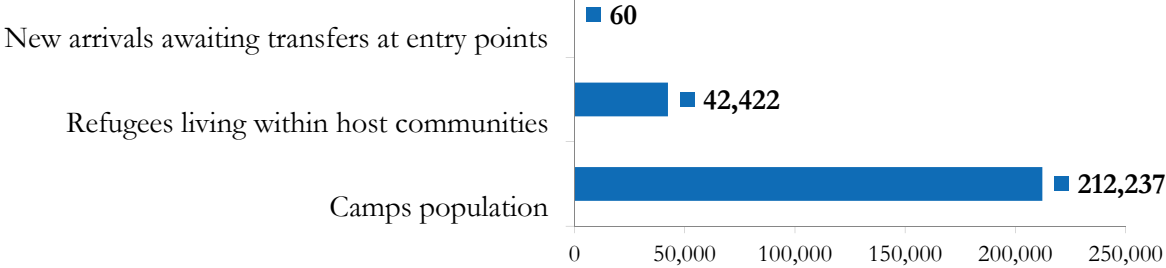


South Sudanese refugee population in Gambella (as of 17-April-2015)

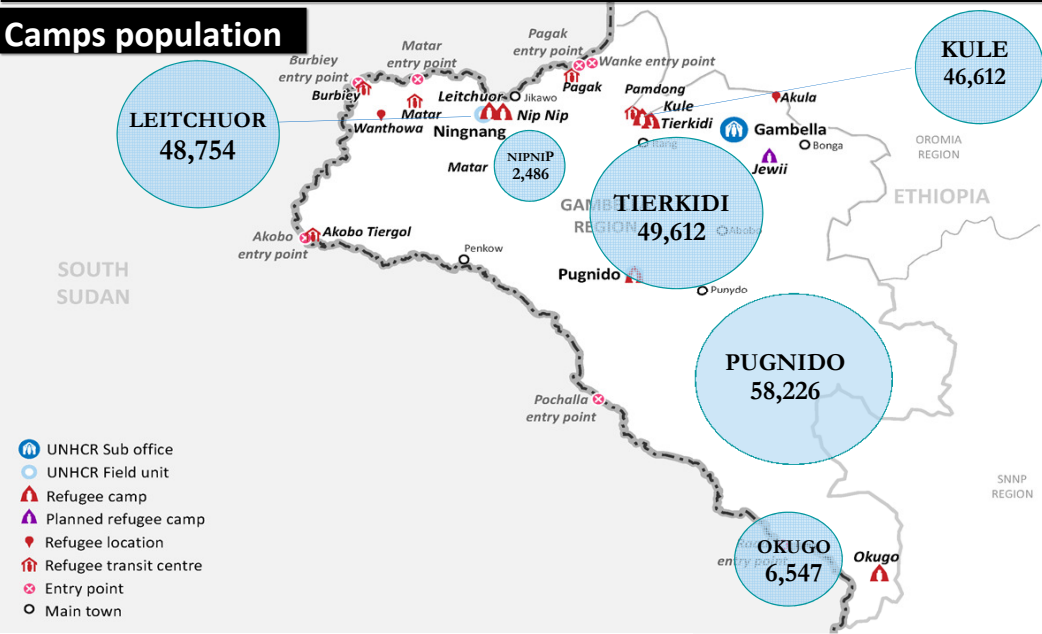
Refugee population Breakdown

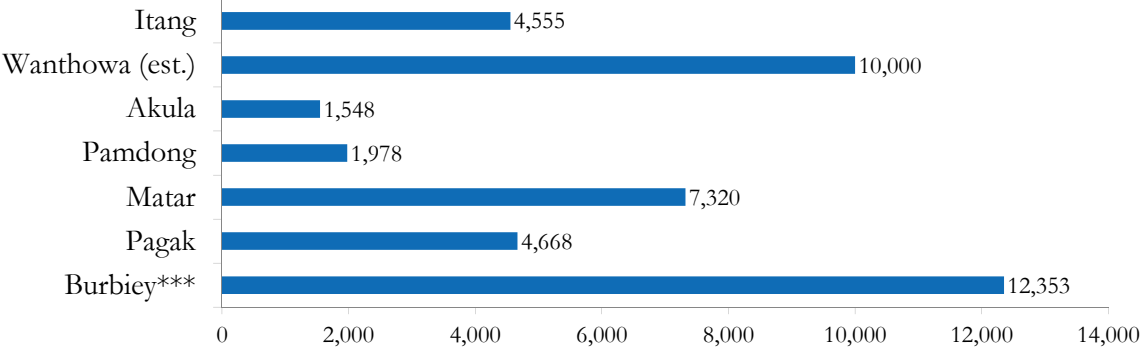
