

WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the total number of IDPs surpassed 400,000 this week, with 12,100 newly displaced people (for a total 409,400 IDPs).

In Tanintharyi Region, 9,800 IDPs were displaced from at least six villages in Launglon Township due to conflict and use of artillery and heavy weapons in early March.

In Shan State (South), 2,000 IDPs from Pinlaung Township were displaced to Pekon and Pinlaung Townships due to intense fighting and shelling on the border between the townships.

In Kayah State, 420 IDPs from Demoso Township were displaced to Loikaw Township due to intense fighting and indiscriminate shelling between 8 - 11 March.

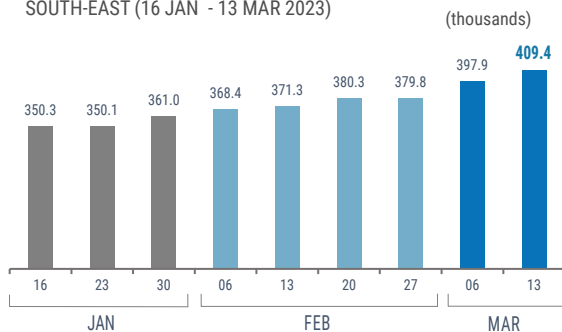
In Bago Region (East), 90 IDPs were verified in Taungoo town, Taungoo Township following January displacement due to insecurity, conflict, and heavy shelling.

Similarly, in Kayin State, 80 IDPs were verified in Kyarinseikgyi Township following January displacement due to conflict, while another 190 IDPs returned to places of origin, among whom 65 returned to Hpa-An and 125 returned to areas within Kyarinseikgyi Township.

In Mon State, about 90 IDPs from Mawlamyine Township returned to areas of origin within the township.

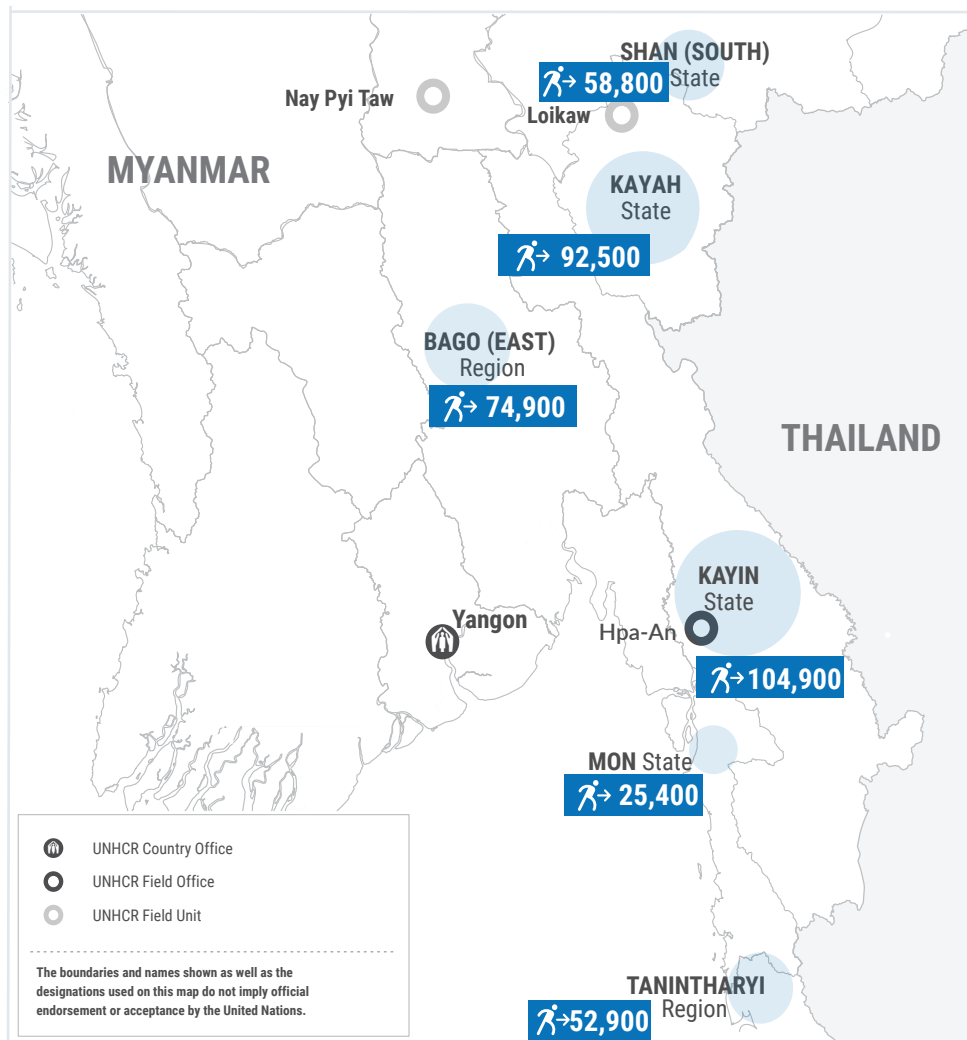
SOUTH-EAST (16 JAN - 13 MAR 2023)
