## New Funding Opportunities

**Title of the Call:** Supporting Children's Access and Retention in Education

**Deadline:** April 25th, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** International Development Research Centre (IDRC) and the Global Partnership for Education (GPE)

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Nationally/internationally registered or incorporated organizations based in low- or middle-income countries, including research institutions, universities, think tanks, network secretariats, associations, civil society organizations, non-profits, or the private sector.
- Applicants must have independent legal status, be able to contract, receive and administer funds, and direct project activities. Legal status will be verified if selected.
- Concept notes can be submitted by individual organizations or consortia of up to three organizations.
- Private-sector applicants must demonstrate how their resources contribute to the project.
- Specific criteria for single-country grants: Submitted by eligible national organizations in the country of focus.
- Specific criteria for multi-country grants: Submitted by organizations based in low- or middle-income countries.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- Applied research addressing challenges of children's access to and retention in education in emergency, fragile, and conflict-affected contexts.
- Projects should generate evidence to adapt and scale impactful approaches in these contexts, with a focus on gender equality, equity, and inclusion.
- Sub-themes include access/re-entry for out-of-school children, retention of at-risk learners, and teacher training and support for working with these children.



**Funding Details:**

- Two types of funding: Single-country grants (CAD 300,000–500,000) and multi-country grants (CAD 800,000–1,000,000).
- Projects should be completed within 24 months, including all research activities and final reporting.

**Title of the Call:** Women in the Digital Economy Fund (WiDEF) Grants for Closing the Gender Digital Divide

**Deadline:** May 6th, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** USAID

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Both local nonprofit and for-profit entities in countries where USAID operates.
- Entities must have or be able to adopt gender-based violence mitigation policies.
- Preference for women-led organizations and those with a record of supporting gender equality and marginalized populations.
- Must meet USAID Eligibility Requirements, including being a legal entity under the laws of a country receiving USAID assistance, having principal operations there, and being majority-owned and managed by citizens or permanent residents of these countries.
- Entities must possess or be obtaining a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and adhere to USAID's standard provisions.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- Projects aiming to close the gender digital divide, especially focusing on women and marginalized populations.
- Addressing barriers to digital inclusion, like access to affordable devices, internet, digital skills, and online safety.

**Funding Details:**

- Awards range from \$500,000 to \$1,500,000.
- Duration of projects is 18-24 months.

**Title of the Call:** “Democracy and Diversity – Can we transcend the divides?” Initiatives

**Deadline:** May 17th, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** World Forum for Democracy

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Open to any public or private organization worldwide.



**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- **Elections and Value Divides:** Addressing the impact of elections on societal divides and exploring inclusive electoral practices and ideas to overcome binary thinking in diverse societies.
- **Unraveling the Web of Disinformation:** Analyzing the mechanics of disinformation campaigns, their impact on democracy, and strategies to counteract them.
- **Citizen Engagement for Democratic Renewal:** Assessing the role of civil society in civic engagement and exploring new forms of citizens' engagement and decision-making.
- **Additional Initiative Examples:** Depolarizing elections, promoting unifying leadership, innovative policy-making methods, social media accountability, resilience against disinformation, anti-corruption efforts, empowering underrepresented groups, diverse approaches to opposition politics, media ownership diversity, AI in politics, education on disinformation, diversity management, and international partnerships for inclusive societies.

**Title of the Call:** Empower to Plan Small Grants Programme

**Deadline:** May 17th, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** Population Matters

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Must align with Population Matters' mission and vision, supporting human rights, women's empowerment, and global justice.
- Organizations must integrate two or more thematic areas specified under Empower to Plan.
- Applicants should be registered grassroots / non-profit / NGO / trust / civil society /community-based organizations in their operational country.
- Annual income between £5,000 and £250,000. Preference for organizations at the lower end of this range.
- Must have an internationally registered bank account and legal capability to receive funds from an international organization.
- Ability to provide annual and/or management accounts, ideally audited, upon request.
- Implementation or willingness to implement safeguarding, financial management, and anti-fraud/bribery/corruption policies.
- Desirable: Community-governed or led organizations, particularly those with limited access to larger donor funding.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- Collaboration with organizations enhancing lives of girls and women and protecting the environment.
- Projects incorporating sexual and reproductive health, gender justice, environmental justice, family planning, empowerment of youth/girls/women, environmental education, climate resilience/mitigation, and species/habitat conservation.
- Preference for projects adopting the Population/People, Health, and Environment (PHE) approach and those working with boys and men for gender equality.



**Funding Details:**

- Maximum grant per application: £7,000.
- Typical grant range: £4,000 to £6,000.
- Full grant amount provided at the funding period start.
- 3 grants awarded annually under this program.

**Title of the Call:** UNESCO Prize for Girls' and Women's Education

**Deadline:** May 24th, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** Government of the People's Republic of China, UNESCO

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Nominations are accepted from Governments of UNESCO Member States and Non-governmental organizations (NGOs) in official partnership with UNESCO.
- Eligible entities can nominate up to three individuals, institutions, or organizations demonstrating strong, innovative contributions to girls' and women's education.
- Note that self-nominations are not permitted.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- The Prize is dedicated to honoring exceptional and innovative efforts by individuals, institutions, and organizations in advancing girls' and women's education.
- It emphasizes projects that effectively improve and enhance the educational opportunities for girls and women, consequently improving the quality of their lives.

**Funding Details:**

- Total Funding: The Prize is awarded annually to two laureates, each receiving an award of US \$50,000 to support their continued work in the field of girls' and women's education.

**Title of the Call:** New Fund for Strengthening the Economic and Social Empowerment of Women in Vulnerable Situations

**Deadline:** May 31st, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** International Organization of Francophonie

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Civil society organizations (CSOs) such as NGOs, foundations, humanitarian associations, economic interest groups, cooperatives, private research institutes, and partners.
- Must be registered and recognized by the authorities of one of the 54 full member states of the OIF for more than two years.



- Demonstrated functional, transparent, and democratic governance.
- Annual financial capacities equal to or greater than the requested grant amount.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- Economic and social empowerment of women in vulnerable situations.
- Priority themes vary by region, focusing on women's inclusion in economic and social life, access to professional training, and development of income-generating activities.
- Particular attention to projects targeting employability and entrepreneurship of women.

**Funding Details:**

- Grants between 15,000 and 100,000 euros, not exceeding 80% of the total project cost.
- Grant paid in two installments: 80% upon signing, 20% upon submission of required documents.
- Operating costs limited to 20% of the total project cost.
- Budget allocation for visibility actions (5%-7%) and monitoring and evaluation (15%-20%).
- The Fund's Management Committee may adjust projects and grant amounts.

**Title of the Call:** TIAW – World of Difference Awards 2024

**Deadline:** June 28th, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** The International Alliance for Women (TIAW)

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Individual nominees: Women or Men from any sector.
- Organizational nominees: Include community groups, corporate entities, educational institutions, entrepreneurial ventures, non-profits/NGOs, public service/government bodies, and corporate organizations (excluding non-profits/NGOs).
- Special category for Young Leaders under the age of 25.
- Note: Self-nominations are not accepted.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- Award categories span various sectors including community, corporate, education, entrepreneurship, non-profit/NGO, public service/government, young leaders, and corporate organizations.

- Awards recognize individual and organizational achievements without specified funding.

## New Funding Opportunities for Academia

**Title of the Call:** Study of the U.S. Institutes Madeleine K. Albright Young Women Leaders Program



**Deadline:** May 6th, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- U.S. public and private academic and cultural institutions, exchange-of-persons programs, and other nonprofit organizations with 501(c)(3) status.
- Applicants must have a minimum of four years of experience in conducting international exchanges to be eligible for awards exceeding \$130,000 in ECA funding.
- Organizations must have a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and a valid registration on SAM.gov.
- Only one proposal per organization will be considered.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- **Civic Engagement:** Topics include active citizenship, civil rights, social justice, grassroots activism, political leadership, and volunteerism.
- **Economic Empowerment:** Focuses on the U.S. economic system, economic equality, financial access, entrepreneurship, and organizational development.
- **Environmental Issues:** Covers climate change, sustainable development, environmental justice, and public health impacts.
- **Public Policy:** Addresses women in public service, roles in policymaking, and diverse policy issues like education, public health, and technology.

- Total Funding: Approximately \$4,200,000 over three years.
- Number of Awards: 1

**Title of the Call:** FY 2024 Global Undergraduate Exchange Program (Global UGRAD)

**Deadline:** May 20th, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, Office of Academic Exchange Programs

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- U.S. public and private academic and cultural institutions, exchange-of-persons programs, and other nonprofit organizations with IRS 501(c)(3) status.
- Organizations with less than four years of experience in conducting international exchanges are ineligible due to ECA funding guidelines.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- Scholarships for non-degree study in the U.S. for undergraduates from specified global regions.
- Focus on cultural exchange, academic enrichment, community service, and professional development.



- Emphasis on mutual understanding between the U.S. and other nations.

- Total Funding: Approximately \$6,770,000 (subject to availability).

**Title of the Call:** Wellcome Early-Career Awards

**Deadline:** May 21st, 2024

**Funding Source/Donor:** Wellcome Trust

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Early-career researchers from any discipline who are prepared to establish their research identity.
- Applicants must have completed a PhD or an equivalent higher research degree, or have at least four years' equivalent research experience in disciplines where a PhD is not a customary requirement.
- Applicants must have postdoctoral experience, demonstrating proficiency in research methodology and project delivery.
- Applicants need to show independence in research, though training for new techniques and experimental approaches may be required.
- Sponsorship from an eligible host organization in the UK, Republic of Ireland, or a low- or middle-income country (excluding India and mainland China) is required. Host organizations can be higher education institutions, research institutes, non-academic healthcare organizations, or not-for-profit organizations.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- Projects that aim to shift understanding in human life, health, and wellbeing.
- Developing methodologies, conceptual frameworks, tools, or techniques beneficial to health-related research.

**Funding Details:**

- Funding includes the applicant's salary and up to £400,000 for research expenses.
- Additional funding may be requested for overseas allowances, overheads, and adjustment support.
- Duration is usually 5 years, but may vary for some disciplines or if held part-time.

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Organizations, teams, and individuals globally are eligible.
- Applicants should have contributed significantly to psychoanalysis and/or psychoanalytic principles in the last 10 years. Ongoing or proposed work is ineligible.
- Work applying psychoanalytic principles in various fields, including art, journalism, medicine, science, and social justice, is eligible.
- Previous non-winning applicants can reapply for completed work within the past 10 years.
- The Trust embraces diversity in applicants and does not discriminate based on race, color, religion, sex, gender identity, age, national origin, disability, marital status, or military status.
- Applicants from all theoretical orientations in psychoanalysis are welcome.

**Areas to be Covered/Thematic Focus:**

- The award recognizes outstanding contributions to psychoanalysis or psychoanalytic principles.
- Innovations in psychoanalytic treatment or theory.
- Application of psychoanalytic principles in various domains beyond traditional psychoanalysis.

- Cannot be academic institutions, specific programs within organizations, or university-based projects but may be affiliated with academic institutions if they have independent tax-exempt status and their own audited financials.

**Eligibility of Entities to Apply:**

- Must be a registered organization outside the Netherlands, not connected to the Dutch-Jewish community in Israel, and without activities in the Netherlands.
