KEY ACTIVITIES

UNHR in collaboration with BRAC IED, BRAC University started facilitating of 2nd cohort of certified teachers training on pedagogy for additional 1500 teachers from a range of partners of education sector. During the reporting period 242 teachers completed two months long training on pedagogy which bring cumulative of 2,743 teachers that include 2,501 teachers who completed training in 2022. Additionally, 124 teachers are currently participating in the training. In January 2023, UNHCR jointly with Bard college and BRAC University held a certificate award ceremony for 75 Master trainers who completed certified mentorship training in 2022. The ARRRC with Camp in Charge (CiCs) as well as the Government UNO (Upazilla Nirbahi Officer)- of Ukhiya Upazilla officiated the award events in Kutupalong and Ukhiya respectively.



MP4 piloting



On 20th February 2023, UNHCR education unit through its partner CODEC started the piloting of using MP4 in the classroom targeting of 200 children (50% girls) of Myanmar Curriculum Grade 1 at camp 1E and 2W. The piloting program was inaugurated by CiC's of Camp 1E and 2W. As of present the pilot has successfully contributed to improved language skills and pronunciation of Myanmar language for both teachers and learners.

UNHCR education support

UNHCR reached 15.3% of the overall refugee school-age population. In April 2023, Cumulatively, 70,207 refugees aged between 3-24 years were enrolled in UNHCR-supported education programs in early childhood development (ECD), pre-primary, primary, secondary, youth and adolescent education programs through operating 1752 Learning facilities including 1235 Community-Based Learning Facilities. UNHCR provided support and incentives for 1,751 teachers/facilitators (75% are refugees) and has supported the establishment of 639 community education support groups (CESG) with 3,737 total members.






