<b>Coordination updates (Updates from the field)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Azraq camp:</b> The Joint PWG &amp; CP-GBV SWG – Azraq meeting conducted on 19 April 2023; topics discussed included: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– World Refugee Day 20 June.</li> <li>– Child marriage prevention and response activities mapping.</li> <li>– EJC Updates (TdH &amp; NHF).- Agency Updates.</li> <li>– Also, GBV safe referral and PSEA training sessions will take place in May 2023 targeting national staff and IBVs in Azraq camp and Azraq town.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Zaatari:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The SWG in Zaatari Finalized the ToRs, work plan and coordination tools for this year.</li> <li>- In the second quarter of 2023, they will focus on training plan for new staff and volunteers working with partners, the training will cover “GBV safe referral and PSEA”.</li> <li>- As part of the Child marriage strategy, working agencies in the camp will continue to work on prevention activities on CM.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The SWG in Zaatari meeting will be held on 1<sup>st</sup> of May.</li> <li>- Cooperation between child protection and GBV service providers, specifically on “sexual harassment” component is taking place. The target groups will be adolescents and parents on awareness for dealing with mentioned component.</li> <li>- GBV services will be introduced by LHF in Zaatari Camp during May; providing case management services.</li> <li>- UN Women will expand their services and integration programs, including interventions targeting men and boys.</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Mafrq:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- CP/GBVWG monthly meeting will be conducted on 26th of April. The meeting will cover various topics, including “updates from partners, Child marriage and CP GBV Referral pathways”.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Irbid:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- On 12th of April, Irbid CP GBV SWG was conducted, 14 participants representing 19 organizations attended the meeting, the members shared updates on the projects and activities.</li> <li>- GBV Irbid unit conducted GBV safe referral and PSEA refresher session, it has targeted UNHCR Irbid staff. The presentation covered below topics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Area’s coverage of Clinical management of rape (CMR) - Mafraq (Zaatari), Irbid, Madaba, Zarqa (Azraq camp and Zarqa city), Karak, Amma (Sweileh, Jabal AlHussein, Qweismeh, AlAshrafyeh - MoH AlBashir Hospital). <p><b>Best Practice sharing -by JOHUD</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- JOHUD GBV focalpoint shared a presentation about JOHUD Best practice to implement GBV case management within JOHUD (location, preparations, capacity building, Partnership and Coordination, challenges).</li> <li>- JOHUD established a child protection and gender-based violence program as one of the protection and inclusion pillar programs in 2021.</li> <li>- JOHUD prioritizes priority building strong relationships with local authorities, health care providers, FPD, MOSD, NCFA, and other service providers to ensure a coordinated response to GBV.</li> <li>- Providing a variety of services within JOHUDs programs and projects related to (Livelihood, PWDs, Elderly, awareness campaigns and advocacy and cash assistance for GBV survivors.</li> </ul> <p>The strategic pillars were divided into:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Protection and Inclusion</li> <li>2. Governance and learning</li> <li>3.
