Feedback to Q4 reporting

- RLO reporting: identify RLO reporting challenges
- Need to engage more with RLOs on reporting
- How to attract RLOs to provide data
- Follow up with partners who don't report
- Unit/granular data on access to VSLA and land will be helpful
- Capture private land access by refugees
- Report by percentages instead of absolute numbers
- Clear scope of what data is being captured/ It would be helpful to ensure a clear definition of the scope of the data, so also the limitations of the data is clear.
- Look deep into land tenure systems context
- Registration of refugees SACCOs/cooperatives – are they governed by the cooperatives act?

2. Situational Analysis presentation and validation – Festo, IM & co-chairs

Feedback to situational analysis results

- Provide clarity on Needs Index
- Vulnerability – interrogate further the results
- RCSI vs FCS
- Households unable to meet basic needs – triangulate and contextualise questions
- Triangulate perception-based questions against other validating questions
- Perception based questions – please review against 2 years ago (Sector member indicated – currently there are a lot of changes and refugees have started contributing for school fees, health, WASH – contributing to boreholes)
- Incomes in Agriculture: Percentage engaged in agriculture production is affected by seasonality [when was survey conducted?]
- Vulnerability specifics: What exactly is looked at under this.
- Was data validated with stakeholders?
- Review of refugee categorization – to adjust in March – reduction in rations-
