



Highlights

Over the past two weeks, water delivery in Luakdong improved from 13 to 14.2 litres per person per day, nearing Sphere standard of 15 LPD. Four submerged water points were relocated, and Oxfam, NCA, and IRC expanded sanitation and hygiene interventions. In Tormorok, 16 emergency latrines were completed and 40 hygiene outreach promoters recruited. Cholera prevention activities intensified through cleaning campaigns and household visits reaching more than 600 households, while beneficiary selection for WASH NFI kit distribution targeting 2,500 beneficiaries was completed, with distribution taking place in the coming days.

Response & Challenges

Oxfam and NCA maintained strong hygiene promotion campaigns across Luakdong and Tormorok, vital for cholera mitigation. Awareness-raising sessions, a jerrycan cleaning campaign and latrine maintenance were conducted regularly. Despite progress in water supply and sanitation coverage, standards remain below Sphere standards, especially in overcrowded Tormorok where dry land scarcity hinders construction of additional facilities. Flooding continues to damage infrastructure, with over ten latrines collapsing in Luakdong and residual floodwaters limiting access to key areas. Coordination between WASH partners has helped stabilize delivery, but replacement of damaged facilities and increased capacity to manage growing arrivals remain urgent. Additional resources are required to sustain improved water supply, complete sanitation facilities, and ensure hygiene materials reach vulnerable households, particularly amid the ongoing cholera threat.
