







Correlation of IDPs




Between 1 December and 24th February 2012, displacements were mainly recorded in South Central with approximately 92,000 out of 99,000 displacements recorded in all three regions. 50,000 displaced people reported Insecurity as the major cause of displacement in South Central followed by IDP return (17,000), Refugee return (11,000), Eviction (6,700) and lack of livelihood (4,700). The displacements originated mainly from Shabelle Hoose (33,000), Banadir (19,000), Hiraan (10,000) and Juba Hoose (6,400) regions. The IDPs moved to Mogadishu (48,000), Gedo (12,000), Juba Hoose (10,000) among other regions.

This data has been collected through the IASC Population Movement Tracking (PMT) system. PMT is designed to capture population movement trends, not cumulative population data. Due to the fluid nature of displacement in Somalia and in order to avoid capturing multiple displacements, UNHCR limits the reporting range to a period of three months - these figures should therefore not be added and used cumulatively.
