

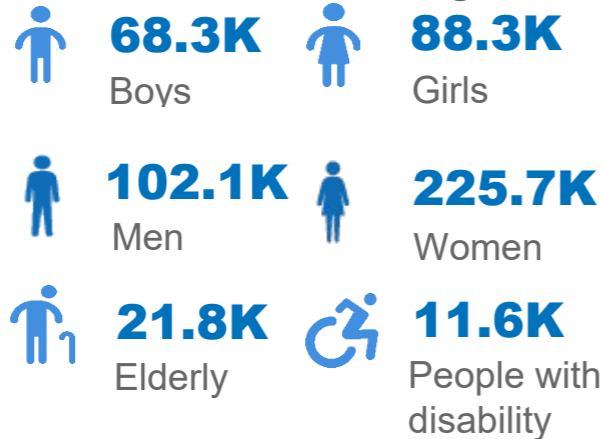

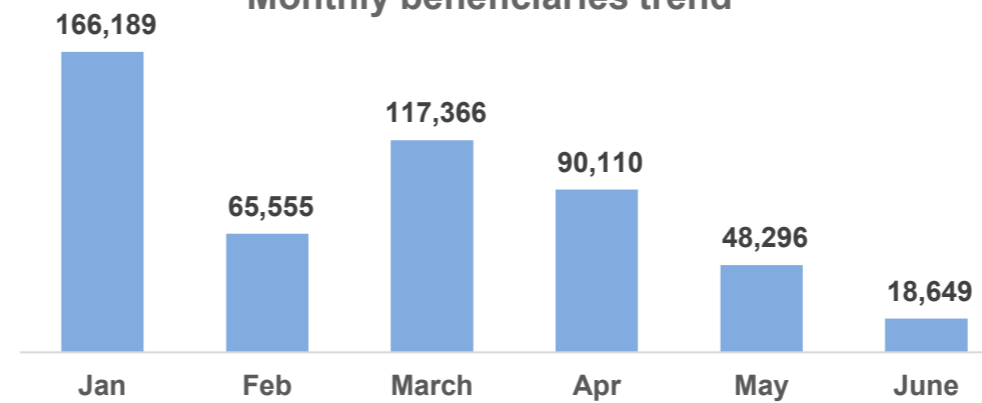

Monthly beneficiaries trend

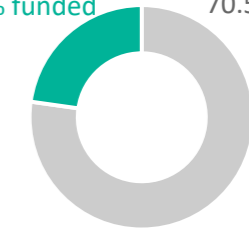


The June beneficiary reach data includes Protection, Housing, Land and Property, and Explosive Hazards Areas of Responsibility

Key Highlights

- Protection Cluster carried out in June a joint analysis session focusing on the Protection risks and operational recommendations for the district of Jowhar in Hirshabelle State. The joint analysis session counted with the participation of 30 delegates of the different UN agencies and protection partners. Once consolidated the analysis and recommendations, will be published and shared to all stakeholders.
- The Protection Cluster in collaboration with MROs conducted community consultations on PDAD Action 8: Community Participation & Engagement. The consultations targeted the Minorities, the elderly, people with disabilities and children (12 – 18 years) covering 13 districts across the country.

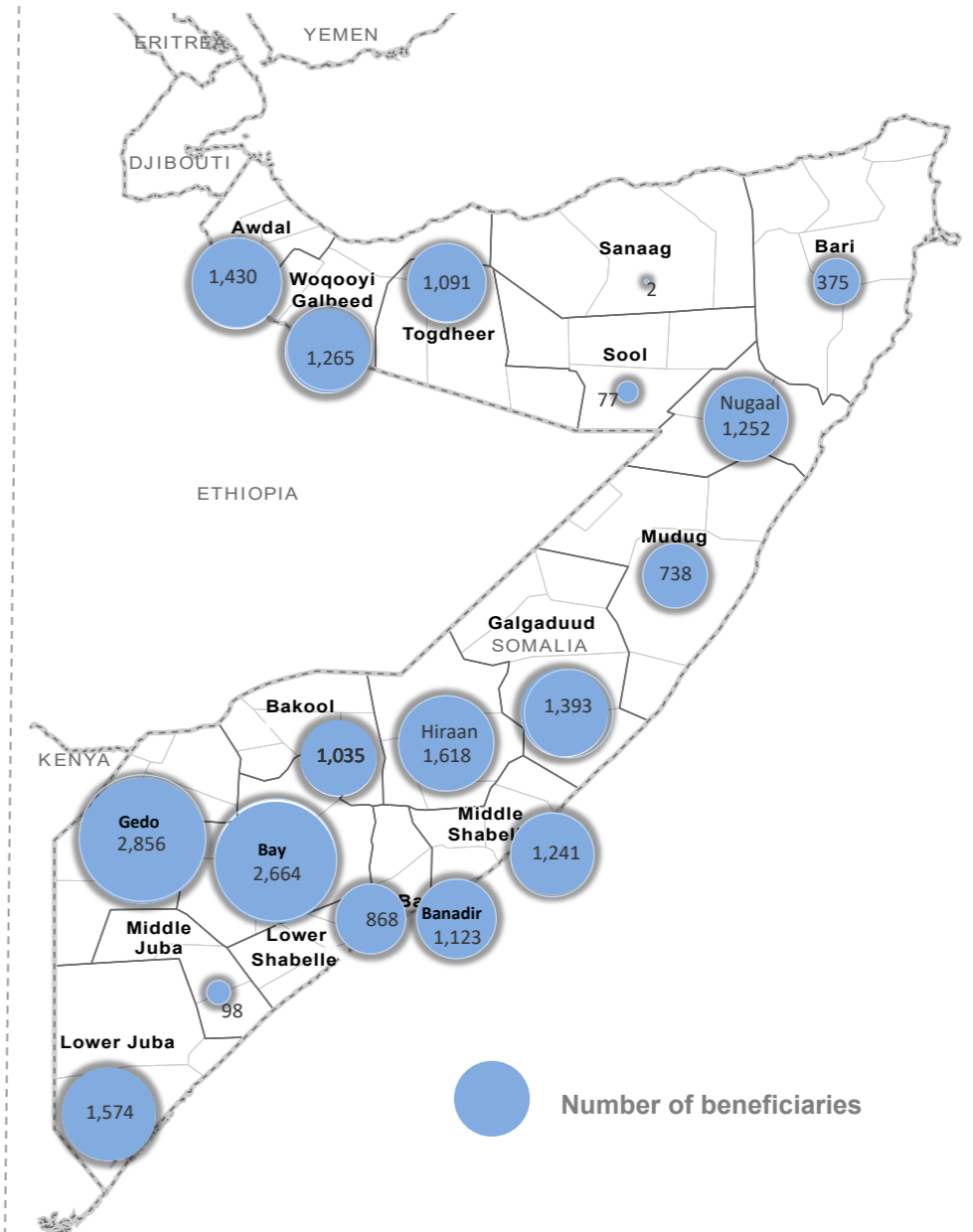
Response Overview

In June, the protection cluster reached 18,649 individuals through its response. Baydhaba (2,475) received the highest number of beneficiaries followed by Doolow (2,101), Belet Weyne (1,347) and Hargeysa districts (1,174).

Durable Solutions

- As an update to progress and next steps in the durable solutions action planning process for the Federal Government of Somalia, supported by UN RCO and ReDSS, the Ministry of Planning under the Department of Durable Solutions and Poverty Reduction has since April 2024 held a series of workshops at state level to come up with state action plans on Solutions. The workshops have been conducted at state level to ensure maximum community participation. The state level action plans have been consolidated to form the Somalia costed plan for solutions. Solutions locations and population profiling has also been completed.
- In June, MoPIED hosted ReDSS, RCO and Ministry staff in Nairobi for a consolidation, harmonization and reporting workshop where the Somalia Solutions Pathways Action plan report development was commissioned. The first draft has been completed and is currently undergoing a review phase.
