

WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs rose sharply from 459,800 from last week to 467,800 this week.

In Kayah State, 370 IDPs from Hpasawng town were displaced again to Loikaw town due to intensified fighting, airstrikes, and shelling on 21 June. However, about 110 IDPs returned to Demoso Township to carry out farming activities.

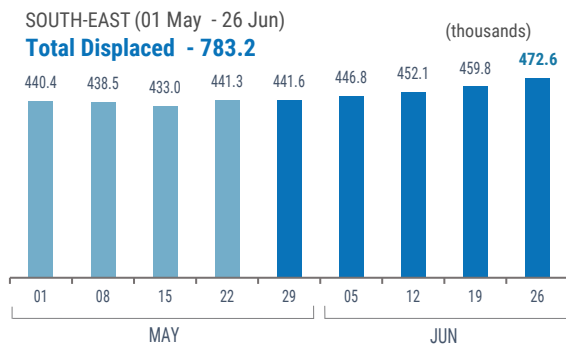
In Kayin State, due to fighting near their villages, about 60 people from Kawkareik Township and 130 from Kyainseikgyi Township were displaced within the respective townships. Returns of about 250 IDPs was recorded in Myawaddy Township.

In Tanintharyi Region, 8,300 people from at least eight villages in Thayetchaung Township were displaced within the same township due to the intensified clashes that broke out near their villages. However, 50 IDPs returned to their place of origin within Thayetchaung Township on 11 June.

In Shan State (South), 40 IDPs who had been displaced to Hsihseng and Ngaungshwe Townships returned to Loikaw town, Kayah State, so that their children can attend school.

Cross border movements took place between 14 and 27 June, where about 4,800 people from Mese Township in Kayah State were displaced to Khun Yuam district in Mae Hong Son, Thailand, following intensified fighting, including airstrikes, shelling, and shootings.

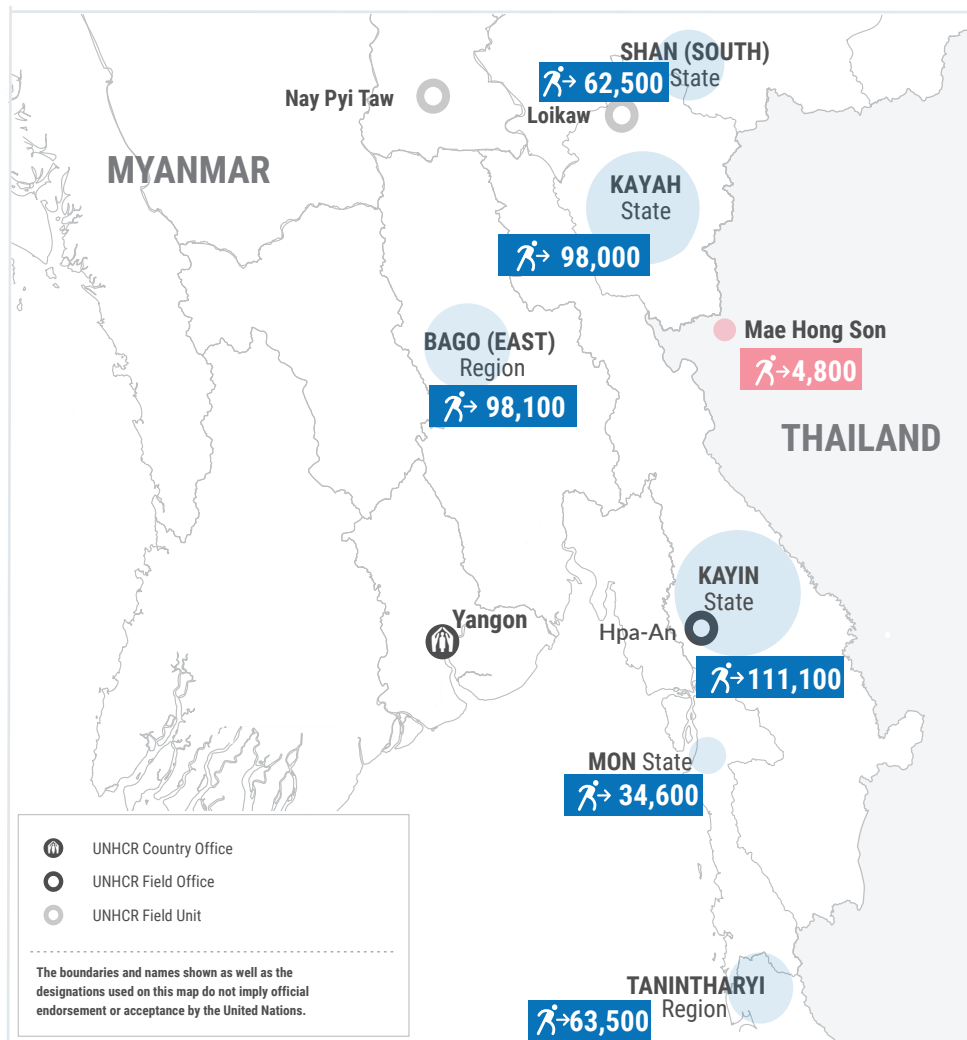

People who are estimated to be displaced by conflict in SE Myanmar (as of 26 Jun 2023).

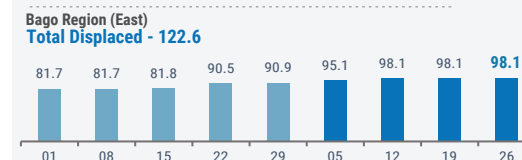
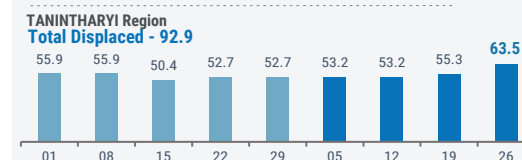
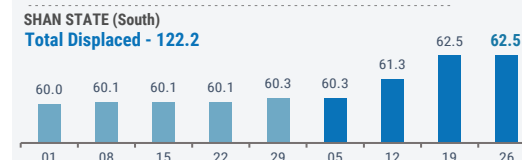
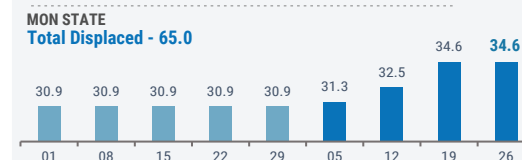
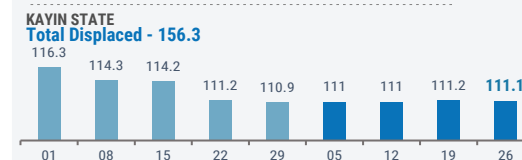
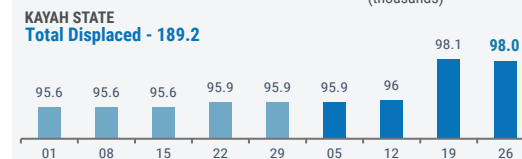
