OVERVIEW

The ongoing impacts of the catastrophic drought suffered by the Horn of Africa 2020-2023 continue to severely affect millions of refugees, internally displaced persons (IDPs) and their host communities in Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia. This dashboard provides a summary of new internal and cross-border displacements from and into drought-affected areas, as conflict, insecurity and environmental elements continue to displace communities across the region. It also presents the pre-existing refugee populations hosted in drought-affected areas.


