



## **12.7** MILLION **FORCIBLY DISPLACED &** STATELESS PERSONS

UNHCR protects and assists forcibly displaced and stateless persons across the West and Central African region, including refugees, asylum seekers, internally displaced persons (IDPs), refugee and IDP returnees, stateless and of undetermined nationality persons. Protection and assistance are extended to additional groups, based on humanitarian and other special grounds.


The current number of 2.9 million refugees and asylum seekers represents a significant increase of 13% from the number reported at the same period in 2024, mainly as a result of the ongoing crisis in Sudan and the deteriorating security situation in the Sahel, which has led thousands of persons to leave their country in search for safety and protection.


The largest hosting refugee country in the region is Chad with 47% of the total population, followed by Cameroon with 15%. Sudan, the Central African Republic (CAR), and Nigeria are the main countries of origin, together accounting for 72% of the region's refugee population.

The unregistered population is around 631,321 refugees and asylum-seekers in the region.

Internally displaced persons represent the vast majority of the forcibly displaced population in the West and Central Africa region. Nigeria, Burkina Faso and Cameroon respectively host 44%, 25% and 12% of the total IDP population.

West Africa hosts over 931,073 persons who are stateless or of undetermined nationality, reported mainly in Côte d'Ivoire and Cabo Verde. Millions of people are reported to be at risk of statelessness across the region.
