## WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs slightly increased from 532,200 last week to 542,200 this week.

In Bago (East), due to increased fighting, 2,004 IDPs from Kyaukkyi Township were displaced within the same Township.

In Kayah State, during the last week of October 2023, 211 IDPs have returned to their places of origin in Demoso and Thandaunggyi Townships.

In Kayin State, as a result of increased fighting, 456 IDPs from Kawkareik Township, 452 IDPs from Thandaunggyi Township and 171 IDPs from Kyainseikgyi Township were displaced within their respective townships. Additionally, 217 IDPs from Kawkareik Township were displaced to Hpa-An Township, among them, 71 IDPs were displaced as a secondary displacement.


In Tanintharyi Region, 148 IDPs from Dawei and 7,505 IDPs from Yebyu Township were displaced within their Townships due to indiscriminate shelling of heavy weapons. However, 748 IDPs have returned to their places of origin in Yebyu Township.
