

Following the massive arrival of Congolese refugees into Burundi, fleeing violent clashes in South Kivu—particularly around Kamanyola, Luvungi, Katogota, and Uvira—the security situation has significantly deteriorated. These ongoing confrontations have triggered a large influx since 5 December, with an estimated **101,448** individuals recorded at the entry points of Buganda, Gatumba, and Rumonge, including **10,658** returning Burundian nationals. A monitoring system is in place to track population movements; however, current trends indicate a worsening situation that requires urgent mobilization for registration and assistance.






