

Uganda Refugee Response Plan (RRP) 2022-2023

January - March 2023

Overview

The sector's main objective is to ensure full integration of comprehensive primary health care services for refugees into national and local government systems, in line with the Health Sector Integrated Refugee Response Plan (2019-2024), launched in January 2019.

Achievements

The under 5 mortality rate was low at 0.16 compared to the standard of less than 1.5 deaths per 1,000 population. This achievement is attributed to the many interventions that have been implemented to reduce malaria burden such as indoor residual spraying, mosquito nets distribution and early diagnosis and treatment of malaria patients in the community and at health facilities. Health facility delivery rate by skilled health worker stood at 96% up above the target of 95%. This is because of continuous capacity building of the health workers and availability of referral services both in the communities using tricycle ambulances and at health facilities to refer mothers to secondary and tertiary facilities for specialized care and treatment.

There was a reduction in consultations/Clinician/day across the operation, but this was more pronounced in the West Nile region or among the locations hosting refugees from South Sudan. This is no coincidence as these are the same locations that conducted malaria reduction

Challenges and key priorities

Only 85% of the health facilities have been accredited and integrated into national systems. This is because some of the facilities are still either temporary on semi-permanent and cannot meet the requirement for accreditation by the Ministry of Health. There is a need to upgrade the facilities, starting with infrastructure development.




