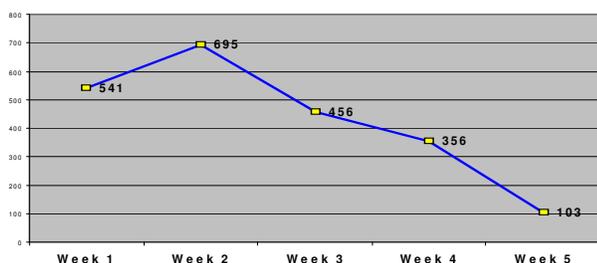

### Contextual Background

<b>Pattern in Population Change</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Organized large-scale relocation from the Transit Centre to all camps in Dollo Ado began February 2009, during which time the settlement grew rapidly. Relocation conducted to Bokolmanyo camp, Melkadida camp, Kobe camp and Hilaweyn camp. Currently to Buramino camp.</li> </ul>
<b>Areas of Origin</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Most of residents are from Gedo, Bay and Bakol</li> </ul>
<b>Cultural Background</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sunni Muslim</li> <li>Most of the refugees are from Rahanweyn clan and Maheren clan</li> </ul>

### Tips for Humanitarians

- UNHCR provides protection and monitors delivery of services to all refugees in the Transit Centre.
- Transit Centre Management is done **by ARRA with support from UNHCR**.
- Transit centre Coordination Meetings**, co-chaired by ARRA, are held weekly in UNHCR office in Dollo Ado with humanitarian actors.
- All refugees in Transit Centre are **individually registered** in UNHCR's proGres database and hold **ration cards**. Ration card numbers are useful for referral between partners and for distribution events. Refugees have been given a **Proof of Registration** document showing family-related and individual details, including **each person's photo**.
- Biometrics (fingerprinting)** has been used for registering refugees living in Transit Centre. Biometrics assists in preventing double registration. No refugee household should have more than one ration card.
- SC-US and UNICEF** support the assessment and verification processes for separated children and unaccompanied minors.

### Administrative Structure

#### Role of Ethiopian Government in Transit centre

- ARRA is active in the following sectors:**
  - ▶ Transit Centre Management
  - ▶ Registration
  - ▶ Protection & Security
  - ▶ Food & CRI Distribution
- ARRA staff posted inside the camp include:**
  - ▶ Transit Centre Coordinator
  - ▶ Protection Officer

#### Role of Residents in Self-Management

- Outreach workers group** - responsible for information sharing, community participation, identification of person with specify needs, support relocation into camp, support UNHCR and aid workers to ensure access to all refugees to humanitarian aid and international protection.
- Elders group** - overall conflict management in the transit centre.

#### Local Administration

- ❖ The Kebele Chairman is responsible for local (non-refugee) administration on behalf of Dollo Ado Woreda, Somali Regional State, Ethiopia. The Kebele Chairman and his administrative committee are consulted about refugee-host community relationship, natural resource use and managing conflicts between the refugee and host communities, with the help of local elders.
