**Outcome 1-** Strengthen municipalities, national and local institutions' ability to alleviate resource pressure, reduce resentment, and build peace.

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**OUTPUT 1.1: Increased Services based on participatory processes delivered at the municipal level**

# of municipalities receiving Community Support or Basic Service Projects:

- 19 municipalities vs. an annual target of 275.
- Including 27 projects (4 in BML).
- 5.3 M USD cost.

**OUTPUT 1.2: Integrated solid waste management services improved to reduce social tensions**

# of municipalities implementing/using integrated solid waste management systems & approaches:

- 15 municipalities.
- Including 35 SWM projects (4 in BML).
- 1 M USD cost.
- Including the collection & sorting of 147 tons of solid waste.

## **Outcome 1-** Strengthen municipalities, national and local institutions' ability to alleviate resource pressure, reduce resentment, and build peace.

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### **Output 1.3 – National institutions have strengthened capacity to provide operational support and guidance to local crisis response.**

- **8 Governors' offices were supported** with equipment & capacity building, under DRM & other functions.
- **4 officers were seconded** at 4 Governors' offices (Beqaa, North, Akkar & **Mount Lebanon**), to support under DRM & Cholera response from Jan to June 2023.
- **3 UoMs in Mount Lebanon were supported under DRM**, with the provision of firefighting trainings, equipment, and trucks.

**Outcome 1-** Strengthen municipalities, national and local institutions' ability to alleviate resource pressure, reduce resentment, and build peace.

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**Output 1.4: Municipal police capacity to ensure community security strengthened**

# Municipalities directly supported to implement of the municipal police (MP) strategic reform framework:

- 78 municipalities supported with capacity building, management tools, & engagement with communities.
- 69% agree that displaced Syrians are contributing to more crimes (theft) & violence (Ark).

## Outcome 2- Strengthen municipal and local community capacity to foster dialogue and address sources of tensions

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### Output 2.1: Capacity development support provided to municipalities and local actors for dialogue and conflict prevention

#### Conflict mitigation mechanisms:

- 29 one-off community events e.g., festivals, sports competitions, celebrations, etc.
- These events included 2,864 participants & community representatives (2,524 Lebanese & 340 Syrian) mainly in Beirut & Mount Lebanon (1,847 in BML).
- New conflict mitigation mechanisms are under construction and should be reported starting Q2 2023.

## **Outcome 2-** Strengthen municipal and local community capacity to foster dialogue and address sources of tensions

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### **Output 2.2-** Youth enabled to positively engage and participate in their communities.

# Youth empowerment initiatives including trainings (life skills etc.):

- 242 youth initiatives (152 peacebuilding clubs, etc.)

# Youth participating in empowerment initiatives:

- 11,262 youth including 2,705 in BML: 5,277 females & 5,985 males, including 8,000 Lebanese, 2,699 Syrian, 549 PRL & 15 PRS.

### **Output 2.3:** National, local, and social media engaged in defusing tensions.

# journalists, media students, local authorities, and individuals trained and/or engaged and sensitized on defusing tension:

- 45 (28 females & 17 males).

## Outcome 3- - Enhance the LCRP's capacities on tensions monitoring and conflict sensitivity

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### OUTPUT 3.1: LCRP partners have improved skills and practices for conflict sensitivity supported by tension monitoring & analysis.

- # LCRP partners staff trained on conflict sensitivity: 79 (52 females & 27 males). And 4 LCRP partner organizations were trained.
- # Published tension reports: 5 reports.
- Wave XV of the UNDP/ ARK Regular Perception Survey was issued: [Tension Monitoring Dashboard](#).







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

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
