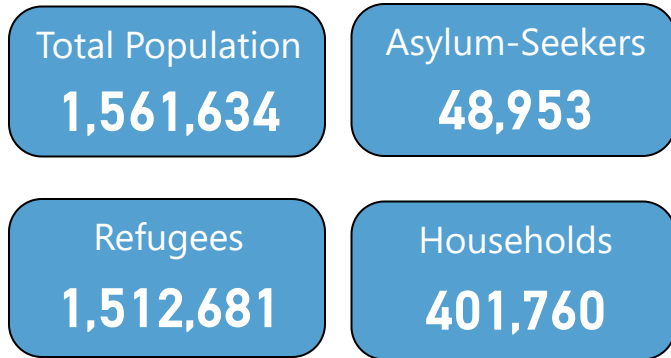




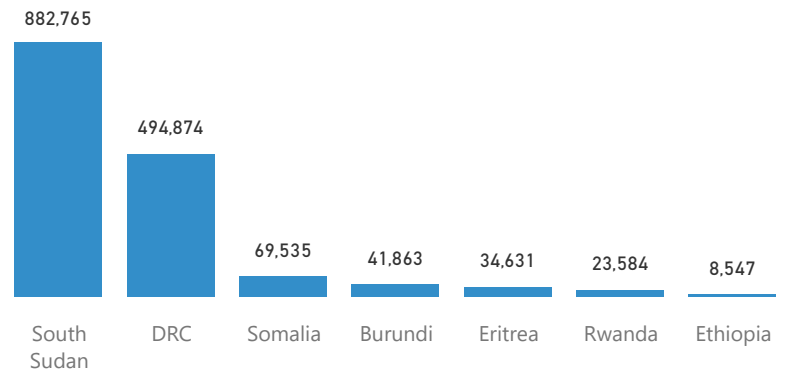

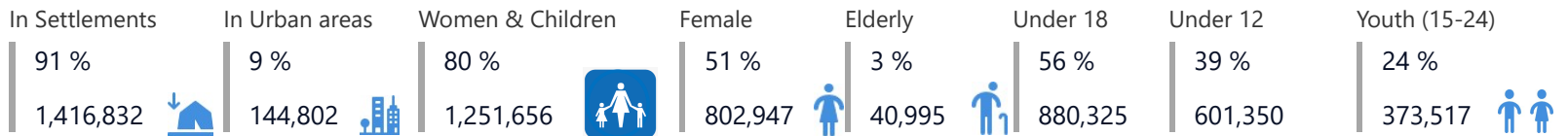

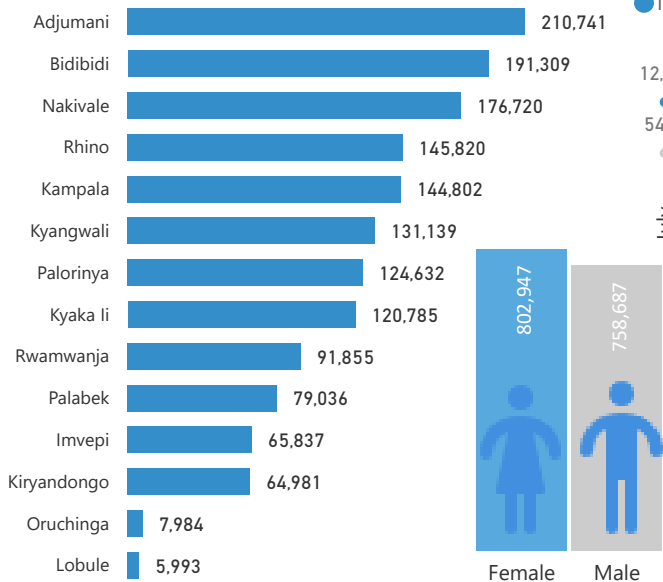
Top 7 Countries of Origin



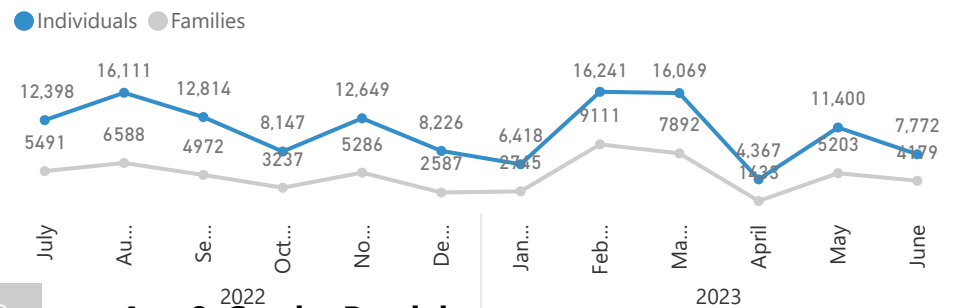
Population Distribution



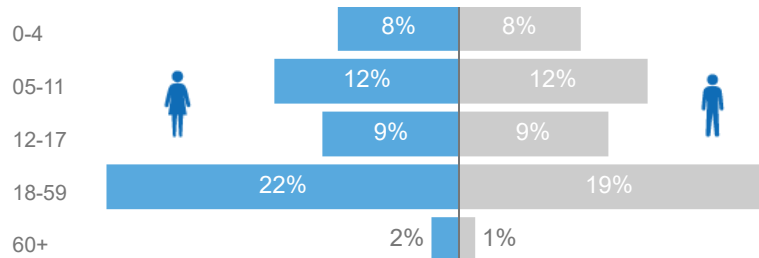
Population by Location

Since the start of 2023, more than 62,200 new arrivals and 10,436 new births have been registered across the settlements and urban locations in Uganda. Close to 41% of new arrivals originate from South Sudan, and 20% from the DR Congo. New arrivals are hosted mainly in Nakivale, Palabek, Palorinya, and Rhino settlements, but a small number have chosen to stay in urban Kampala. Verification grace period activities started this month in 5 settlements (Adjumani, Bidibidi, Palabek, Palorinya, and Rhino) for refugees/asylum-seekers who missed the 2021-2022 verification and individual profiling exercise. So far, 1,926 individuals have been verified. During the month, continuous registration activities recorded a decrease of 1,340 in the population for reasons of protracted absence/No Show, death, and spontaneous departure.

Key Facts:

- 97% of the people with and for who we work in Uganda are refugees.
- 91% of refugees and asylum-seekers reside in settlements.
- Women and Children constitute 80% of the total population we serve in Uganda.
- Women and Girls make up 51% of all refugees and asylum-seekers in the country.
- The elderly (60 years and above) make up 3% of the population.
- 24% of the population are youths (between 15 and 24 years).
- Close to 97% of refugees and asylum-seekers in settlements received monthly cash/food assistance.

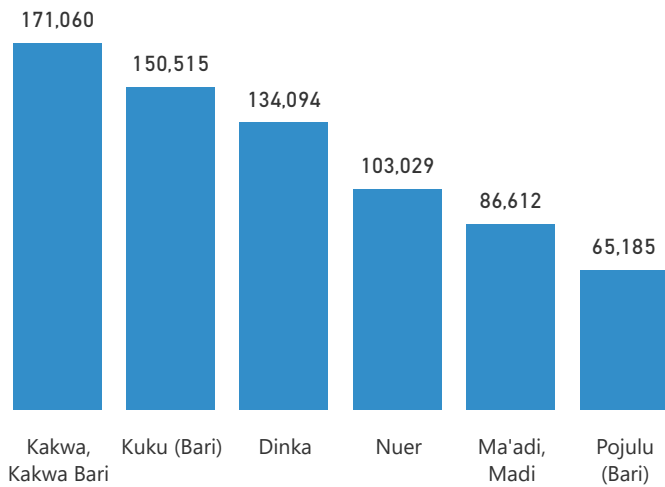

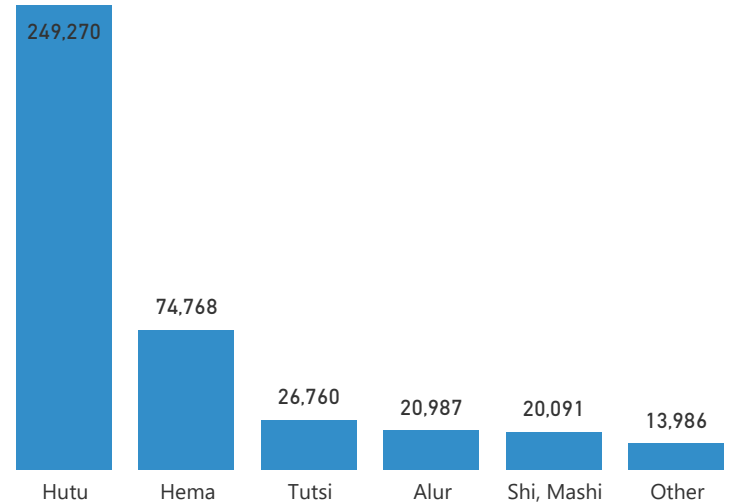

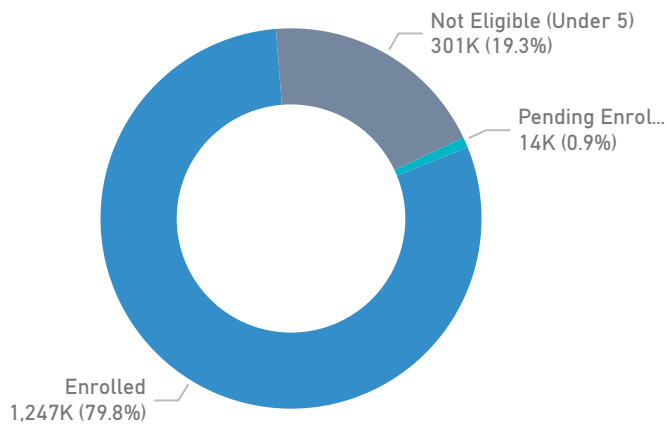
Top 6 South Sudanese Ethnicities



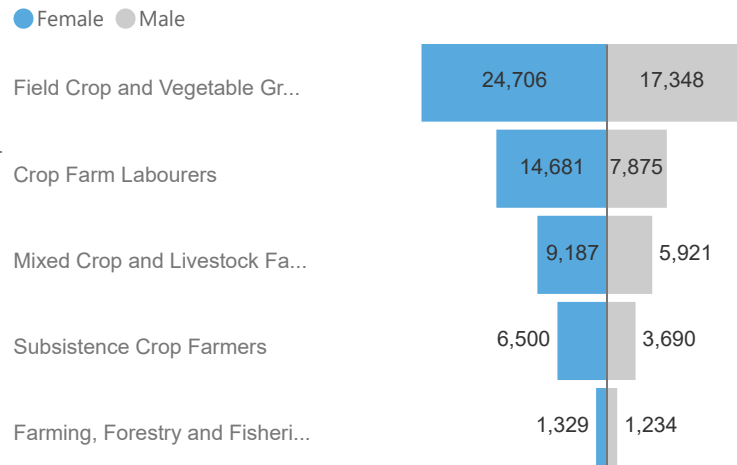
Top 6 Congolese Ethnicities



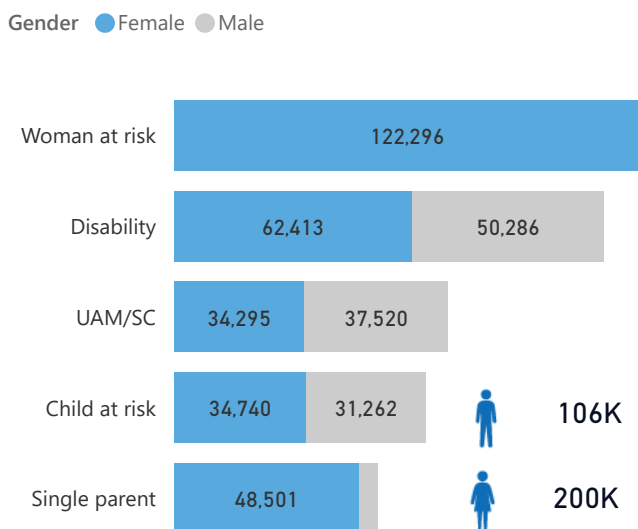
Biometric Enrolment
