

IOM RESPONSE IN THE HORN OF AFRICA

External Situation Report | 19 August 2011

OVERVIEW

Highlights

- → In Ethiopia, IOM is providing medical assistance in support of ARRA at the reception centre and in the Melkedida camp health center, where a measles vaccination campaign is taking place.
- → Transportation assistance of newly arrived Somalis from the transit centre to Helawyen and between camps for family reunification reached 10,609 individuals.
- → In Kenya, the planned relocation of 25,000 Somalis from Dagahaley to the Ifo extension started with the movement of 259 people.
- → Emergency shelter set up in the the Ifo extension reached 1,832 tents, allowing to start relocation of the drought displaced persons to the completed sections.
- → Transportation assistance from Liboi to Dagahaley totals 2,248 vulnerable persons and relocation from Dagahaley to the Ifo extension reached 1,030 persons.

role in the measles vaccination campaign started on 18 August.

IOM contributes with critical technical assistance in the identification of epidemics cases, such as measles, in coordination with ARRA and UNHCR and provides logistical support through distribution of medical supplies and equipment.

Transportation (Dollo Ado)

- ~ IOM provides safe and dignified transportation assistance to Somali migrants from the Dollo Ado transit centre to the Hilaweyn camp. The establishment of additional facilities in the camp is ongoing.
- IOM continues assisting family reunifications. The cases include movement of new arrivals from the transit centre to the camps and individuals released from health facilities after getting treatment.

Emergency Shelter (Ifo Camp)

IOM is setting up emergency shelters in the Ifo extension.
As of 19 August a total of 1,832 tents donated by Shelter Box and Japan ODA have been erected in the Sections D, E
J, while plotting and demarcation was completed in Block E7 and ongoing in Blocks E6 and J1.

Emergency Relocation

- The plan to relocate 25,000 refugees from Dagahaley to the Ifo extension started on 18 August. As of 19 August 1,030 persons and their belongings were moved to the Ifo extension. Of these, 730 were provided with plots and a further 300 were housed at the local primary school and provided with meals for the night. This group will be allocated plots on 20 August, while more migrants are registered for movement.
- The exercise is carried out in partnership with UNHCR and with the support of the Lutheran World Foundation (LWF) who verifies and registers migrants eligible for movement. IOM provides pre-departure medical assessment and identification for the allocation of tents.

Transport assistance from Liboi to Dadaab

At the request of the Provincial Administration, IOM has been facilitating the movement of vulnerable migrants from Liboi to Dadaab. Total movement up to date is 2,248 persons.
