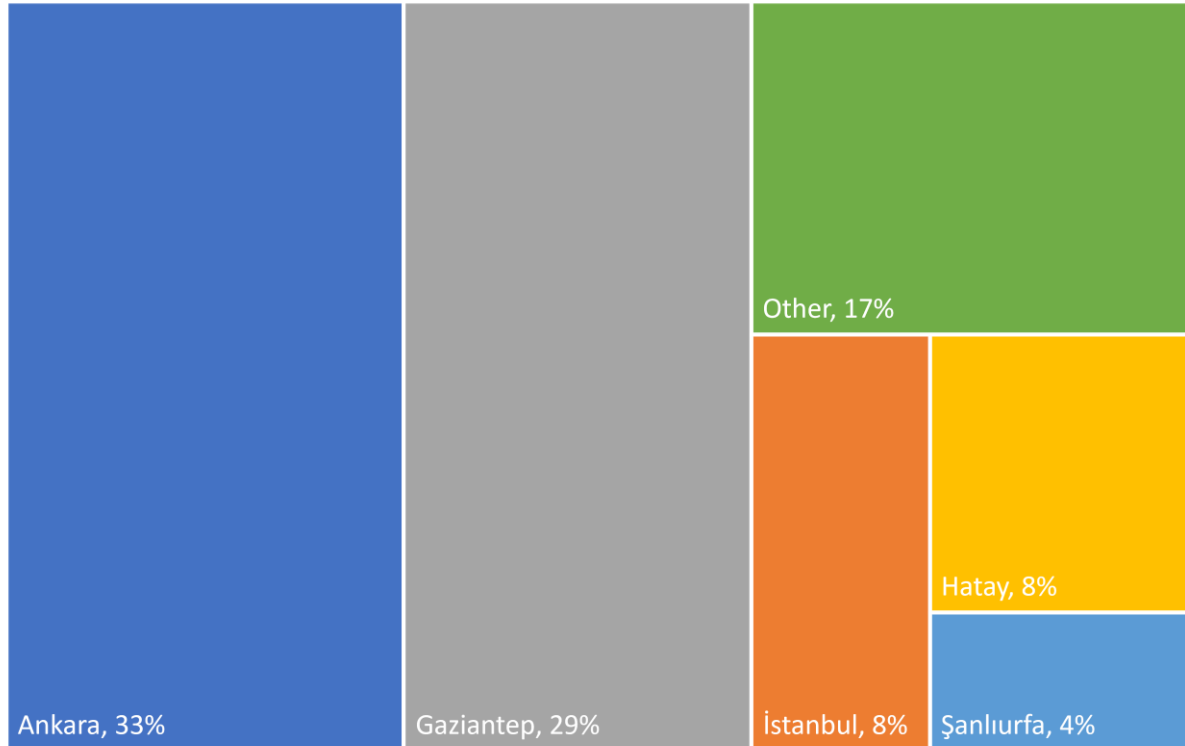

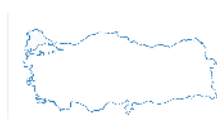

Work status	Not working as a civil servant, public worker, notary or mukhtar and not having someone in the household like this	Prerequisite
Work status	Not being someone working abroad and not having someone in the household like this	Prerequisite
Household composition	Families with children	Eligibility Criteria
Household composition	Single female headed households	Eligibility Criteria
Household composition	Individuals over 65 years old, households having someone like this	Eligibility Criteria
Household composition	Women who lost their spouses under their last civil marriage and not being remarried	Eligibility Criteria
Household composition	Pregnant and lactating women	Eligibility Criteria

Endorse MPCA Guidance – Advised Transfer Amount

CBI TWG recommends the below two options as the transfer values for the MPCA:

- (1) 2-monthly transfers of monthly payments of maximum 3000 TRY per household (750 TRY per person) or;
- (2) One transfer of maximum 6000 TRY per households (1500 TRY per person).

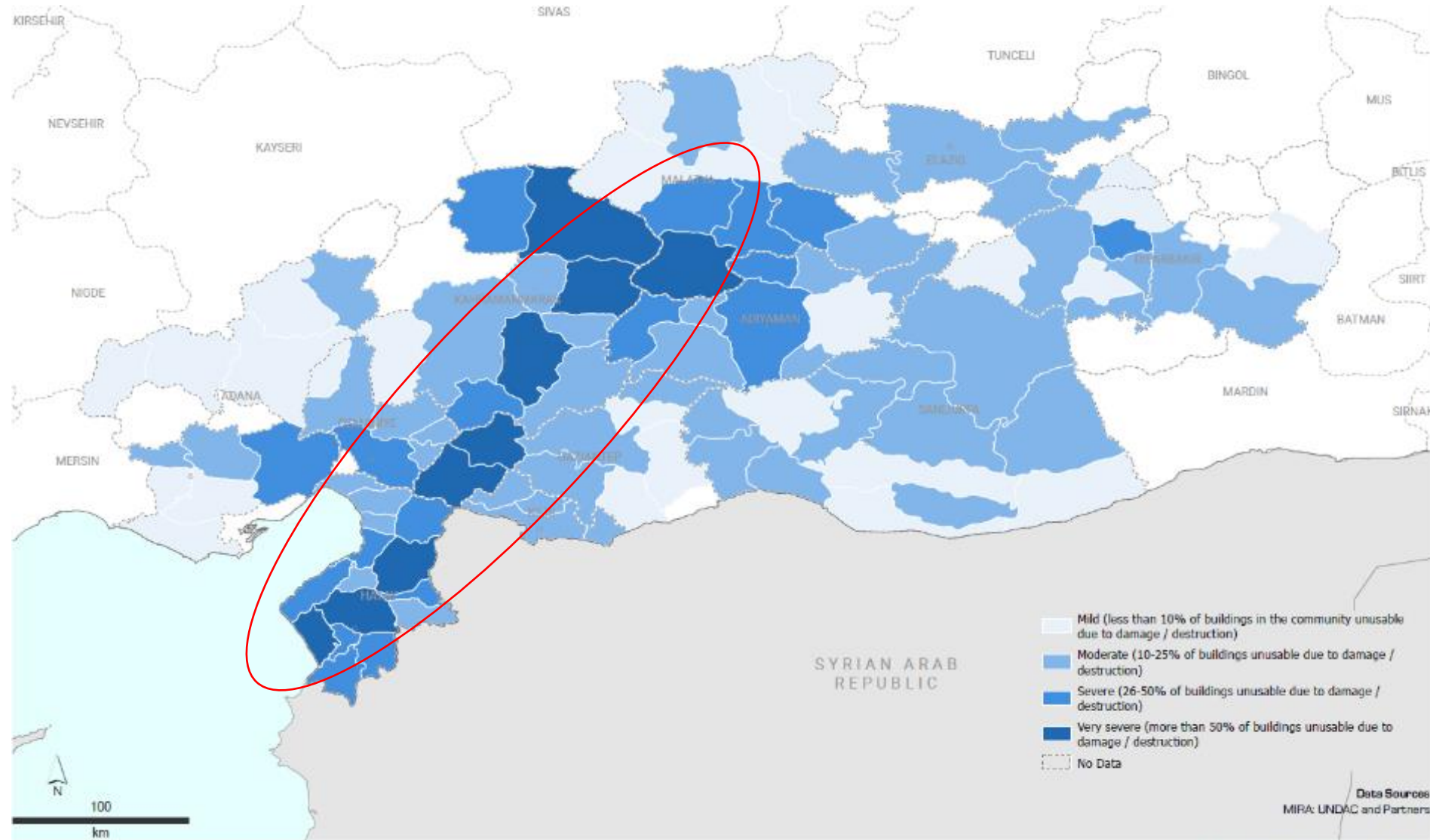
- Early Recovery & FSL & CBI TWG : Cash for Work

Joint Market Assessment

- **70 percent needed information immediately.**
- Availability of Markets
- Availability of ATMs/Banks (FSP): mostly covered
- Beneficiary experience:
 - Access of different groups to goods (age, gender, disability, nationality)
 - Preference of transfer modality (cash, voucher, cards etc)
 - Prices: We do not know about increase/decrease trends

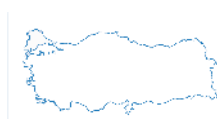
