# Sudanese emergency - Protection situation of new arrivals

### Summary

This dashboard summarizes the views of Sudanese refugees, on the situation and protection risks in Chad. The perceptions of these households, interviewed either at the entry points or at the transit sites, a few days after their arrival in Chad, reflect the trauma of fleeing and the relief of having crossed the border.

From 1st January to 28 February 2025, 8,575 households of 30,236 individuals were interviewed, including 7,292 households of 26,236 individuals, at *Birak, Kulbus and Tiné* entry points in Wadi-Fira province and 642 households of 2,047 individuals, at *Adré* entry point, in Ouaddai province, 484 households, at *Kariari and Bahai* entry point in Ennedi Est province and 157 households in Sila Province.

The main trends to be highlighted from the interviews are as follows:

#### Access to the asylum country

- 45% said that insecurity was the main driver of their flight to Chad while 15% mentioned Lack of livelihood
- 81% experienced Human Rights violations, including physical assault 43%, extortion of property 27%, and illegal taxes 9%
- 47% have family members stuck in Sudan and unable to flee to Chad because of lack of transportation's means (21%); fear of arbitrary arrest (13%) and fear of forced recruitment (6%).

#### **Education**

- 75% of households indicated that their children dropped out of school due to the crisis.
- 96% of households have children of school age.

#### Child protection \*

- 39% of households shared their concern regarding school drop-out for their children.


#### **Documentation**

- 10% have birth certificates and 48% have identity cards or other types of documents
- 42% of households don't have documents and claimed that their documents were lost or burnt (88%) or confiscated during their flight to Chad by armed elements (3%).

#### Community engagement \*

- Access to available services (26%), Information on the country of origin (18%) and available assistance (26%) are the types of information requested by the households surveyed.














### RISK OF PROTECTION DURING DISPLACEMENT




