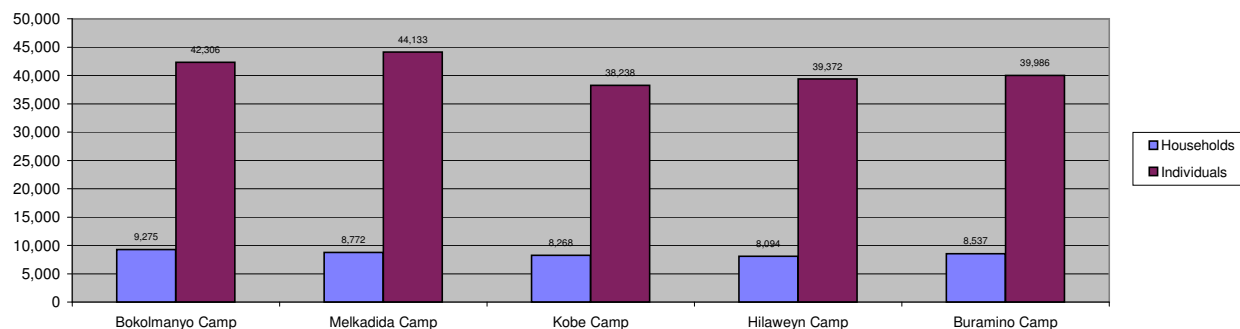

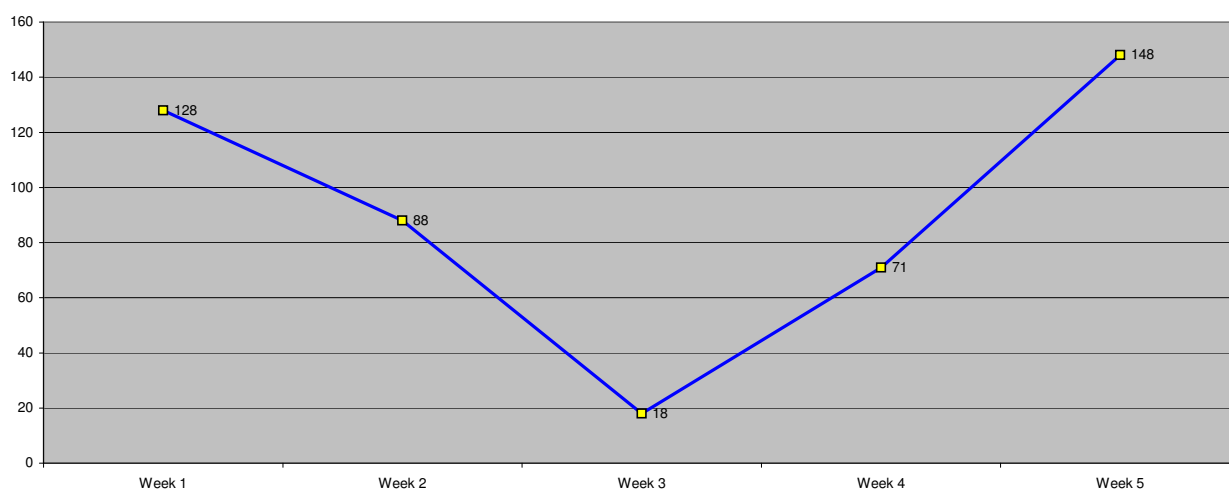
**Figure 1.1 - Total Refugee Population in Dollo Ado**

**Figure 1.2 - New Arrivals at Reception Centre by Week during the Current Month**



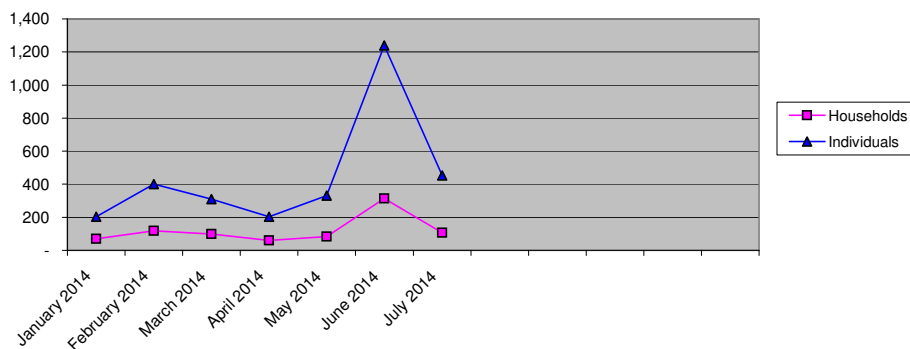

Figure 2.1 - ALL CAMPS Demographic Breakdown\*

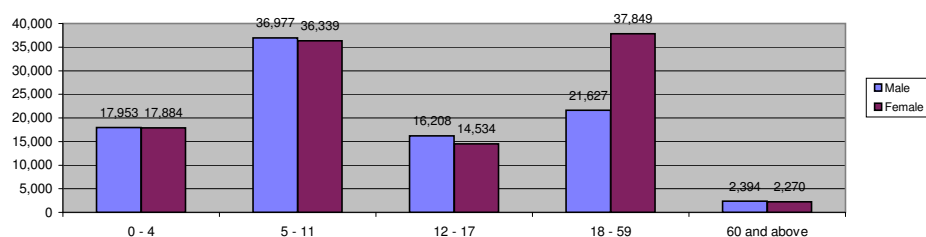

Figure 2.2 - Melkadida Camp Demographic Breakdown

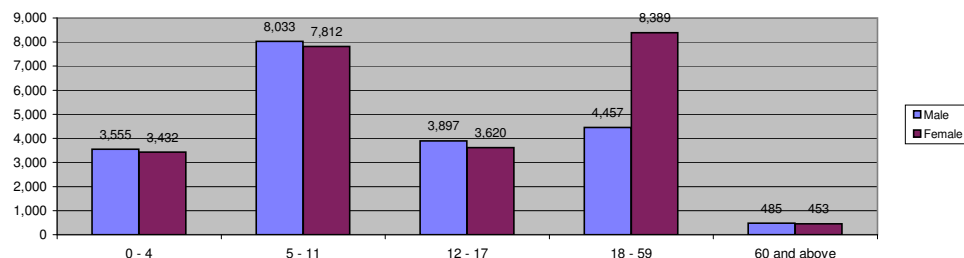
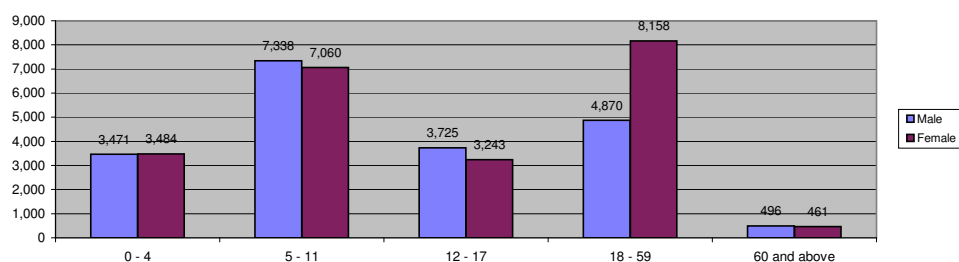

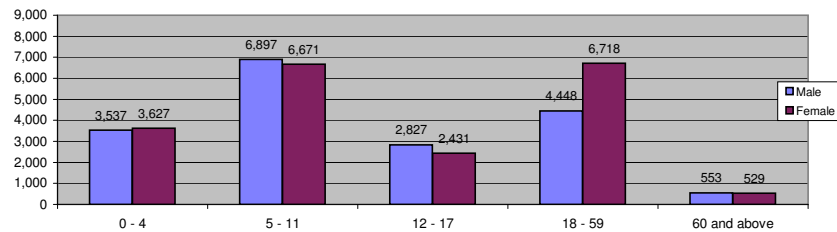

Figure 2.3 - Bokolmany Camp Demographic Breakdown



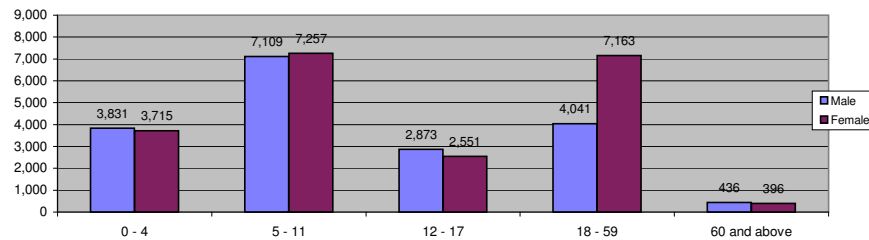

Figure 2.4 - Kobe Camp Demographic Breakdown



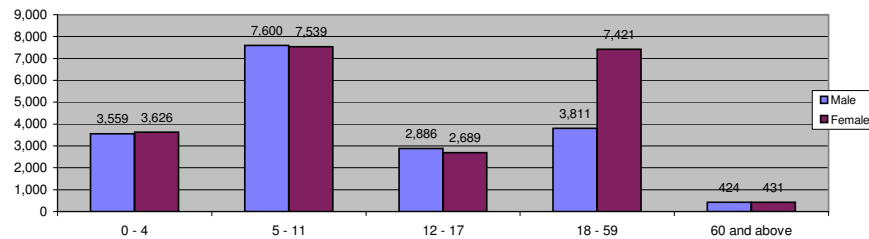

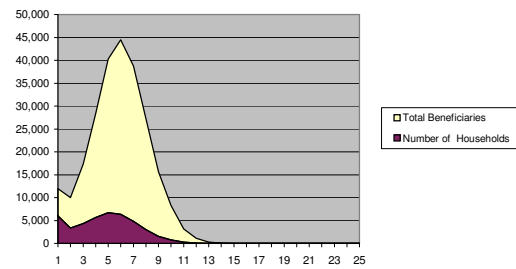

Figure 4.2- Melkadida Camp Household Size

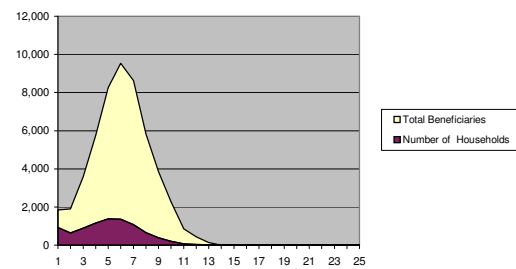

Figure 4.3- Bokolmanyo Camp Household Size

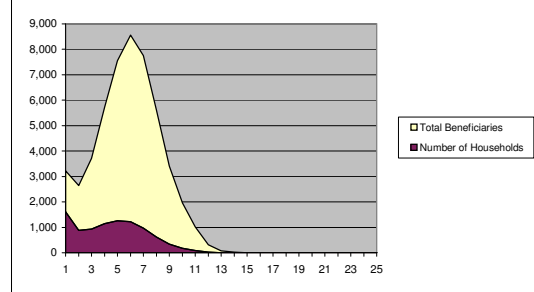

Figure 4.4- Kobe Camp Household Size

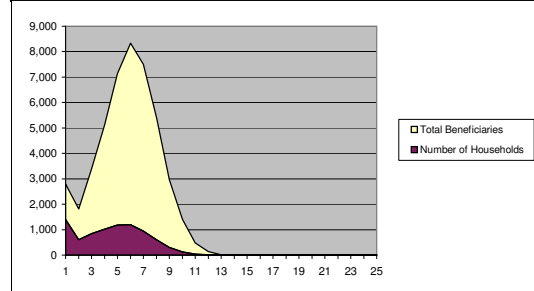

Figure 4.5- Hilaweyn Camp Household Size

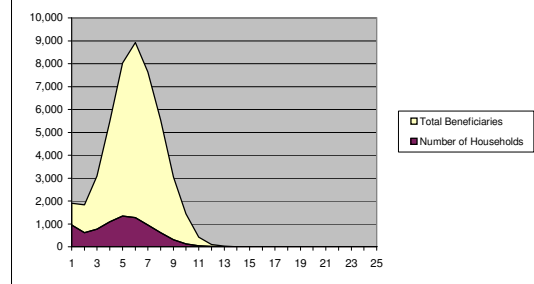
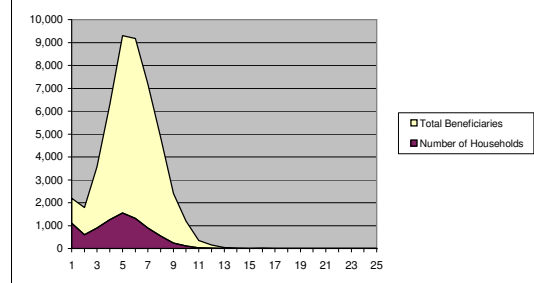

Figure 5.1 - ALL CAMPS Specific Needs

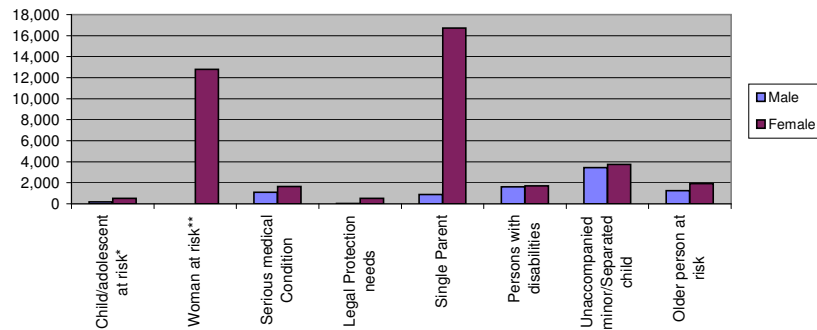
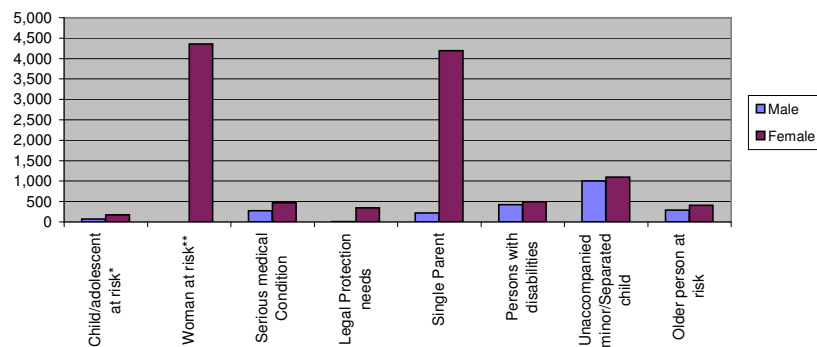

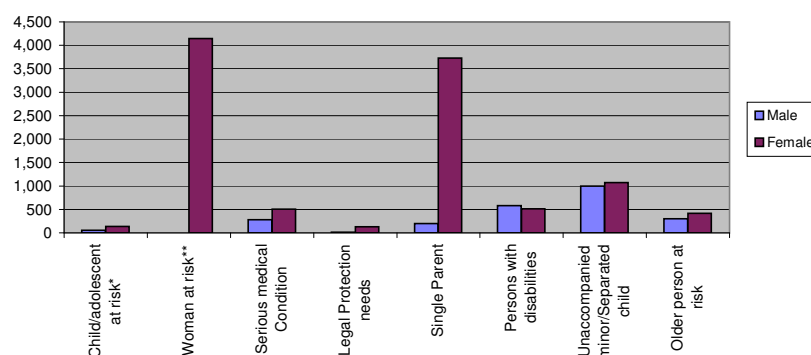

Figure 5.5 - Kobe Camp Specific Needs

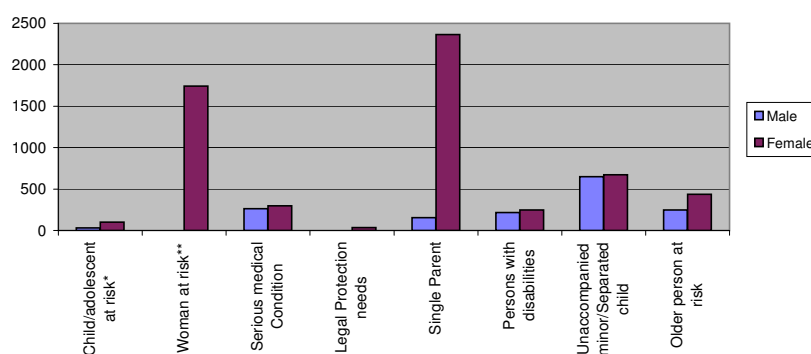

Figure 5.6 - Hilaweyn Camp Population Increase

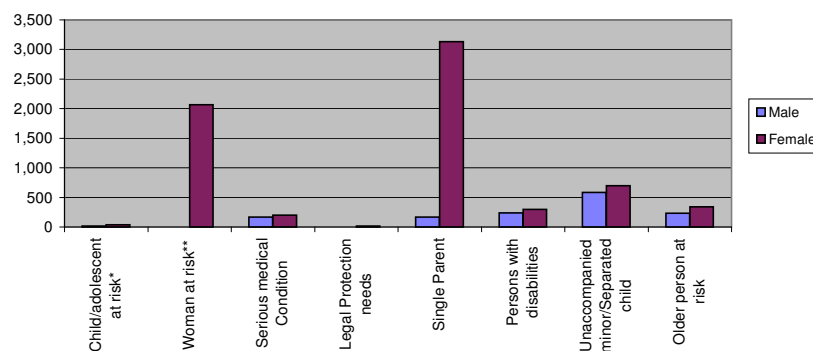
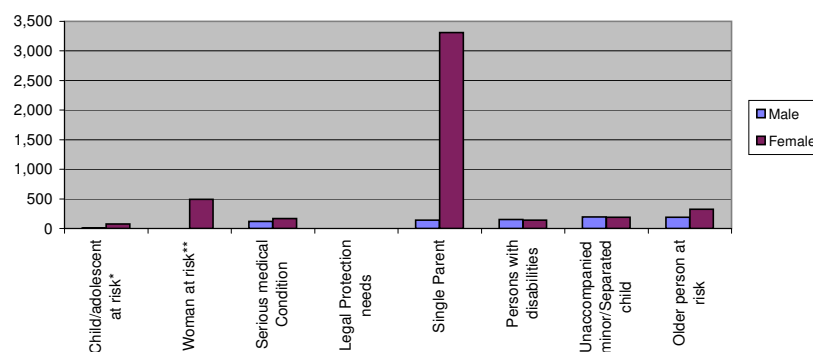

Figure 7.1 - ALL CAMPS Places of Origin

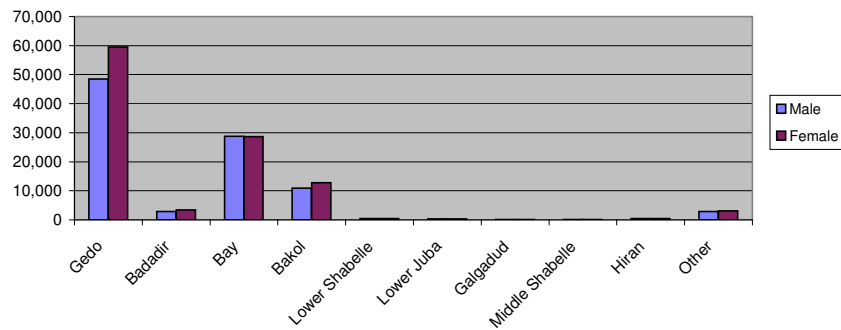

Figure 7.2 - Melkadida Camp Places of Origin

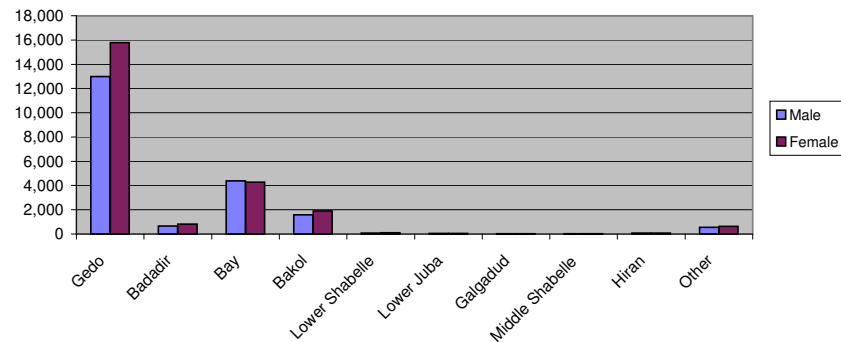

Figure 7.3 - Bokolmany Camp Places of Origin

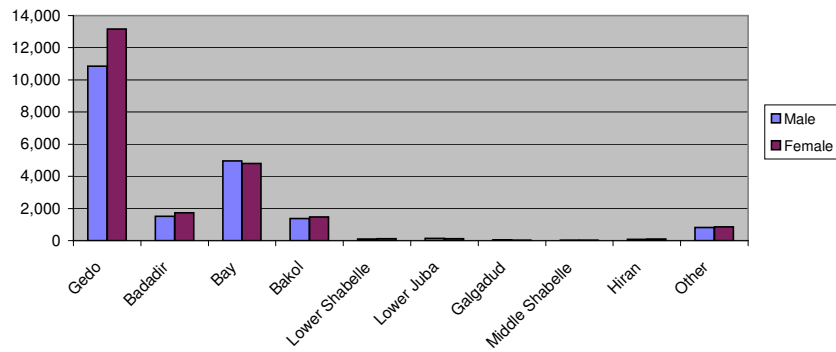

Figure 7.5 - Kobe Camp Places of Origin

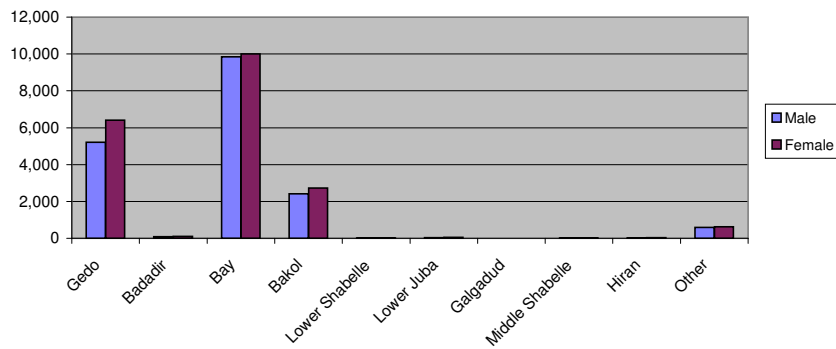

Figure 7.6 - Hilaweyn Camp Places of Origin

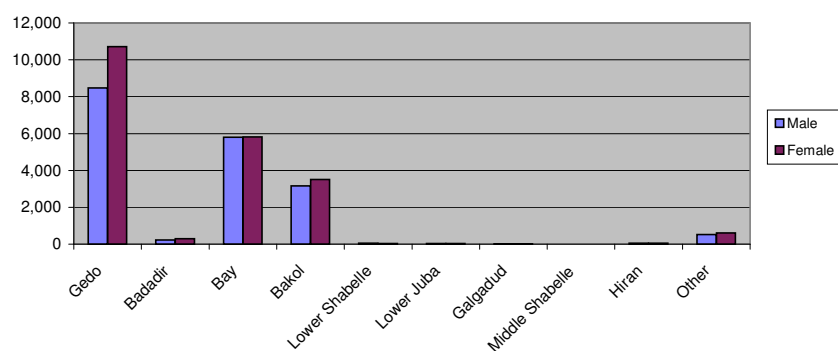
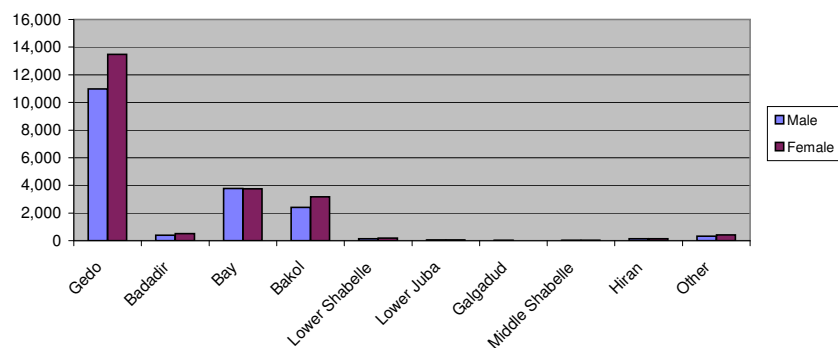

Figure 6.1 - ALL CAMPS Ethnic Breakdown

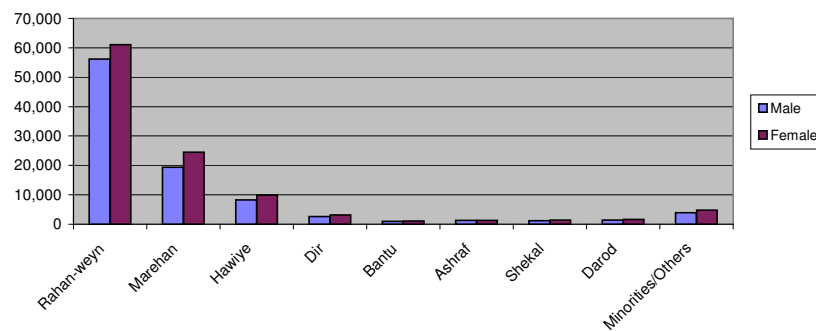

Figure 6.2 - Melkadida Camp Ethnic Breakdown

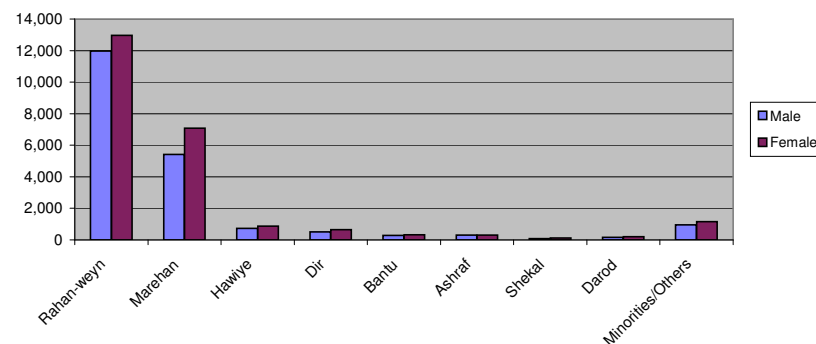

Figure 6.3 - Bokolmany Camp Ethnic Breakdown

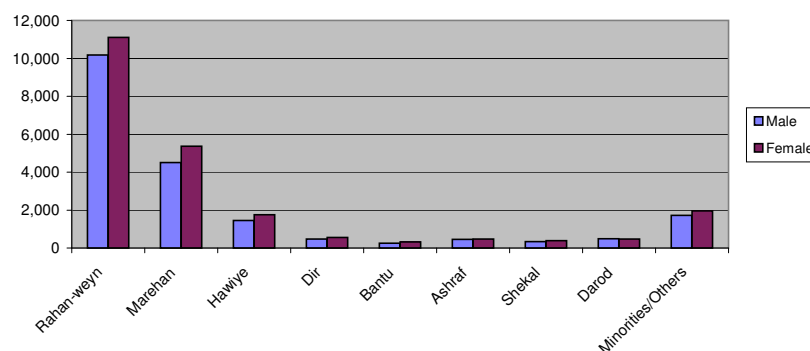

Figure 6.5 - Kobe Camp Ethnic Breakdown

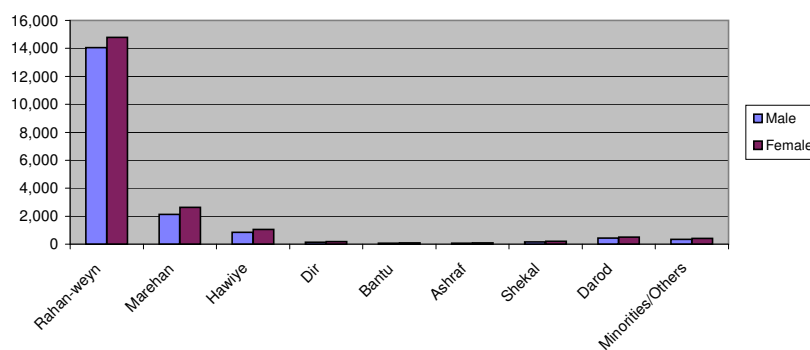

Figure 6.6 - Hilaweyn Camp Ethnic Breakdown

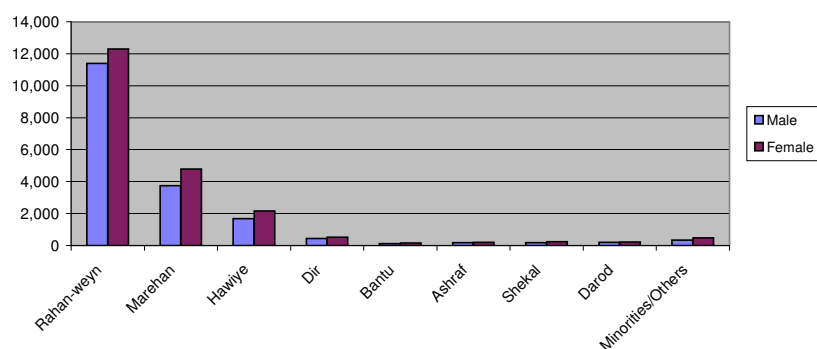
