



# Aegean Islands Weekly Snapshot

## Sea arrivals

This week, the Aegean islands saw 472 arrivals, a decrease from last week's 1,103. The average of the daily arrivals on the Aegean islands for this week is 67.






## Population in the CCACs

Currently, 16,153 refugees and migrants reside in the Closed Controlled Access Center(s).

Most of them are from Syria (34%), Afghanistan (31%) and State of Palestine (13%). Men account for 59% of the population, women for 18% and children for 24%.




## Population on the Islands

There are 17,009 refugees and migrants on the Aegean islands. Out of this total, 16,153 reside at the CCACs and 220 are hosted in other facilities. UNHCR estimates that there are also 636 self-accommodated in the islands.



## Departures

This week, 194 refugees and migrants departed from the Aegean islands to the mainland.



# Lesvos Weekly Snapshot


## Sea arrivals

The average of the daily arrivals on Lesvos for this week is 30.






## Population in the CCAC


Currently, 5,575 refugees and migrants reside in the Closed Controlled Access Center.

Most of them are from Afghanistan (71%), Eritrea (11%) and Syria (6%). Men account for 36% of the population, women for 26% and children for 38%.




## Population on the Island

There are 5,951 refugees and migrants on Lesvos. Out of this total, 5,575 reside at the CCAC and 157 are hosted in other facilities. UNHCR identified 219 self-accommodated refugees in the island up to this date.



# Chios Island Weekly Snapshot


## Sea arrivals

The average of the daily arrivals on Chios island for this week is 7.






## Population in the CCAC


Currently, 1,090 refugees and migrants reside in the Closed Controlled Access Center.

Most of them are from Somalia (31%), Syria (23%) and Afghanistan (17%). Men account for 49% of the population, women for 27% and children for 24%.




## Population on the Island




## Sea arrivals

The average of the daily arrivals on Samos island for this week is 11.







## Population on the Island




## Sea arrivals

The average of the daily arrivals on the Dodecanese islands for this week is 19.






## Population in Kos CCAC and Leros CCAC


Currently, 5,591 refugees and migrants reside in Kos CCAC and Leros CCAC.

Most of them are from Syria (54%), State of Palestine (20%) and Afghanistan (10%). Men account for 68% of the population, women for 13% and children for 19%.




## Population on the Dodecanese Islands

There are 5,915 refugees and migrants on the Dodecanese islands. Out of this total, 3,177 reside at the CCAC in Kos, and 2,414 at the CCAC Leros. In Kos, an estimated 240 people are self-accommodated and an additional 23 are hosted in other facilities, while in Leros, an estimated 50 people are self-accommodated, with an additional 11 being hosted in other facilities.
