

This document aims to explain the funding that UNHCR Colombia receives and its main donors for 2023. UNHCR receives contributions from donors at three levels:

TYPE OF CONTRIBUTIONS



1. Global level



2. Regional level (Americas)



3. Local level (Colombia)

Only the contributions received in Colombia can be referenced with exact amounts, while the rest are allocated flexibly based on resources raised at the regional level for Latin America by UNHCR's Regional Office for the Americas, located in Panama, and globally by UNHCR's Headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland.

Therefore, it is not possible to precisely relate the amount of funds executed by UNHCR Colombia from each donor contributing at the global and regional levels, as their flexible contributions are directed by the Headquarters to the operations that need them the most.

UNHCR receives contributions from 3 types of donors: the public sector (countries/governments), the private sector (companies) and the private sector funds and other agencies of the United Nation's system.

Here are UNHCR's top donors for 2023.

1) Globally, UNHCR's largest donor is the **United States**, followed by **Germany** and the **European Union**. In addition, other donors such as **Japan**, **Norway**, **Sweden**, **France**, individual donors from **Spain**, **Denmark** and the **Netherlands** are in the TOP 10.

Map 1: UNHCR's TOP 10 global donors in 2023



2) At the regional level, the main donors that contribute specifically to the situation of refugees and migrants from Venezuela (R4V) in Colombia are the United States, Spain, Italy, private donors from the United States, the European Union, Canada, as well as private donors from: Switzerland, Sweden, Spain and Colombia.


Map 2: Top donors of the Venezuela Situation (R4V) specific to UNHCR Colombia in 2023



We also recognize, at the regional level, the flexible contributions of donors funding the response to the refugee and migrant situation (R4V) regionally in the Americas: Ireland, Canada, Norway, the Netherlands, private donors from Germany, Luxembourg, Cyprus, and other private donors.

3) In Colombia, UNHCR's largest donor is the United States, followed by Spain, Italy, the European Union, private donors from the United States, Canada, Switzerland, the United Nations Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF), Sweden and private donors from Switzerland.

UNHCR Colombia receives most of its resources from the public sector (93%), i.e. from governments of other countries. It also receives resources from the private sector (5%) and, to a lesser extent, from other United Nations funds (2%).
