

Highlights

- Police officers who had abandoned their post after security related incidents occurred in Maban, 03 August, returned to work in the first week of October.
- SO Bunj received textbooks written in Arabic from Maban's Education Office which are expected to facilitate the resumption of Primary 7 and 8 classes (in Batil, in particular) which had ground to halt because of a shortage of the required resource material.
- As a conflict mitigating measure, UNHCR participated in a meeting on the relocation of refugees who have encroached on host community land outside Batil Camp. Refugee leaders have agreed to urge their constituents to return to within camp boundaries.

- Many pupils have expressed interest in registering for the academic year in Gentil secondary school. Placement tests which are being conducted in Arabic and English are underway. Classes will begin on 13 October 2014, when the third school term begins.

Yusuf Batil Monthly Updates

Protection

- The relocation of refugees who had spontaneously settled outside the camp's perimeter was finalized. The exercise was also a conflict mitigation measure to prevent altercations with the host community.
- In marking the feast of *Eid al Adha*, refugees invited members of the host community to celebrate the occasion together, as a means to promote peaceful coexistence.
- UNHCR and DRC distributed 27 tents to vulnerable individuals in Batil and Doro, which included unaccompanied elderly persons, female headed households, persons with physical disability and persons with visual impairment.
- Protection/CS together with DRC concluded sanitary materials distribution to 14,871 females of reproductive age from 10 - 50 years old in Batil camp
- To ensure protection of the most vulnerable individuals, UNHCR distributed solar lanterns to 384 elderly persons, 15 disabled and 408 female households in Doro and Batil camps.

- Nineteen (19) out of twenty newly recruited male teachers arrived from Ajoung Thok on 27th & 28th October 2014. Five (5) have been deployed at the Gentil Secondary School while fifteen (15) are being deployed at primary schools in Gendressa, Batil and Kaya camps.
- Approximately, 144 students (134 boys and 10 girls), 46 of whom are from the host community who passed the placement test have been enrolled in senior one at the Gentil Secondary School. Some 139 students sat to a second round of entrance exams and are expected to join the secondary school by the end of October. Lessons for the third term of the school year have begun with the aim of reinforcing their English Language skills in preparation for 2015 academic year.
- UNHCR has discussed the official handover of Gentil Secondary School with Maban's County Commissioner and Payam Administrator to avoid interference and intrusion by members of the community unhappy about their children not being placed at the school.
- In service teacher training courses resumed with the commencement of the third school term on 13 October 2014.
- Education partner, the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) began the construction of over 40 latrines in schools in Kaya, Gendressa and Batil.

- Global Hand Washing Day was commemorated on 18 October, under the theme, 'Choose Hand Washing, Choose Health' in Batil and Doro camps. Over 1,500 individuals were engaged on good hand washing practices including the use of ash as an alternative to soap, which if used properly yields as good a result as the use of soap. Participants were informed that among other things, proper hand washing reduces the spread of diarrhea by 40 per cent.
- UNHCR distributed sanitary kits to 10,563 women in Batil and Doro camps.

- Preparations for UNHCR's Standardized Extended Nutrition Survey (SENS) to which WFP and UNICEF committed to gets underway. The SENS is the comprehensive Nutrition Survey designed for refugee camps/contest which includes not only anthropometric/health data but also anaemia testing (women and children), Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices, Mosquito net coverage, WASH indicators and Food Security indicators. The current assessment will exclude Food Security module.
- The nutrition profile remained stable. MEDAIR conducted the camp monthly MUAC screening. The levels of Global Acute Malnutrition (GAM) and Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) rates are within UNHCR standards (GAM = 5.0%, SAM = 0.9%) which is an improvement as compared with September. In Gentil Hospital, increasing cases of kwashiorkor were admitted. Follow up home visits and interviews showed that most of those cases were related to chronic diseases and some of the cases were from host communities two sessions of 15-Day General Food Distribution (GFD) were held with 30 day voucher distribution at the first session.
- MSF-H have confirmed their commitment to extend their operation in Gentil hospital till the end of 2015. This will enable IMC and Medair to focus on the Primary Health Care services and strengthen the outreach and surveillance activities in Kaya, Gendressa and Batil camps.
- Medair continues provision of facility and community based health services; however, the south clinic remained closed due to shortage of manpower after the recent crisis
