The UNHCR Multi-Country Office in Panama supports **refugees, asylum-seekers**, and other **forcibly displaced people** across **Belize, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Haiti, Panama, Trinidad & Tobago**, and the **Eastern Caribbean**. These countries host over **1.5 million forcibly displaced people**.

UNHCR works closely with **Governments and partners** to respond to the protection, legal, and basic needs of forcibly displaced people, support host communities, and help forcibly displaced people **find safety** and **rebuild their lives**.

People supported in acquiring documentation, including asylum-seekers in the Eastern Caribbean.

 **11,961**

People informed on protection rights, access to essential services, and sensitized on international protection.

 **3,702**

People received counselling and legal assistance to access asylum and basic rights, including asylum-seekers in the Eastern Caribbean.

 **1,010**

Officials trained in international protection standards, and statelessness prevention.

 **2,692**

Non-food items (including Core Relief Items) distributed to stateless persons and host communities.

 **1,061**

People supported with mental health and psychosocial support services (MHPSS).

 **262**

People, including survivors of violence, received protection and support services.

 **183**

People supported with emergency shelter.

 **108**

People provided with primary healthcare and first aid services.
