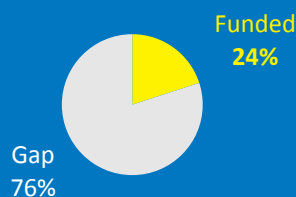

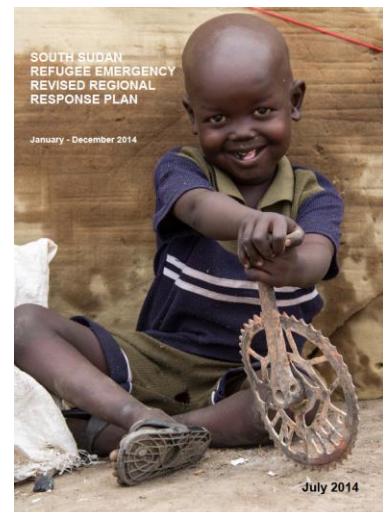

## KEY MESSAGES

- Violent conflict in the world's youngest nation has displaced hundreds of thousands of people, endangering their lives and leaving them on the verge of famine.
- UNHCR and its partners are delivering urgently needed protection and humanitarian assistance to save lives and prevent the loss of a generation.
- The situation of the IDPs in South Sudan and the refugees in the neighbouring countries of Ethiopia, Kenya, Sudan and Uganda has changed, in some cases dramatically, since the first Regional Refugee Response Plan. UNHCR is calling for a massive boost in emergency humanitarian funding to help save lives and protect the rights of those who have fled across borders to seek asylum.
- UNHCR commends the Governments in the neighbouring countries for generously hosting the South Sudanese refugees and keeping their borders open to the continued influx.
- The humanitarian community is taking all measures necessary to reinforce inter-agency collaboration to improve the joint response to better assist over 400,000 refugees.

## ACHIEVEMENTS

- Refugees fleeing South Sudan have had access to territory in Ethiopia, Kenya, Sudan and Uganda. No substantiated reports of *refoulement* have been confirmed to date.
- Level 1 registration of all new arrivals at the entry points and Level 2 registration in the camps and settlements are ongoing.
- Access to physical and legal protection, as well as emergency WASH services, primary health care, nutrition services, and shelter at reception sites, in camps and settlements.
- Food rations have so far been provided for all new arrivals.

## TIMELINE of EVENTS

- **15 December 2013** Eruption of violence
- **24 January 2014** Cessation of hostilities declared, IGAD-sponsored peace talks begin
- **11 February 2014** Activation by the UN Emergency Relief Coordinator of a level 3 humanitarian system emergency to ensure an effective response to the humanitarian needs of the affected people
- **13 March 2014** Appointment by the UN High Commissioner for Refugees of a Regional Refugee Coordinator for the South Sudan Situation
- **24 March 2014** Launch of the Inter-Agency Regional Response Plan for the South Sudan Refugee Emergency
- **29-30 April 2014** Inter-agency Regional Contingency Planning in Nairobi for refugees from South Sudan
- **9 May 2014** Signing of a ceasefire in Addis Ababa
- **20 May 2014** Humanitarian Pledging Conference for South Sudan in Oslo, Norway
- **9 July 2014** Launch of the Revised Regional Response Plan for South Sudan Refugee Emergency, Geneva
- **15 July 2014** Launch of the Revised Regional Response Plan for the South Sudan Refugee Emergency, Nairobi
