

CONTEXT

Under the Emergency Shelter and Non-Food-Items (ES/NFI) Cluster, UNHCR continues to respond to the shelter and basic core relief item needs of Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in Northern Ethiopia and other parts of the country. ES/NFI support is being provided to the displaced population affected by conflict and drought, with special emphasis on the needs of women, children, people with disabilities and the most vulnerable or at risk.

UNHCR response ranges from emergency relief to IDPs who are residing in temporary accommodation centers, within the host communities and in formal sites to promotion of durable solutions for families who have returned and those that have relocated.

From January to March 2023, UNHCR has reached 266,995 persons with ES/NFI assistance, representing 46% of the total of 579,200 people reached by the ES/NFI cluster in Ethiopia.








TYPE OF BENEFICIARY REACHED




RESPONSE TREND




