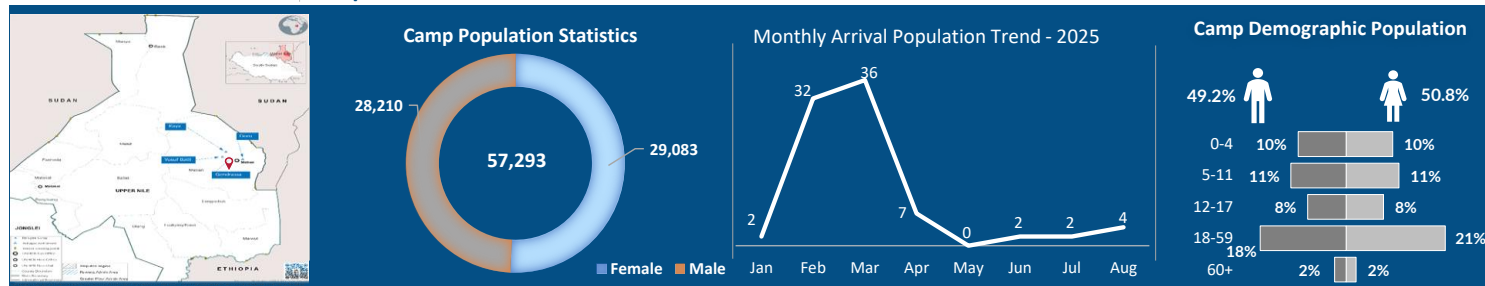

Food Security

- People receiving Agricultural assets & trainings on livelihood ●



Two-way Communication

- Predictable & timely information dissemination mechanisms ●
- Diversity of voices and languages ●
- Feedback and Response Mechanisms including PSEA ●



Education

- Children accessing Early Childhood Development (ECDs) ●
- Children enrolled in Primary education systems ●
- Students enrolled in Secondary Education system ●
- Students benefiting from Tertiary Education ●



Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH)

- Clean water per person per day ●
- Water supply accessibility ●
- Gender disaggregated latrines and showers ●
- Number of latrines available ●
- Number of showers available ●
- Hygiene promotion messaging ●
- WASH NFIs ●
- Waste disposal ●



Nutrition

- Prevalence of GAM among children 6-59 months ●
- Prevalence of SAM among children 6-59 months ●
- Prevalence of anaemia among children 6-59 months ●
- Number of new admissions into CMAM programs ●



Health

- Primary healthcare ●
- Access to Primary Health care services ●
- Access to Secondary Health Care services ●
- Number of skilled deliveries ●
- Number of patients consultations/clinician/day ●
- Number of referrals for secondary or tertiary care ●
