WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of internally displaced people (IDPs) increased from 966,100 last week to 980,900 this week.

The major change in the figures took place in Bago Region (West), with a jump of 10,000 newly displacement resulted from intensified fighting in Gyobingauk Township.

In Bago Region (East), a reinforcement of Tatmadaw troops displaced 3,000 people from Taungoo Township.

Mon State also staged a significant displacement of people due to the indiscriminate shelling in Kyaikto Township. Tatmadaw's troop reinforcement combined with indiscriminate shelling have also forced 810 people to flee in Tanintharyi Region's Launglon Township.

In Shan State (South), 1,725 fleeing from Lashio Township, in Shan State (North, found shelter in Nangsan and Langkho Townships as a result of the conflict. Some 1,540 IDPs were secondarily displaced in Taunggyi and Hopong Townships due to a deployment of troops of the coalition of the Tatmadaw with an Ethnic Armed Organization (EAO). People were also not allowed to stay in monasteries or churches. This EAO, aligned with the Tatmadaw, forced 3,869 IDPs from Hsaik Hkawng, Ban Yin and nearby communities to return to Hsihseng Town for census data collection in October.
