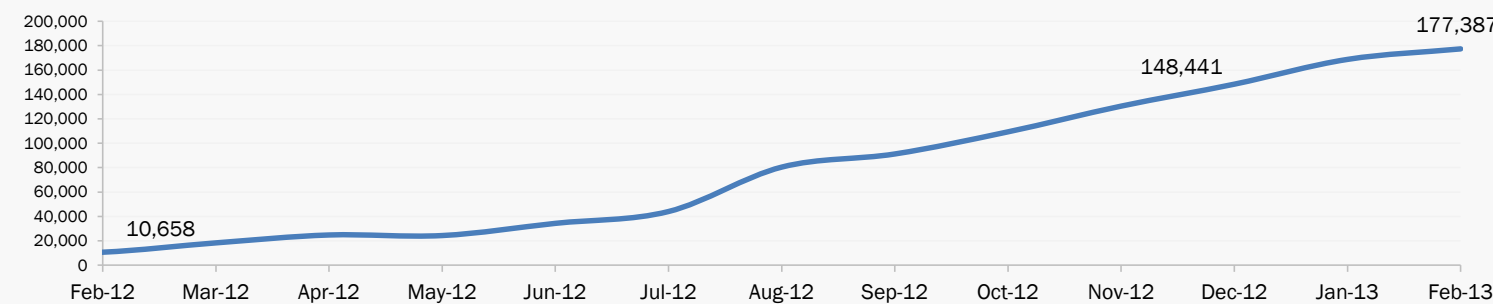


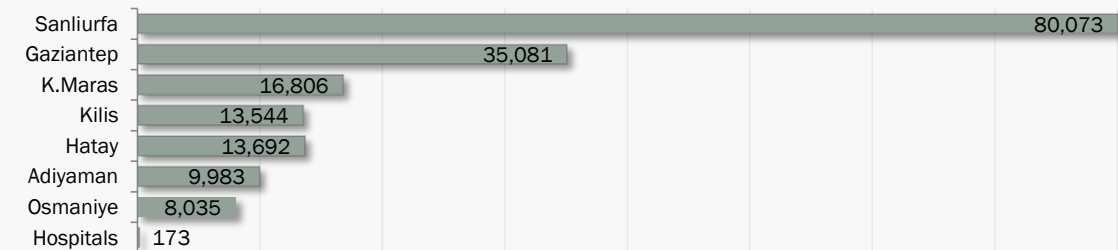

## Population Trends

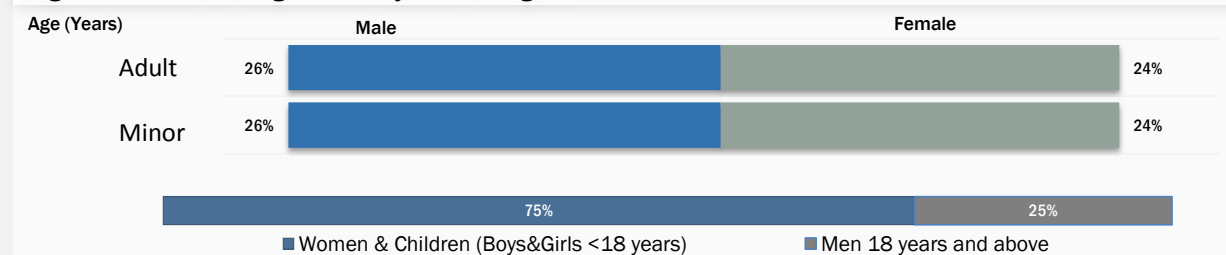


## Number of Syrians by Province

The number of Syrians living in the Urban Area are not included

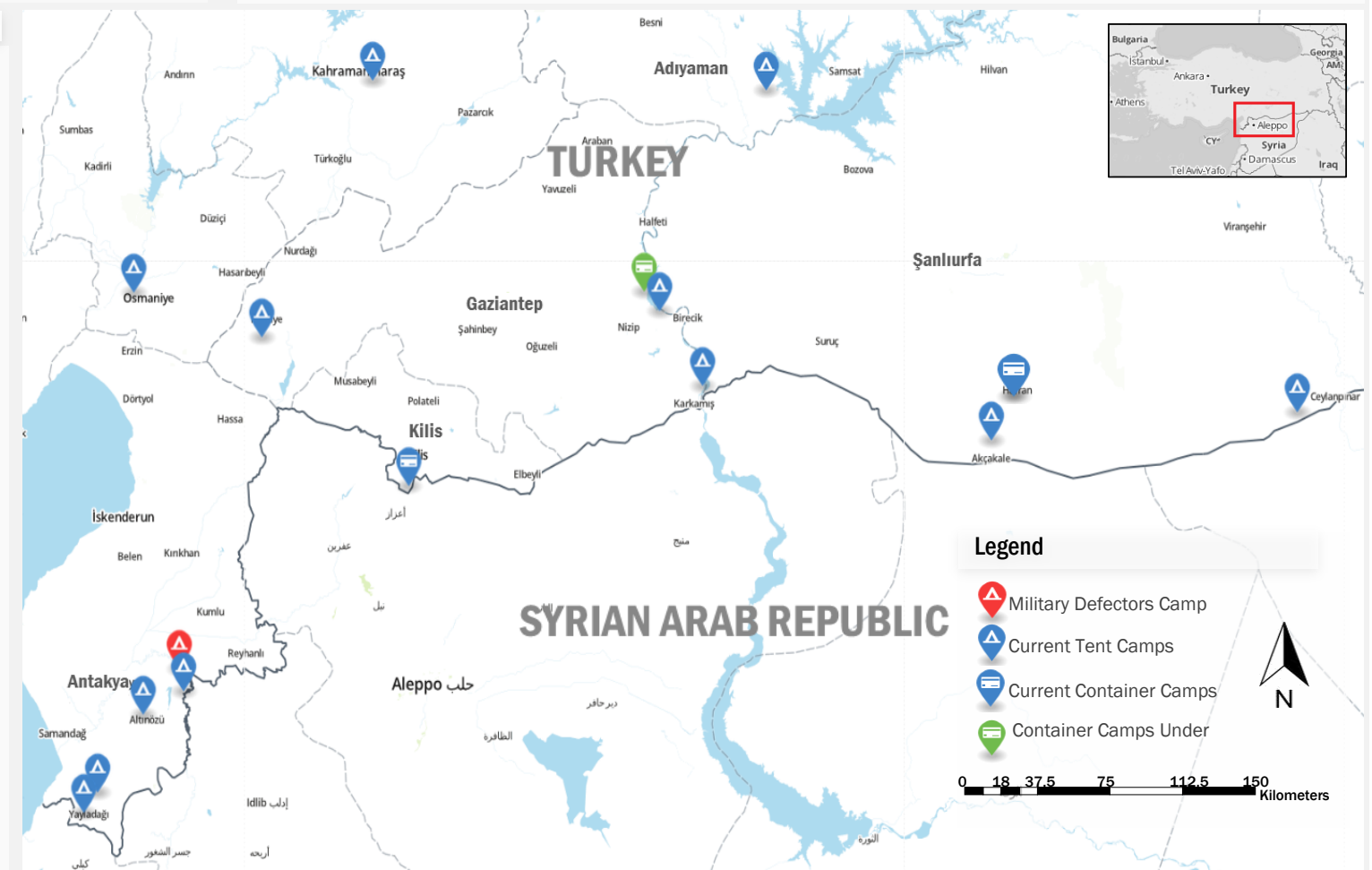


## Age & Gender of Registered Syrian Refugees



## Highlights

- No new figures announced by the Government Agency AFAD since 08 February 2013, therefore the total number of Syrians registered in the camps remained same, 177,387 including 173 under medical treatment in the hospitals. The estimated number of non-camp Syrians in Turkey is estimated to be minimum 100,000 people, bringing the total population of Syrians in Turkey falling within the temporary protection regime to be 277,387 people.
- Although it has not yet been officially announced, the tent site with 13-15,000 capacity in Adana has started to receive Syrians. It was reported by the local authorities that those Syrians who are temporarily accommodated in the public centers/guesthouses in Nizip town are given priority and started to be transferred to the tent camp in Adana.
- With the camp site in Adana, and the 2nd camp in Nizip (a container site with 5,000 capacity) the total number of camps accommodating Syrians increased to 17 camps including 3 container sites. The current capacity of 17 camps is approximately 165,000 persons but reportedly 3-4 more camp sites are also under construction which is planned to accommodate up to 35-40,000 more people.
- It was reported to UNHCR Field Teams by the camp officials that those registered in the camp population includes 20,000 Syrians who have been registered in Ceylanpinar and Akcakale camps in Sanliurfa province but are permitted to stay with their relatives outside the camps.
- UNHCR Field Teams continued to be present in the camps and will start to visit the newly opened camps. UNHCR Field Teams, while observing the vol-rep interviews to ensure the voluntary nature of the returns, will also provide technical advise and shares its expertise with the authorities in specific protection issues and registration.
