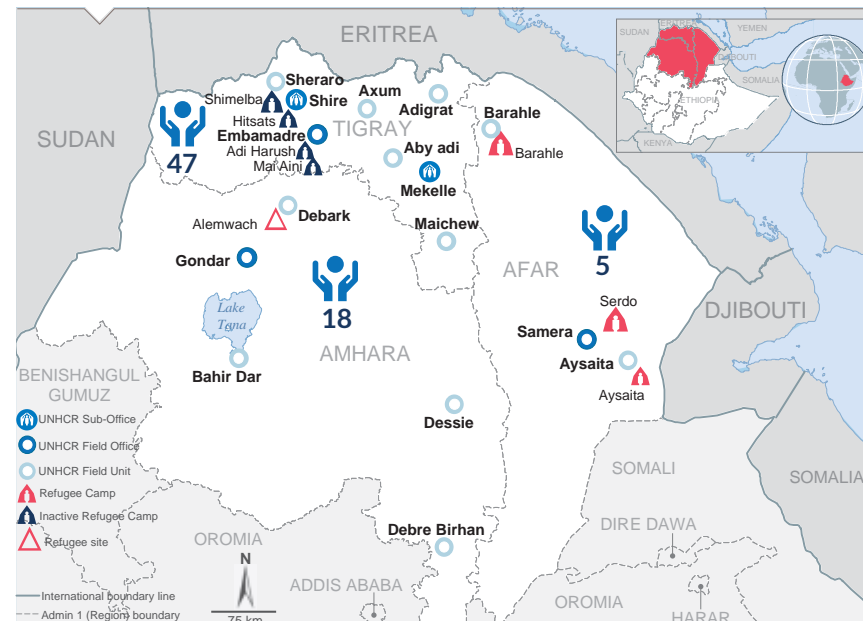


ACHIEVEMENTS

-  **2.36M** Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) benefitted from UNHCR protection and solution interventions in Northern Ethiopia
-  **691,661** IDPs received UNHCR core relief items (CRIs) kits (138,332 families)
-  **49,819** voluntary IDP returns facilitated by UNHCR and regional authorities
-  **153,780** women and girls received dignity kits
-  **53,485** IDPs benefitted from UNHCR emergency shelter kits (10,697 families)
-  **38,670** IDPs relocated to selected IDP sites
-  **7,467** IDPs received legal assistance and counseling
-  **21,532** persons with specific needs identified and supported
-  **746,205** IDPs assisted in UNHCR managed sites (149,241 families)
-  **118,871** IDPs reached with awareness raising sessions on GBV prevention, mitigation and response
-  **86,954** IDPs & IDP returnees received counselling services
-  **7,069** IDPs referred to adequate services in 70 Protection Desks
-  **39,129** IDPs & IDP returnees received cash assistance
-  **112,782** IDPs received solar lamps (22,556 families)
-  **15,318** IDPs received Mental Health and Psychosocial Services (MHPSS) through protection desks and Child Friendly Spaces (CFSs)
